ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution accepting the unit price proposal from the TLC Group Ltd. for the purchase and installation of median trees for 75th Street, the 50/50 Parkway Tree Program and the planting of various parkway trees in an amount not to exceed \$12,399.00.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The City's 2011 Tree Planting Program budget allowed for the purchase of parkway trees for the 75th Street median, various parkway tree replacements and the 50/50 parkway program. Please note the tree planting program was not funded in 2010.

Staff has identified the following trees for replacement at the City's expense due to mortality, and storm related incidents that required removal:

75th Street-Ten (10), 4-inch diameter trees City Parkways-Forty Eight (48), 2-1/2-inch diameter trees

Staff has received ten (10) residential tree participating inquiries and commitments for the City's 50/50 Cost Share Tree Program. Staff had opened seven sealed bids on September 13, 2011 and is attached as Attachment 1-Bid Tab. The lowest competitive bidder is the TLC Group. Attached and labeled as Attachment 2, labeled as, 2011 Tree Planting Program, includes this year's tree planting program summary, unit prices for various tree species for the purchase, planting, mulching along with a one-year warranty for each tree. The references for TLC Group have been verified with positive feedback.

This year's program again includes a Private Property Tree Planting Program. Staff had included within the request for competitive bids, pricing for private property tree planting, see Attachment 1. The program includes various selections of 2 ½-inch caliper trees, planting, mulching and a one-year guarantee. While the City is administering the Private Property Tree Planting Program, the property owner would be responsible for ordering and payment directly to the awarded vendor. This year's program also includes quantities for the replacement of trees that were removed by DuPage County, due to sanitary sewer maintenance.

SECTION 2: SCOPE OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT: The CONTRACTOR agrees to provide labor, equipment and materials necessary to provide the services as described in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and further described below:

Tree Planting and Mulching for parkways within the City of Darien and Tree Planting and Mulching for private properties-Unit Pricing

(Hereinafter referred to as the "WORK") and the CITY agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act (50 ILCS 505/1 et seq.) the following amount for performance of the described unit prices.

SECTION 3: ASSIGNMENT: CONTRACTOR shall not assign the duties and obligations involved in the performance of the WORK which is the subject matter of this Contract without the written consent of the CITY.

SECTION 4: TERM OF THE CONTRACT: This Contract shall commence on the date of its execution. The WORK shall commence upon receipt of a Notice to Proceed and continue expeditiously for <u>30 days</u> from that date until final completion. This Contract shall terminate upon completion of the WORK, but may be terminated by either of the PARTIES for default upon failure to cure after ten (10) days prior written notice of said default from the aggrieved PARTY. The CITY, for its convenience, may terminate this Contract with thirty (30) days prior written notice.

SECTION 5: INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE: The CONTRACTOR shall

indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, PARK DISTRICT, its officials, officers, directors, agents, employees and representatives and assigns, from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liability of any character, incurred due to the alleged negligence of the CONTRACTOR, brought because of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons or property on account of any act or omission, neglect or misconduct of said CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents and/or employees arising out of, or in performance of any

of the provisions of the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, including any claims or amounts recovered for any infringements of patent, trademark or copyright; or from any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Act" or any other law, ordinance, order or decree. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the CITY, its officials, officers, directors, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. The CONTRACTOR shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities. The Contractor shall not make any settlement or compromise of a lawsuit or claim, or fail to pursue any available avenue of appeal of any adverse judgment, without the approval of the City and any other indemnified party. The City or any other indemnified party, in its or their sole discretion, shall have the option of being represented by its or their own counsel. If this option is exercised, then the Contractor shall promptly reimburse the City or other indemnified party, upon written demand, for any expenses, including but not limited to court costs, reasonable attorneys' and witnesses' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by the City or other indemnified party in connection therewith. Execution of this Contract by the CITY is contingent upon receipt of Insurance Certificates provided by the CONTRACTOR in compliance with the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

SECTION 6: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The bidder shall at all times observe and comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the federal, state, local and City governments, which may in any manner affect the preparation of bids or the performance of the Contract. ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution authorizing the repairs of two emergency generators to Illini Power Products in an amount not to exceed \$9,949.37.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

Recently an annual inspection of the City's three emergency facility generators was conducted. The three generators serve the City Hall, Police Department and Water Plant Two. The inspection identified that two of the generators; Police Department and the Water Plant Two require the radiators, filters, hoses and belts to be re-built or replaced. While neither of the urgent repairs have been budgeted for within the line items of the respective accounts, there are sufficient funds to cover the cost of the expenditures at this time. Staff will monitor the fund balance of the proposed accounts and reduce future expenses as deemed appropriate. The Police Department generator cost for repair is \$5,765.14 and the Water Plant repair cost is \$4,184.23 for a total of \$9,949.39.

