B. TREASURER'S MONTHLY REPORT – JANUARY, 2010

Treasurer Coren reviewed all year-to-date sources of revenue and expenditures and fund balances through the month of January, 2010: General Fund Revenue \$9,061,973; General Fund Expenditures \$9,027,731; Current General Fund Balance \$2,913,306; Water Fund Revenue \$2,390,007; Water Fund Expenditures \$2,914,946; Current Water Fund Balance (\$73,984); Motor Fuel Tax Fund Revenue \$459,042; Motor Fuel Tax Fund Expenditures \$391,420; Current Motor Fuel Tax Fund Balance (\$44,227); Water Depreciation Fund Revenue \$15,120; Water Depreciation Fund Expenditures \$68,470; Current Water Depreciation Fund Balance \$582,824; Capital Improvement Fund Revenue \$287,034; Capital Improvement Fund Expenditures \$2,179,189; Current Capital Improvement Fund Balance \$798,844; Capital Projects Debt Service Fund Revenue \$105,429; Capital Projects Debt Service Fund Expenditures \$504,000; and a current fund balance of \$41,714.

Treasurer Coren reported that a meeting of the Police Pension Board with their two financial advisors took place several weeks ago to review the performance of the pension fund for the calendar year January 1 through December 31, 2009. The fund has a total balance of approximately \$16.5 million, and is split equally between financial advisors MB Financial and UBS. For the calendar year, MB Financial had a positive return of 8.89%, and UBS had a positive return 10.15%. The combined fund for the calendar year had a return of approximately 9.5%.

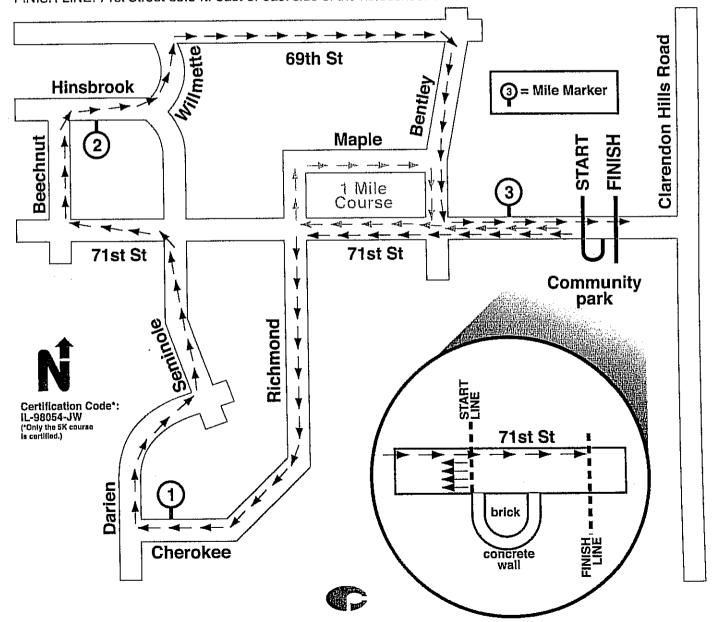

Planning Overview/ Discussion

The petitioner proposes to construct a new free-standing sign to replace an existing sign at the same location. The proposed sign will replace the existing free-standing sign located at the north entrance to the Darien Plaza shopping center, which also provides access to the adjacent office buildings. However, the sign location does not comply with the Sign Code.

A public hearing is not required for considering a variation from the Sign Code. Therefore, public notice was not provided.

The proposed sign is considered an off-premises sign, a sign that does not advertise a business conducted or a product sold on the same property as the sign is located. Off-premises signs are prohibited. The sign is to be located on the outlot located in front of the Darien Plaza shopping center, but will advertise businesses located on the parcel behind the shopping center, 8141-8147 Cass Avenue, and the parcels to the south, 8201-8205 Cass Avenue.

A sign permit was issued for and constructed on 8201-8205 Cass Avenue. Since 8201-8205 Cass Avenue does not have it's own driveway entrance off of Cass Avenue, staff assumes the proposed sign helps to identify the entrance for these office buildings. The petitioner should confirm.

