Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the City Council of the CITY OF DARIEN DECEMBER 2, 2002

1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Darien was called to order at 7:40 P.M. by Mayor Carmen D. Soldato.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Soldato introduced Girl Scout Troop 1314 who led the Council and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. DECLARATION OF A QUORUM - There being five Aldermen present, Mayor Soldato declared a quorum.

Alderman Biehl reported that he had a verbal conversation with Mr. Gable of the Woodmere Subdivision regarding snowplowing.

7. MAYOR'S REPORT

A. RECOGNITION OF GIRL SCOUT TROOPS

Mayor Soldato welcomed Girl Scout Troop 1314, who along with Troops 325, 123, 269, 496, 48 and 1331 decorated City Hall and the Police Department in preparation of the upcoming Holidays. Clerk Coleman displayed artwork created by the Scouts, which would be displayed within the City buildings. Leader Diane Ferrando introduced the Scouts from Troop 1314; all of the Girl Scouts received a "Certificate of Recognition".

Mayor Soldato...

... noted that the Tara Hill Wetlands were discussed at the November 18th Council meeting; he said that Mr. & Mrs. Knecht met with Administrator Vana, Director Dreyer, Engineer Lynch, Asst. Director Mengarelli, and himself to discuss the issue. He said the City would create a maintenance plan for the wetlands and would meet with Tara Hill residents to inform them of the plan.

... thanked Attorney Murphey for proactively pursuing the redevelopment of the triangle at Cass Avenue and Plainfield Road as a business district.

... complimented the Darien Historical Society, Chamber of Commerce and Scouts for the beautiful Tree Lighting Ceremony held on December 1st.

8. CITY CLERK'S REPORT

Clerk Coleman...

... advised that the Police Pension Board scheduled a meeting for December 10th at 7:00 P.M. in the City Hall Council Chambers.

... noted that the Environmental Committee rescheduled their December 18th meeting to December 11th at 7:00 P.M. to conduct a Public Open House for community review of the Bicycle Route Draft-Design proposed for the City of Darien.

... announced that the 2002 Darien Holiday Home Decorating Contest committee would begin viewing decorated homes between 7:00-10:00 P.M. from December 7th through December 13th. She commented that monetary awards and certificates would be presented to the winners at the December 16th City Council meeting.

9. CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Vana stated that he was notified that the City would receive a second grant in the amount of \$25,000 for the Brookeridge Streambank Stabilization Project.

10. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORT

Asst. Director of Public Works Robert Rodgers...

... thanked Asst. Director Mengarelli for his assistance over the past couple of weeks while he was on vacation.

... noted that the Snow Plow Rodeo, which was held on November 27th, was a success.

... reported that the hydrant flushing project was completed. He said that 1100 fire hydrants were flushed and that 18 hydrants needed repair.

... commented that, to date, there were thirty-nine watermain breaks; in 2001 there were twenty-nine; and

in 2000 there were twenty-three. He said that the increase was due to the system getting older and that it would require more maintenance every year.

17. QUESTIONS, COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS - GENERAL

Alderman Biehl congratulated Public Works for another successful Snow Plow Rodeo.

Clerk Coleman complemented the Public Works Employees on their recent snow plowing efforts.

Alderman Poteraske stated that at the November 19th Goal Setting Session there was discussion about speed control. He commented that he had asked Administrator Vana to distribute copies of pictures and articles that he had accumulated in regard to traffic/street control from various sources. Mayor Soldato noted that traffic control was an on-going issue.

John Ganzi, 2228 Donegal Drive, brought forth concerns about the Tara Hill Wetlands. He said that the area was built as a water retention area and that all underground waterways tied into that area; that due to recent Supreme Court decisions, the area was not regulated by the Army Corps of Engineers for water retention and flood control; and that the City was responsible for the area.

Mayor Soldato stated that the area had a dual function: wetlands and storm drainage. He noted that the engineer had been directed to devise a plan and that a meeting would be scheduled with Tara Hill residents.

Tim Waz stated that a meeting was planned for December 3rd at 6:30 P.M. at the Darien-Woodridge Fire Station, 7550 Lyman Avenue, to discuss consolidation options between Darien-Woodridge, Tri-State, and Pleasantview Fire Protection Districts.

18. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the City Council, it was moved by Alderman Biehl and seconded by Alderman Cotten to adjourn.