Staff had solicited three vendors and received two competitive quotes as noted below:



ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval of a Resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute an agreement with DuPage County for the purpose of sharing information for the County's Geographical Information System (GIS).

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

DuPage County is updating their current Geographical Information System (GIS) and allowing municipalities throughout the area to access the County's GIS data base. To help accomplish the County's goal, they have offered municipalities the opportunity to access their GIS for items such as aerials and parcel information. In return they require that municipalities provide general information as it relates to infrastructure and addressees. The County would be the responsible party for updating the data provided to them.

DuPage County has a GIS system that includes aerials, roadway maps, and parcel information. The City of Darien would be allowed to view the aerials in a read-only format along with limited print capabilities. The aerials would provide information such as the location of streetlights, fire hydrants, structures, and parcel numbers. A similar agreement was executed by the City Council on February 19, 2008. The County continues adding current property owner information to the GIS as it becomes available. Staff is not proposing to purchase any equipment or software. The City's Engineer, Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd., would be authorized to access the County data base and allow staff to request aerials of roadways, ditches, and entire blocks on an as needed basis. The City will continue to realize a cost savings by reducing hours of researching by Burke Engineering to produce a specific aerial.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Staff recommends approving the agreement.

An alternate consideration would be to not approve the agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into between <u>DuPage County</u>, Illinois and <u>City of Darien</u> (hereinafter, "Parties") which are either users or developers of Geographic Information System (GIS) spatial data.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to facilitate sharing and cooperative use of GIS spatial data; and

WHEREAS, each of the Parties is concerned with land use planning, transportation, and resource management within the boundaries of DuPage County and use GIS or other information technology to accomplish those goals; and

WHEREAS, there is significant overlap in the data needed for planning and analysis tasks to be accomplished and GIS data that may be developed or acquired for these purposes is expensive; and

WHEREAS, there is mutual public benefit to each of the Parties in sharing GIS data which will allow Parties to accomplish these goals at lower costs; and

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree to the cooperative process for the sharing of spatial data about DuPage County as follows:

- 1. Each Party to this agreement will make available to the other Parties any DuPage County located spatial data developed by the Parties insofar as the distribution of the spatial data is not limited by licenses, proprietary ownership, and cost sharing agreements or the Public Records Act.
- 2. Each Party shall also make available any updates of existing spatial data at a minimum on an annual basis.
- No Party shall use any GIS data that is obtained under this Agreement for any commercial, forprofit activity or product.
- 4. The receiving Party may provide the data to an external person, agency or firm only for the purpose of obtaining a service that requires the use of the data. The external person, agency or firm will not be permitted to sell, give, utilize, or distribute the data beyond the scope of said service.
- 5. The receiving Party may display on a public Internet site map images only, and will not provide access to the underlying map data.
- 6. Data provided will not be used as a base for engineering design, establishing or reestablishing land boundaries, or as a substitute for an on-site survey for regulatory functions.

