A. CYNTHIA MCGANN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, GOOD WORX INC.

Cynthia McGann introduced herself and Mary Beth Owano, Director of Community Outreach. Ms. McGann provided the history of Good Worx Inc., explained the Sunny Patch Project, highlighted the sustainable practices of the Sunny Patch Community Farm and food rescue initiative. Ms. Owano circulated a basket of food from first harvest. Ms. McGann addressed Council questions, distributed program information, and encouraged residents to volunteer.

B. "HEART OF DARIEN AWARD"

Mayor Marchese explained the development of the "Heart of Darien Award".

Mayor Marchese awarded the first "Heart of Darien Award" to Cynthia McGann for her dedication to the Sunny Patch Community Farm and Food Forest. He stated Ms. McGann continues to find new ways of serving others with the food rescue program, food forest, children's fairy garden as well as interfacing with numerous community organizations. Mayor Marchese stated, "The work of Cynthia McGann and her volunteers is offered unselfishly, and she is a role model for other humanitarians who seek to make our community a special place to live." Mayor Marchese read the inscription on the award. Mayor Marchese and award designer, Samantha Schumacher, with Bella Cosa Jewelers, presented the award to Ms. McGann.

Mayor Marchese stated that he intends to award individuals who make significant contributions to the City. Information regarding the "Heart of Darien Award" can be found on the City website.

Mayor Marchese thanked Ms. McGann for all her hard work and for being such a worthy recipient, and he thanked Ms. Schumacher for her design efforts.

ORDINANCE

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

SECTION 1: Title 2 of the Darien City Code, "Boards and Commissions," is hereby amended by creating the following new Chapter 4, "Economic Development Committee:"

4-3-1: CREATION, TITLE; MEMBERS

4-3-2: TERMS

4-3-3: COMPENSATION

4-3-4: CHAIRMAN

4-3-5: MEETINGS

4-3-6: PURPOSE

4-3-7: POWERS AND DUTIES

4-3-1: CREATION, TITLE; MEMBERS:

A. The Mayor and City Council recognize that the economic stability of the City is dependent on a strong and diverse commercial base. A municipality which desires to attract and retain a vital business community must be sensitive to the complex factors which influence today's marketplace. Darien has a wealth of expertise of business leaders within the community who are familiar with the peculiar problems and strengths of the City. For this reason, it is a desirable goal to form the Economic Development Committee, which draws upon the talents of these leaders to optimize Darien's opportunities to attract and retain successful businesses.

B. To accomplish this goal, there is hereby established the Economic Development Committee to consist of seven (7) members appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the city council. Committee members shall be business owners and/or be in senior management of a company conducting business within the City, property owners within business districts, and residents of the city. One Alderperson, chosen by the Mayor, shall act as nonvoting liaison with

the committee. The Mayor shall be an ex officio nonvoting member of the committee.

4-3-2: TERMS:

Each committee member will serve a term of two (2) years.

4-3-3: COMPENSATION:

Members of the committee shall serve without compensation.

4-3-4: CHAIRPERSON:

The chairperson shall be appointed by the Mayor for a one year term.

4-3-5: MEETINGS:

The committee shall meet, as necessary, at City Hall, or at another location within the city, as long as the meeting is duly noticed according to the requirements of the Illinois Open Meetings Act, and may be called by the chairperson, or three committee members.

4-3-6: PURPOSE:

The purpose of the Economic Development Committee is as follows:

- A. Advise the City on the development and implementation of business retention/expansion programs;
- B. Advise the City on the implementation of a marketing program to attract new business and industry;
- C. Monitor business activity and trends on the local, State, and national level;
- D. Establish a focal point for businesses to approach and discuss issues that affect them; and
- E. Engage representatives from community and regional entities as appropriate on matters for economic development.

4-3-7: POWERS AND DUTIES:

- (A) Recommend to the City Council those actions and programs that will serve to carry

out the purpose of the Commission;

- (B) Provide an annual update to the City Council on the activities of the Commission;
- (C) Serve as focal point for businesses to approach and discuss issues that affect them;
- (D) Participate in the Business Visitation Program and evaluate findings of program progress;
- (E) Prepare appropriate economic developmental promotional materials;
- (F) Target specific companies or industries for business attraction efforts;
- (G) Identify economic incentives that may be offered to businesses; and
- (H) Perform such other duties as the Mayor and/or Alderpersons may direct.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

A resolution accepting a proposal from Morning Noon Night for the Cleaning of the Storm Sewer Infrastructure at Birchwood and Holly Park in an amount not to exceed \$6,600.

RESOLUTION

BACKGROUND

Birchwood and Holly Park are detention centers for the properties between Cass Avenue to Fairview and from 75th Street to south of Darien Club Drive. The detention centers collect storm water during rain events and are released back into the system through downstream restrictors. The detention centers will typically hold storm water from 12-48 hours, pending the rain event. As part of routine maintenance the Municipal Services Department has identified that, the storm sewer infrastructure requires jetting. The existing conditions indicate that sediment deposits have accumulated within the pipes and structures. The jetting/cleaning will further identify any spot repairs that may be required of the system.

The goal of the project is to clean the existing infrastructure to maintain optimal operating conditions. The project also fulfills the ongoing requirements of the IEPA, as it pertains to the Storm Water Protection Plan (SWPP) for the City.

The proposed work for the maintenance includes the following:

- Jetting approximately 3,000 lineal feet of 4-6-inch underdrain
- Cleaning of the existing structures

Staff had requested proposals and received three. One proposal was non-responsive thus disqualified. The FY19/20 Budget includes funds for the maintenance jetting, below are the results:

RULES FOR COMPLIANCE WITH PUBLIC COMMENT REQUIREMENTS OF THE ILLINOIS OPEN MEETINGS ACT

I. PURPOSE OF RULES.

The purpose of these Rules is to comply with the requirement of Section 2.06 of the Illinois Open Meetings Act that a public comment section be provided at each meeting subject to the Open Meetings Act.

II. DEFINITION OF “PUBLIC BODY” or “BODY.”

For purposes of these Rules, the term “Public Body” or “Body” shall mean the City Council, any Committee of the City Council, and any Board and Commission established by the City Council.

III. RULES GOVERNING PUBLIC COMMENT.

A. Unless otherwise allowed by a majority vote of the Body, the public comment periods shall be as follows:

1. For the City Council, as set forth on the attached **Agenda template**.
2. For Council committees and advisory committees, at the conclusion of the meeting immediately before adjournment. At the direction of the Body, the floor may be opened for public comment in conjunction with specific agenda items.

B. Individuals seeking to make public comment to the Body shall be formally recognized by the Chair.

C. Individuals addressing the Body shall identify themselves by name, but need not provide their home address.

D. Individuals addressing the Body shall do so by addressing their comments to the Body

itself and shall not turn to address the audience.

E. Public comment time shall be limited to three (3) minutes per person.

F. An individual will be allowed a second opportunity to address the Body only after all other interested persons have addressed the Body and only upon the majority vote of the Body.

G. In the case of a special meeting, public comment will be limited to subject matters germane to the agenda of the special meeting.

IV. PUBLIC HEARING REQUIREMENTS.

Additional public comments periods will be allowed as required by law in the case of public hearing, subject to the same time constraints.