The proposed sign is a free-standing sign, which complies with the maximum permitted height and sign area:

Per the Sign Code, free-standing signs are to be located at least 20 feet from a driveway entrance. However, the Sign Code allows this setback to be reduced, for every foot greater than 4 feet that the sign

is from the front lot line, the setback from the driveway may be reduced by a foot. The sign is to be 35 feet from the front lot line, therefore, this setback can be reduced by 31 feet. The proposed sign will be located within an island in the middle of the driveway entrance, just like the existing sign.

Per the Sign Code, free-standing signs are to be located at least 30 feet from an interior side lot line. The proposed site plan shows the sign to be 19 feet from the interior side lot line.

Per the proposed site plan, the sign will be located 35 feet from the street right-of-way, exceeding the minimum required setback.

Per the Sign Code, landscaping is required at the base of the sign, the landscaped area must be at least 4 feet in width on all sides of the sign base. Currently, the area around the sign is landscaped with shrubs. However, the area does not meet the area requirements. Per the Sign Code, the Director of Community Development may require the additional landscaping at an alternate location.

Staff could not find any previously granted variations or approvals for the existing sign location.

In considering a petition for a variation from the Sign Code, the Commission shall consider the following:

- 1. The available locations for adequate signage on the property.
- 2. The effect of the proposed sign on pedestrian and motor traffic.
- 3. The cost to the applicant in complying with the Sign Code as opposed to the detriment, if any, to the public from granting of the variation.
- 4. If undue hardships and practical difficulties result in complying with the Sign Code and if those hardships are a result of previous actions of the petitioner.
- 5. The general intent of the Sign Code.

Staff Findings/Recommendations

The property which contains the businesses to be identified on the sign does not provide adequate locations for the sign to be visible to the general public, the sign will not impact pedestrian or motor vehicle traffic, and staff believes the sign meets the general intent of the Sign Code.

Further, the proposed sign will be an improvement over the existing sign. In fact, other than the location, the proposed sign will be in greater compliance than the current sign. Therefore, staff recommends the Planning and Zoning Commission make the following recommendation in favor of the variation petition:

Based upon the submitted petition and the information presented, the request associated with PZC 2010-02 is in conformance with the standards of the Darien City Code and, therefore, I move the Planning and Zoning Commission approve the petition as presented.

Planning and Zoning Commission Review - February 17, 2010

The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this matter at its meeting on February 17, 2010. The

following members were present: Beverly Meyer – Chairperson, Robert Erickson, Ronald Kiefer, John Lind, Raymond Mielkus, Kenneth Ritzert, Susan Vonder Heide, Michael Griffith – Senior Planner and Elizabeth Lahey – Secretary.

Members absent: Donald Hickok and Gloria Jiskra

Michael Griffith, Senior Planner, presented the staff report. He noted the location of the sign. He stated the main issue is that the sign is off-premises. He stated the proposed sign will be located in the same location as the existing sign, which is located at the south entrance to the Darien Plaza shopping center. He stated the sign itself complies with the Sign Code. He stated staff does not object to the sign, as it will be an improvement over the current sign.

He noted that the same property owner owns several other buildings along Cass Avenue and have replaced signs on those properties. He stated the proposed sign will be the same as those other new signs.

Shuan Ensign, Landmark Sign Group, the petitioner, described the sign and asked if they could raise the sign 6 inches.

Mr. Griffith stated as long as the sign did not exceed 12 feet in height, it would be fine.

Commission Ritzert asked if there were any prior approvals for the existing sign.

Mr. Griffith stated he could not anything on the existing sign. He stated that he understood the City annexed that area in the early 1970s as already built, so assumes the sign was permitted under the County's ordinance at that time.

Chairperson Meyer asked about the set back from the side lot line.

Mr. Griffith stated that the sign does not meet the side yard setback, but stated he did not see that as a major issue. He said the current sign does not meet the setback and it has not caused a problem with vehicles coming off and onto Cass Avenue.