- The Parties to this agreement shall use the spatial data provided by other Parties solely for their own purposes. No provision of this agreement shall limit the application of the Public Records Act (or, in the case of Federal Parties, the Freedom of Information Act) to the Parties to this agreement.
- 8. Each Party to this agreement shall accept spatial data from all other Parties "as is." In addition, each Party to this agreement shall hold harmless every other Party. Parties shall require any third Party users of this spatial data to agree in writing to hold harmless all Parties to this agreement.
- 9. The Parties to this agreement represent that the spatial data are complex and time sensitive and that they may contain some nonconformities, defects, or errors. The spatial data represent the best available information. The Parties to this agreement do not warrant that the spatial data will meet users' needs or expectations, or that all nonconformities, defects or errors can or will be corrected.
- 10. Any authorized use of information derived or generated from any spatial data provided pursuant to this Agreement in any product shall acknowledge the appropriate party to this agreement as the source, and include any qualifications deemed appropriate given the specific data quality and application of the derived information.
- 11. Both Parties agree to share the data in the format they use internally, without translation.
- 12. The receiving Party will not alter provided information in any manner. If any alterations are made by the receiving Party, the content of the data will no longer be the responsibility of the data provider.
- 13. Both Parties agree to limit access to each other's FTP data servers only to internal staff and any external person, agency, or firm under contract with Parties of this agreement that is providing a service that requires access to the GIS data.
- This Agreement is an integrated Agreement and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, written or oral, between the Parties concerning the sharing of GIS data.
- 15. Any amendments to this Agreement must be in writing, signed by all Parties involved.
- This Agreement shall become effective upon it's signature by all Parties involved and shall continue indefinitely.
- 17. Any Party may cancel this Agreement at any time, with or without cause upon written notification to all Parties involved.

ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval of a resolution authorizing the City to accept a Plat of Dedication for a roadway within the Reflections at Hidden Lake Development consisting of Spring Court and a roadway easement, street light and right of way trees-Outlot C (See Plat Exhibit A).

BACKGROUND

The Reflections at Hidden Lake Condominium Association requested that the City of Darien take ownership of Spring Court within the Reflections at Hidden Lake Development, in May of 2011. The City Council approved a criterion for the acceptance of private roadways in December of 2006.

A motion authorizing City staff to begin the process of accepting a future Plat of Dedication for the roadway within the Reflections at Hidden Lake Development was approved by the City Council on July 18, 2011. The Association has complied and completed all items as they relate to the attached February 1, 2010 City Council Meeting Agenda memo. The City staff is requesting that responsibility for maintenance regarding the following items be granted to the City. These items were previously identified as the responsibility of the Association.

Item G-July 18, 2011 Memo

Street Lights/Coach Lights - The City will not maintain any street lighting. Lighting shall be noted in the easement language as responsibility of the Homeowners Association.

Amended September 20, 2011

Staff has identified that the existing streetlight within the proposed right of way is integral with the existing street lights within the subdivision that are maintained by the City of Darien. The City also currently pays all energy costs related to the existing streetlight and it is a standard concrete pole with a mast arm.

Item J-July 18, 2011 Memo

Trees – The City will not maintain, remove or plant any trees. Tree maintenance shall be noted in the easement language as responsibility of the Homeowners Association.

Amended September 20, 2011

Staff has identified that three existing trees overhang within the roadway and may present safety concerns to truck traffic such as garbage trucks and snowplow trucks. Staff is recommending that the trees be maintained by the City in accordance with the tree trimming practice. The proposed item would be a very minimal future maintenance expense. 



MINUTES CITY OF DARIEN MUNICIPAL SERVICES COMMITTEE MEETING August 22, 2011

PRESENT: Alderman Joseph Marchese - Chairman, Alderman Halil Avci, Alderman Ted Schauer, Dan Gombac-Director, Michael Griffith – Senior Planner, Elizabeth Lahey-Secretary

ABSENT: None

Chairperson Marchese called the Municipal Services Committee Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall – City Council Chambers, Darien, Illinois and declared a quorum present.

Ms. Lisa Hauser, 2221 Dunmore and Ms. Jennifer Mazzei, 8905 Kilkenny were present to request signage in their subdivision for the safety of the children in the area to help slow down drivers.

Chairperson Marchese suggested to Staff to review the concern as requested.

Mr. Dan Gonibac, Director stated that in his position that the street signs warning people to slow down seemed to be ignored. He stated that portable signs are more proactive and that they can be moved around and not placed in one location. He further stated that he would visit the site to take a look at the area and work with the residents.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Ordinance – 1033 South Frontage Road, Great Dane Subdivision – Special Use Permit for garage, variation for fence and variation to sign code.

Mr. Michael Griffith, Senior Planner presented the staff report. He stated that the petitioner is proposing to construct an 8-foot tall, chain-link fence along the perimeter of the property including within the front yard. He further stated that the Zoning Ordinance limits fences within the front yard to 4 feet in height within the I-1 zoning district.

