City Attorney Murphey indicated First Amendment activity like leafletting on a public sidewalk is virtually immune from governmental regulation; the difficulties inherent in drafting a sidewalk solicitation registration requirement substantially outweigh any potential benefit. Parents and school officials may counsel students that they are under no obligation to accept flyers.

Alderman Kenny received communication from John Straus, 1900 block of Gigi Lane, questioning hydrant flushing during a rainstorm; he was advised hydrant flushing is done between 10:00 P.M. - 6:00 P.M as to not impact residents.