Mr. Griffith stated the Sign Code does not address a sign located within a driveway island.

There was a comment regarding the sign illumination and if the lighting would be on a timer. Mr. Ensign stated that the top part of the sign will be illuminated, but that the illumination would likely be less than the current sign due to the sign panel coloring. Mr. Ensign stated he did not know if the sign lighting would be on a timer, but stated he did not think the sign would be on all of the time, as that is not typical.

Commissioner Kiefer noted that the landscape area did not meet the code.

Mr. Griffith confirmed this, but stated that there is landscaping currently at the base of the sign and felt the intent was met. He stated the Sign Code allows for the Director to require landscaping elsewhere.

Mr. Kiefer did not see this as an issue, since there is already landscaping at the sign base.

There was not anyone from the public to offer comments.

Without further discussion, Commissioner Kiefer made the following motion, seconded by Commissioner Erickson:

Based upon the submitted petition and the information presented, the request associated with PZC 2010-02 is in conformance with the standards of the Darien City Code and, therefore, I move the Planning and Zoning Commission approve the petition as presented.

Upon a roll call vote, THE MOTION CARRIED by a vote of 7-0.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A VARIATION TO THE DARIEN SIGN CODE

WHEREAS, the City of Darien is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, as a home rule unit of local government, the City may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government except as limited by Article VII, Section 6; and

WHEREAS, the property legally described in Section 1 (the "Subject Property"), is zoned B-1 Neighborhood Convenience Shopping District pursuant to the Darien Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner has requested approval of a variation from the terms of the Darien Sign Code to permit an off-premises free-standing sign and to reduce the required interior yard setback from 30 feet to 19 feet for the sign; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission at its regular meeting of February 17, 2010, recommended approval of said petition and has forwarded its findings and recommendation of approval to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2010, the Municipal Services Committee of the City Council reviewed the petition and has forwarded its recommendation of approval of said petition to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the findings and recommendations described above and now determines to grant the petition subject to the terms, conditions and limitations described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Subject Property. This Ordinance is limited and restricted to the property generally located at 8105 Cass Avenue, the Darien Plaza Shopping Center outlot, Darien, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

PARCEL 5: THAT PART OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 34, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 11, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT A POINT 50.0 FEET EAST OF THE WEST LINE OF SAID NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 34; THENCE SOUTH 0 DEGREES 09 MINUTES 59 SECONDS WEST ALONG A LINE

PARALLEL WITH THE WEST LINE OF SAID NORTHWEST QUARTER, 465.0 FEET; THENCE EAST 170.0 FEET; THENCE NORTH 0 DEGREES 09 MINUTES 59 SECONDS EAST, 200.0 FEET; THENCE WEST 12.50 FEET; THENCE NORTH 0 DEGREES 09 MINUTES 59 SECONDS EAST.265.0 FEET; THENCE WEST 157.50 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.:

SECTION 2: Variation from Sign Code Granted. The following variations from the Darien Sign Code are hereby granted for a free-standing sign:

- A. Section 4-3-7(B)(3): Signs Specifically Prohibited, to permit a free-standing, off-premises sign on the subject parcel.
- B. Section 4-3-7(E): Placement of Signs on Lots, to reduce the required interior side yard setback from 30 to 19 feet.

SECTION 3: Plans Approved: The free-standing sign shall be erected in substantial compliance with the following plans:

- A. Sign Drawing, 2 sheets, prepared by Landmark Sign Group, latest revision dated December 14, 2009.
- B. Site Plan/ALTA/ACSM Land Title Survey, 1 sheet, survey prepared by Glen D. Krish Land Surveyor, Inc., latest revision dated September 24, 2007, site plan prepared by petitioner.