Mr. Griffith reported that the PZC held their meeting and approved the petition subject to the conditions outlined in the staff report. He stated that the conditions were to have a black, metal fence, "wrought iron style" installed along the front of the property with landscaping and staff approval on the lighting.

Mr. Griffith reported that the petitioner proposes to construct a pole sign 31 feet tall and 154 square feet in area. He stated that the Sign Code prohibits pole signs and limits free-standing signs to 60 square feet in area within the I-1 zoning district.

Mr. Griffith reported that the petitioner requires the exposure due to the setback from I-55 and the sign would provide a reference to the business.

Chairperson Marchese stated that the adjacent property is mostly wooded versus the Extended

Stay nearby which has a large sign that is affected by the nearby homes. He also referenced the present condition of the area and that the fence needs to be replaced. He stated that he does not have any objection to replacing it with a chain-link fence adjacent to the sides and back.

Mr. Mike Bialis, CC Industries, Inc. 222 N. LaSalle Street, Suite 1000, Chicago, IL 60601, the petitioner stated that height of the fence is more important to them for security.

Chairperson Marchese opened the meeting to anyone wishing to present public comment.

Ms. Linda Painter, Commissioner, DuPage County Forest Preserve Commissioner and President of the Timberlake Townhome Association stated that she had concerns about stormwater and issues with trucks and contaminants. She stated that more attention needs to be placed on cleaning up the area.

Ms. Painter also stated that some of the home owners in the area have complaints regarding truck noise. She stated that Timberlake is trying to keep the corridor clear of big signs and eliminate the clutter. Ms. Painter informed the Committee that some consideration should be placed on the sign and that the County denied a 192 ft. high sign. She stated that there is concern for the height and size and questioned why the sign needed to be so large. She suggested that the City follow the same criteria as the County and approve a sign that is smaller and in sync with the neighborhood.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that Great Dane proposes to sell parts related to repair and servicing activities as well as sales of semi-truck, semi-trailer and bus sales lot. He stated that long term is to possibly have a garage to service the vehicles. Regarding the contaminants from trucks the concerns would be addressed with the building permit such as triple catch basins.

Mr. Bialis stated that they are presently looking at the site as a sales office but would like the long term potential for a full service site with repairs of trailers. He stated that Great Dane has criteria such as highway visibility and close to a full interchange. Mr. Bialis stated that the sign is a typical highway sign and higher and larger so it can be seen safely. He stated that by no means is the sign a billboard.

Chairperson Marchese stated that the present sign is barely visible with the sign being lower than the property.

Alderman Avci questioned how the proposed sign compares to a billboard.

Mr. Gombac reported that the proposed sign is 11×14 feet oval shaped and 154 square feet versus an average billboard sign that is typically 14×18 feet and 180 square feet total.

Chairperson Marchese stated that west of I-355 and adjacent to I-55 there are a proliferation of billboards.

Alderman Avci questioned if the proposed trucks will have pans under them to handle the leakage.

Mr. Bialis stated they are proposing to sell new and used trailers and not proposing presently for a full service station.

Mr. Gombac stated that if and when the site is used for a garage there will have to be improvements to the site and storm water management. Alderman Schauer questioned the hours of operation.

Mr. Bialis stated that the office hours will be open until 5:00 p.m.

Alderman Schauer stated that the proposal is an improvement versus the present scenario of dropping off trucks at 1 or 2:00 in the morning.

Ms. Painter agreed that there would be less truck traffic but asked that the Committee consider the height and size of the sign.

Chairperson Marchese stated that the City intended to use the property as a site to construct a joint maintenance facility years back and that this is an improvement on the property which the City has no use for.

Mr. Gombac questioned if the petitioner considered an ornamental fence around the entire site.

