### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Darien was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Carmen D. Soldato.

## 7. MAYOR'S REPORT

### 8. CITY CLERK'S REPORT

Clerk Coleman...

- ... stated that the Plan Commission meeting scheduled for Wednesday, February 20th, had been cancelled
- ... invited everyone to join the City Council on March 4th for a cake and coffee reception honoring Krishan

Sant, 2002 Citizen of the Year. She also reminded everyone that the Citizen of the Year Dinner/Dance was scheduled for Saturday, March 9th, at Ripples and that tickets were available at City Hall for \$25.00 per person.

### 9. CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Curneal reported that the City received additional equipment for cable television viewing; the equipment would allow multiple tapes to be played throughout the day. He noted that the old equipment was manually changed and programmed. He said that the new equipment would offer a variety of information to the public.

Alderman Biehl asked if the Dale Basin project would begin in Spring 2002; Administrator Curneal affirmed. Alderman Biehl inquired about Phase II; Administrator Curneal stated that Community Park and Plainfield/Crest Roads were being finalized and that work could begin in Fall 2002.

### 10. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORT

Asst. Director of Public Works Robert Mengarelli...

- ... noted that Asst. Director Rodgers had surgery performed on his neck, that he was recuperating and would be home hopefully on Wednesday.
- ... performed a slide presentation in regard to snowplowing. He said that the City contained approximately 68 miles of streets that Public Works was responsible for plowing. He commented that each street required four passes in order to clear them, which was equivalent to 272 lane miles of street; there are 132 cul-de-sacs within the City that are plowed by five 1-Ton trucks; and there are approximately 10.5 miles of County roadways.
- ... displayed a City of Darien Base Map that indicated 'green' streets, which are primary streets, he stated they are plowed first; 'red' streets, which are secondary streets; and 'yellow' streets, which are DuPage County roadways. He noted that there are approximately ten miles of streets within the City that are privately maintained.
- ...reported that snowplowing involved seven 9-Ton dump trucks; four plow the west side of Cass Avenue and three plow the east side. He said that the cul-de-sacs were divided amongst the five 1-Ton trucks, which take approximately eight hours to plow.
- ... spoke about the snowstorm of January 30th. He stated that the bulk of the snow came between 2:00-4:30 A.M. He commented that there was a major breakdown of a vehicle, which disabled two drivers/vehicles--the mechanic and a driver.
- ... commented that Public Works employees are divided into two teams, one on call and the other on standby. He said there were fifteen available employees but there were only twelve trucks. The employees begin by salting and if snow continues to accumulate, 1" or more, all employees would be called out for plowing. There was discussion about working/overtime hours and strategies utilized.

### 11. TREASURER'S REPORT

## A. WARRANT NUMBER 01-02-20

It was moved by Alderman Durkin and seconded by Alderman Tikalsky to approve payment of Warrant Number 01-02-20 in the amount of \$53,998.08 from the General Fund; \$4,642.43 from the Darien Area Dispatch Fund; \$9,024.98 Motor Fuel Tax Fund; \$2,004.25 from the Hotel/Motel Expenditures Fund; \$155,650.62 from the Water Operations Fund; \$144,051.12 from the General Fund Payroll for the period ending 02/07/02; \$13,397.03 from the Water Fund Payroll for the period ending 02/07/02; \$19,639.47 from the D.A.D.C. Fund Payroll for the period ending 02/07/02; for a total to be approved of \$402,407.98. Mayor Soldato inquired about the payment for the SAMI Conference. Administrator Curneal explained that SAMI administered drug/alcohol testing criteria for Public Works drivers by randomly directing the City who to test, when to test and where to test. He noted that there have been many changes in Federal legislation and Department of Transportation regulations and that was the purpose of the conference. Discussion ensued in regard to budgeting for future conferences.