SECTION 4: Home Rule. This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent of the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supercede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 5: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

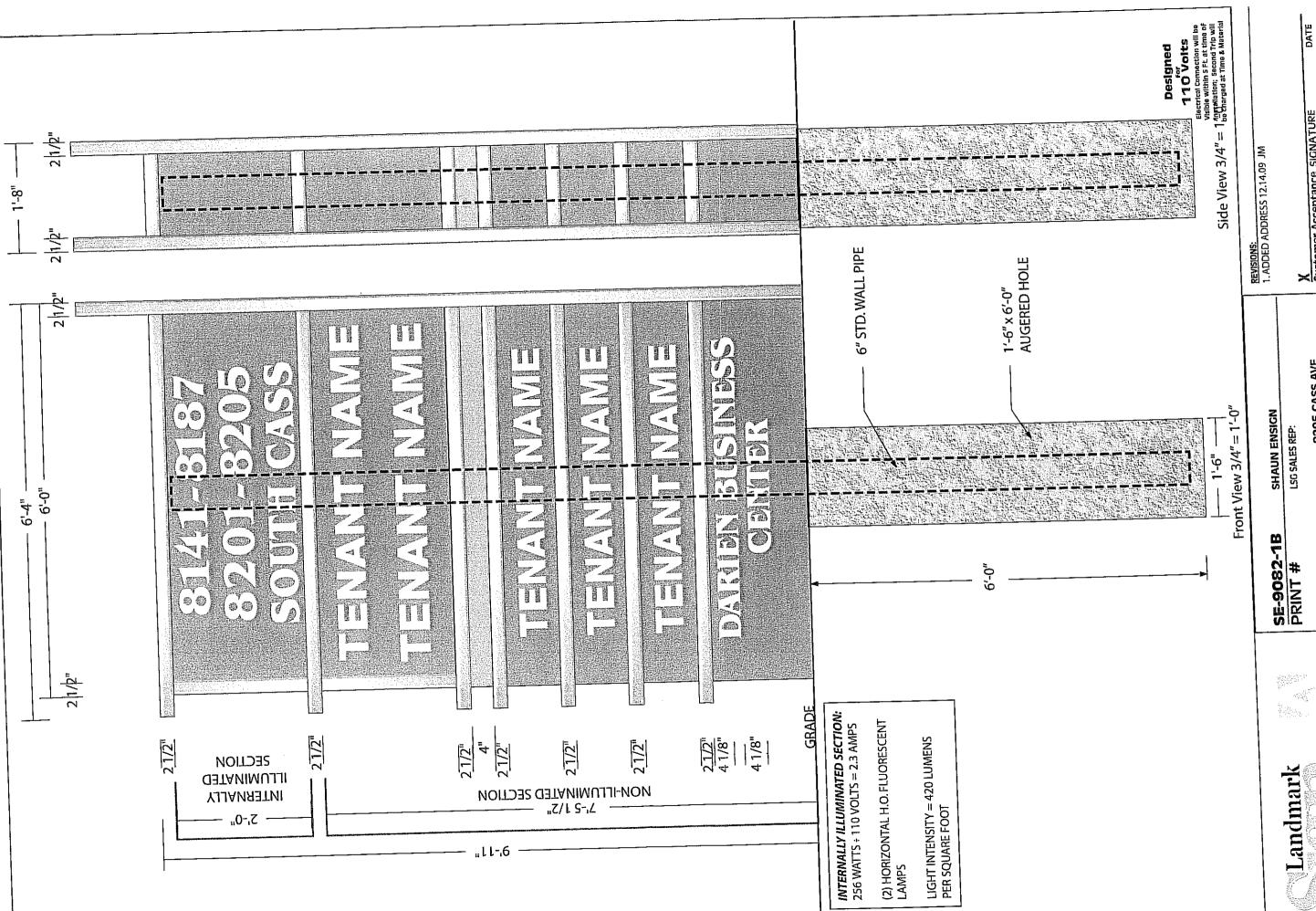

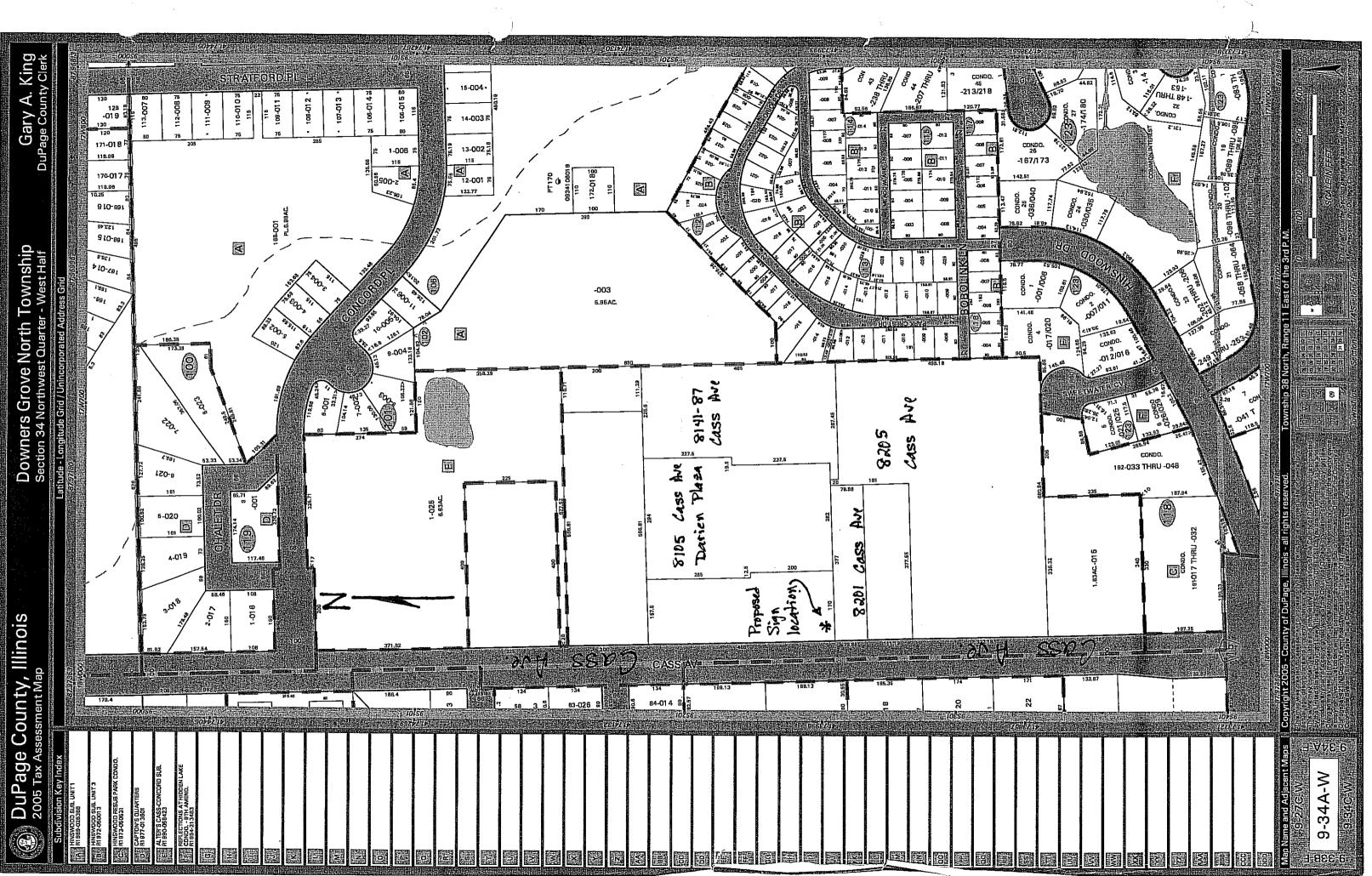

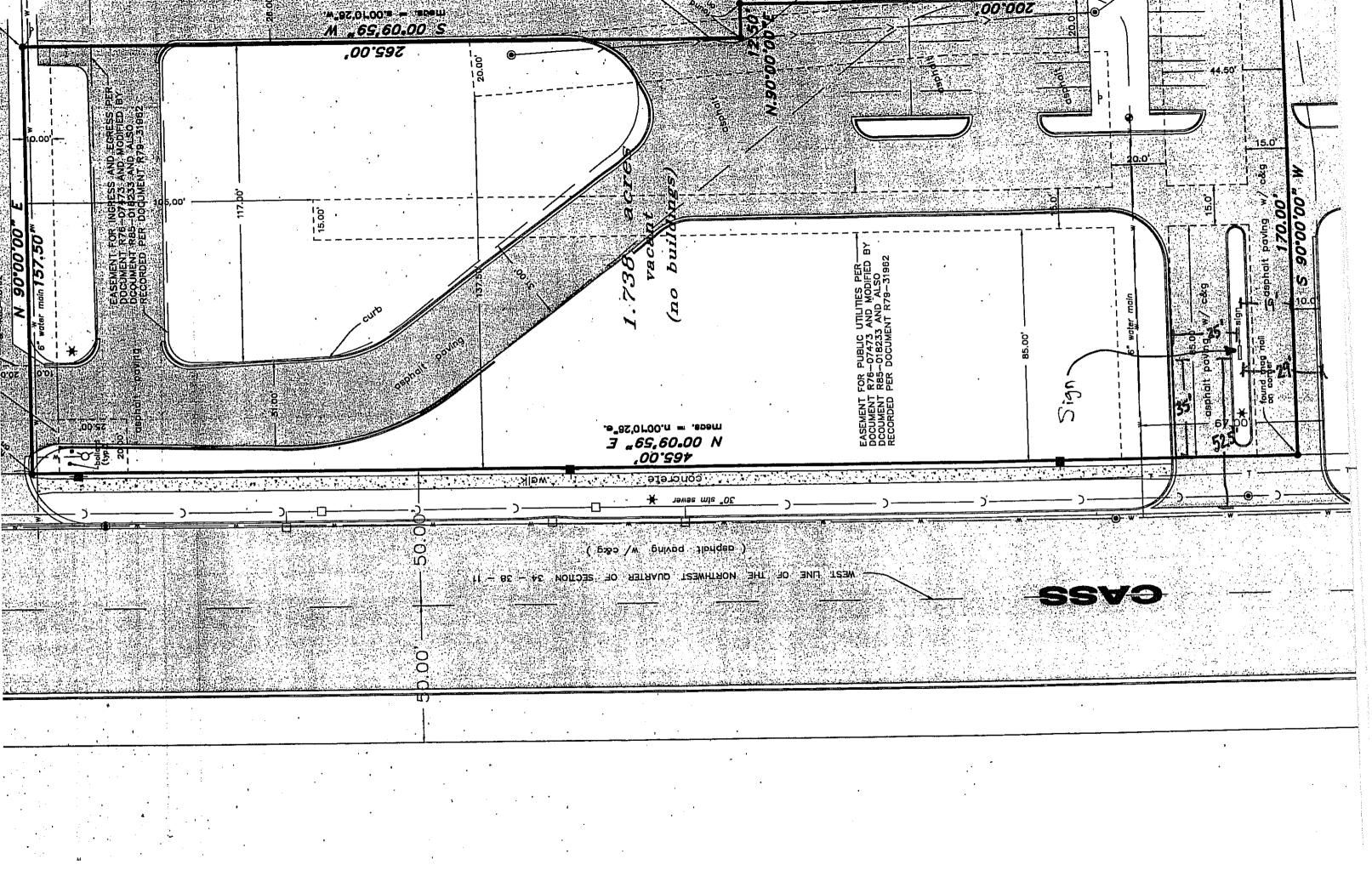

ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution accepting a proposal from K&K Well Drilling in the amount of \$9,840.00 for the sealing and capping of Well No. 6, located at 1930 Manning Road, Plant No. 3.