Mr. Bialis stated that it would be a substantial cost to place an ornamental fence around the entire site. He stated that their proposal will be an improvement. He further stated that this location will be the main sales office for the Chicago branch which is presently in Bolingbrook.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Marchese made a motion and it was seconded by Alderman Schauer that based upon the submitted petition and the information presented, the requests associated with PZC 2011-09 is in conformance with the standards of the Darien City Code and move that the Municipal Services Committee recommend to the City Council approval of the petition subject to the following:

- 1. A black, metal fence, "wrought iron style", is to be installed along the front of the property, 8-foot tall being acceptable, instead of a chain-link fence;
- 2. Landscaping is to be included along the frontage of the property, street side of the fence;
- 3. Staff to review exterior lighting details for Code compliance.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

Chairperson Marchese announced that this would be forwarded to the City Council on Tuesday, September 6th.

B. Resolution – Boundary Agreement with the Village of Woodridge.

Mr. Michael Griffith, Senior Planner reported that the City of Darien has several Boundary Agreeements. He stated that the Boundary Agreeement with the Village of Woodridge is expiring. Mr. Griffith stated that one of the changes includes Woodridge to supply water, from their existing water main to an unincorporated property located on Darien's side of the boundary line.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director explained that the water tower is across the street from the business and that the City does not have the ability to hook up the unincorporated property. Further he stated that it would not be practical to install an additional water main to serve one business.

Mr. Griffith reported that the agreement will require a public hearing before adoption.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Schauer made a motion and it was seconded by Alderman Avci to approve the Boundary Agreement with the Village of Woodridge as presented.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

C. Discussion – Ditch Criteria

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director presented the staff report. He stated that the discussion is a follow up based on the recommendations at the last Committee meeting. Mr. Gombac stated Alderman Avci shared their comments and feedback regarding revised ditch rating criteria.

Mr. Gombac reported that Top Priority, High Priority and Low Priority were assigned with a new revised rating system. He reported that staff's recommendation was for Consideration #2 as outlined in the agenda memo.

Chairperson Marchese stated that he approved of the revised chart and weighted system but that having the road work drive the ditch repair is wrong.

Mr. Gombac stated that the City can implement a weighted rating system and continue to review the ditches that fall into the annual 5.5 miles of street resurfacing for potential consideration. The City averages approximately three ditches per year that fall into the subsequent year's road program. He further stated that the proposed consideration would not disrupt the program schedule for roadways.

Alderman Avci stated that the intent was to develop a rating system with concentration on the overall score. There are weights assigned to a scheduled roadway and if the total points suggest that the ditch is in the top ranking with a proposed subsequent roadway than the roadway would be scheduled.

Chairperson Marchese stated that he did not want to see the road program drive the ditch program.

Alderman Schauer stated that he was concerned that the ditches that need to be done will get pushed back. He stated that there has never been a proactive funding approach to completing a defined length of ditches every year.

Chairperson Marchese stated that the severity of the ditch should drive what ditch to repair and that it may take several years to work through the system.

Alderman Avci stated that there needs to be a discussion from the City Council regarding policy. Alderman Schauer stated that the City's infrastructure is over 40 years old and that there needs to be a proactive approach to making sure the infrastructure is set.

Mr. Gombac stated that the survey would take approximately two months to complete the rating system and he would provide the Committee with a rating report prior to goal setting. Pending a recommendation this item will be brought forth to the future goal setting for 2011, for presentation to the Committee of the Whole.

Alderman Marchese suggested that upon completion of the field review, a recommendation to have the City Council look at the top four projects and their costs in terms of the road program and if the road doesn't need to be done it will get patched if necessary. If it is in the road program for the next year it would be incorporated in the 5.5 miles per year. He stated that the severity of the ditch is driving the ditch project and not the road program driving the ditch project.

Chairperson Marchese made a motion to recommend the implementation of Consideration # 3;-Implement the revised weighted rating system as presented within the agenda memo. Alderman Schauer seconded the motion.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

C Miuutes – July 25, 2011 – Municipal Services Committee

Alderman Schauer made a motion and it was seconded by Alderman Avci to approve the July 25, 2011 Municipal Services Committee Meeting Minutes.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Alderman Avci questioned if there was an overage of wood chips and if the City is not selling as much as expected. Mr. Gombac stated that he would look at the numbers and report back to the Committee.

NEXT MEETING:

Chairperson Marchese announced that the next meeting is scheduled for Monday September 26, 2011 at 6:30 p.m.

With no further business before the Committee, Alderman Schauer made a motion and it was seconded by Alderman Avci. Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously and the meeting adjourned at 8:01p.m.
