## 6. RECEIVING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Alderman Poteraske was contacted by Ms. Alop, 7100 block of Summit, who was concerned about the flashing light at the intersection of 67th Street and Clarendon Hills Road. Alderman Weaver noted that the Administrative/Finance Committee reviewed the criteria utilized for the signal at the intersection; she indicated that the Committee would revisit the intersection criteria on a regular basis. Alderman Poteraske reported that he attended the Brookhaven Plaza Merchants Association meeting; they discussed proposed modifications and the business district.

Alderman Biehl said that Mr. Gable of the Woodmere Subdivision thanked the City for excellent snowplowing. He was contacted by Henry Stroede of Marion Hills who was concerned about the deadline for the leaf pickup program. Mr. Stanko Buchovic contacted him regarding the "NO PARKING" signs on Eleanor near Hinsdale South High School; Alderman Weaver stated that Chief Pavelchik sent a letter to residents in regard to changing the hours on the signs.

## B. CITY OF DARIEN MUNICIPAL BICYCLE ROUTE SYSTEM FEASIBILITY STUDY

Mayor Soldato spoke briefly about the Bike Path and introduced Chairman Halil Avci of the Environmental Committee. Chairman Avci provided background information, he noted that TranSystems Corporation was chosen as the consultant for the project and that the City and Darien Park District jointly funded the project. TranSystems representatives, Grace Dysico and John Wielebnicki, addressed Council and reviewed the feasibility study, particularly: Goals and Purpose of the Study, Bicycle Route Analysis, Recommended Bicycle Route System, Public Involvement Documents, and Funding and Implementation.

Alderman Weaver inquired about grant funding; Ms. Dysico responded about specific grants, amounts, application deadlines, and awards.

Alderman Hagen inquired about striping of Cass Avenue over I-55 and the possibility of utilizing the center island for a bike path. Mr. Wielebnicki responded that islands/mediums were sixteen feet wide, the path would be ten feet leaving three feet on either side; he noted that Federal requirements were five feet from the curb.

Mayor Soldato thanked the Environmental Committee, TranSystems Corporation and the Park District for their endeavors, which were displayed within the Feasibility Study.

City Clerk Coleman noted that Treasurer Donner had another meeting to attend and Mayor Soldato asked him to present his report.

B. CONSIDERATION OF A MOTION TO APPROVE AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A VARIATION TO THE DARIEN ZONING ORDINANCE (PZC 2002-01: South Grove Park)

Mayor Soldato noted that Council discussed South Grove Park during the Work Session. The consensus of the City Council was an obligation of the Park District to install sidewalks and that the Park District would keep the City apprised of their construction. Mayor Soldato requested Attorney Kolman to read the language, which was to be incorporated into the Ordinance. She responded that the following language would be added under SECTION 3: Conditions of Approval:

"C. Sidewalks shall be constructed within the rights-of-way of Beller Drive and Ailsworth Drive to provide pedestrian access to the park. Within six (6) months from the date of passage of this Ordinance, the Park District shall make a report to the corporate authorities as to the status of the construction of said sidewalks."

Park District Administrator Nerger inquired if sidewalk was to be installed on both Beller Drive and Ailsworth Drive; Mayor Soldato responded affirmatively, except where there were wetlands.