RESOLUTION

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The existing well No. 6 is a 310 foot shallow well that has been in service since 1972. The well is located approximately 100-feet east of 1930 Manning Road, Plant No. 3. The well has had maintenance completed in 1979 which included reworking of the entire well and 1988 that included the rebuilding of the pump and motor. It has been recently identified that the well is not producing water. The 10-inch casing line is constructed of cast iron piping and has been identified that it is corroding. The shallow well produces a high iron content, low water quality and further does not provide a benefit for a backup well. Upon review, Staff is requesting the abandonment process of the shallow well as prescribed by the Illinois Department of Health and the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. This item was not a budgeted item but would be covered by the maintenance line item in the budget.

Approval of a resolution rejecting all sealed bids and to re-bid the 2010 Roadside Ditching Program.

<u>RESOLUTION</u> <u>BACKUP</u>

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

Staff opened sealed bids for the 2010 Roadside Ditch Project on January 28, 2010. The bid specifications called out for eleven various projects, and the contract stated that the City would reserve the right to pick and choose the final amount of drainage projects to be completed. The proposed FY10-11 capital projects option budget proposed four projects. City Staff had contacted the lowest responsive bidder, Scorpio Construction, and informed Mr. Rendina that Staff would be forwarding a recommendation to the Municipal Services Committee for four of the eleven drainage projects:

- 1. Project D-09 Brookbank Road Janet Avenue to Elm Street
- 2. Project A10 Evans Place Janet Avenue to Elm Street
- 3. Project B10 Richmond Avenue 67th Street North to City Limits
- 4. Project C-10 Western Avenue 72nd Street to Plainfield Road.

Scorpio Construction submitted a letter, (see attached) informing the City that he would not be able to complete the project due to the reduction of the proposed scope of work. Scorpio Construction requested that two contract line items be adjusted as agreed unit quantities as estimated by Staff. If the project required more units the contractor would be reimbursed for all units above the estimated units. Staff informed the contractor that was unacceptable and would recommend awarding the bid to the responsive bidder.

The second low bid was approximately \$50,000 over the Scorpio bid for the same 4 projects.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Municipal Services Committee discussed this item and unanimously voted to recommend rejecting all bids and to re-bid the proposed 2010 Roadside Ditch Program.

You then informed me that you are unable to complete the four projects at the submitted unit costs and you asked to renegotiate the contract. Dear Mr. Gombac:

We appreciate this opportunity to explain our concerns regarding the above referenced project. We also would like you to understand that it is not our desire to turn down this opportunity to work for the City.

We trust that you understand that when any contractor prepares a bid, there are certain project costs that are spread throughout all of the pay items in the proposal. These include, but are not limited to, overhead, profit, burden, mobilization costs, equipment rental cost, vehicle costs, etc. In this project, we spread these costs across all of the items of the contract. Therefore, our ability to meet projects costs and have an opportunity to gain a profit is dependent on our ability to complete all of the work on the contract efficiently. When items are removed from a contract, the contractor's ability to cover costs and earn a profit is understandably impaired.

IDOT Standards typically allow up to a 25% reduction in quantities by the Owner without an adjustment in contract unit prices. When this happens a contractor struggles to break even on a contract. When quantities are reduced greater than 25%, IDOT recognizes that it becomes impossible for the contractor to overcome costs and avoid losses and, therefore, enters into unit price negotiations with the contractor in order to create a fair opportunity for the contractor break even.

In the case of this contract, the City is asking us to bear a 70% reduction in contract quantities, leaving us no opportunity to come close to breaking even on the contract, much less make a profit. In order for us to break even on this contract we would need to complete at least 50% of the original contract quantities.

We understand that the City budget may not be able expend \$170,000 to complete 50% of the work. Therefore, we are willing to do the four sections being contemplated by the City on the condition that the City guarantees the minimum payment of proposed quantity for the pay items "Layout-Job Consultation" and "Ditching-Grading Costs" at each of the four locations constructed. If this condition is not acceptable to the City, we ask that we be allowed to negotiate unit prices for each of the line items so that we can complete the requested work without suffering economic loss.
