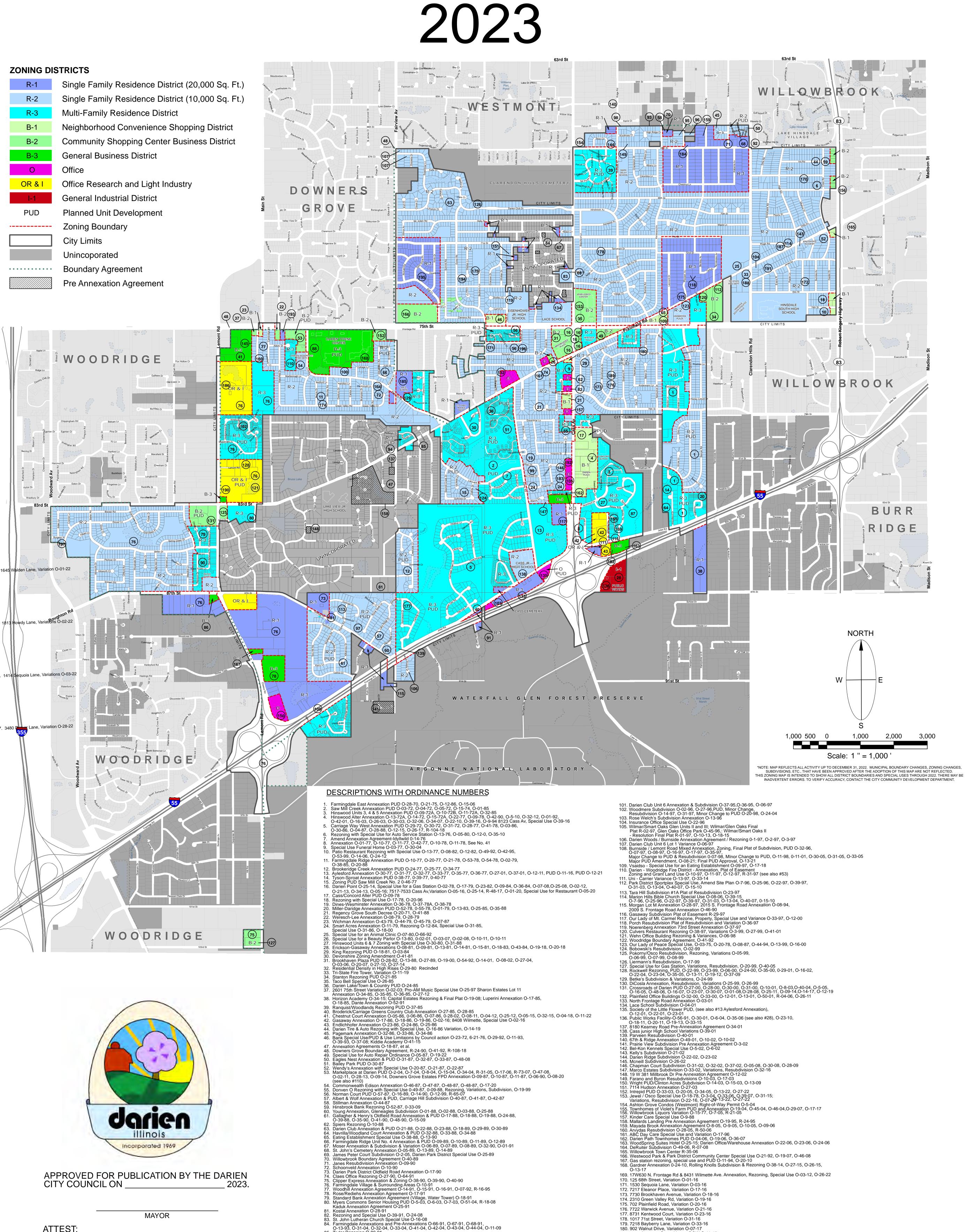
SECTION 1: That the City hereby approves the zoning map, attached as "Exhibit A".

ISSUE STATEMENT

Consideration to approve an ordinance amending the liquor code to expand the number of Class D liquor licenses from ten (10) to eleven (11) for a sale and serve liquor license at Harmi Sushi.

ORDINANCE

BACKGROUND

In 2016 the City Council passed ordinance O-12-16 amending the liquor code by periodically auditing the number of licenses in several classes so that there are no (open) licenses available that are not assigned to a particular business. The liquor licenses are updated as new requests are generated from businesses.

Mayor Marchese received a request from Harmi Sushi restaurant for a sale and serve liquor license for on-site consumption only. The license required for the request is a D License and would increase the number of D licenses from ten (10) to eleven (11). Mayor Marchese as Liquor Commissioner has indicated he supports the request.

As the applicant, I am stating that:

- (A) I have not made application for a similar or other license on the premises other than described in this application, and the disposition of such application;
- (B) I have never been convicted of a felony or a gambling offense and is not disqualified to receive a license by reason of any matter or thing contained in this chapter, the laws of this state, or the ordinances of this city;
- (C) Any liquor license by any state or subdivision thereof, or by the federal government has not been previously issued to me;
- (D) The date of formation of Harmi LLC dba Harmi is September 3, 2021. (E) This is the first request for local liquor license.
- (F) I am not delinquent in the payment of the Retailer's Occupational Tax;
- (G) I have not received or borrowed money or anything else of value, and I will not receive or borrow money or anything else of value (other than merchandising credit in the ordinary course of business) directly or indirectly, from any manufacturer, importing distributor or distributor or from any representative of any such manufacturer, importing distributor or distributor, nor be a part in any way, directly or indirectly, to any violation by a manufacturer, importing distributor or distributor of the State Liquor Control Act, this Chapter or any other Federal, State or local rules and regulations; and
- (H) I will not violate any of the laws of the State or of the United States, or any ordinance of the city in the conduct of his place of business.

3-3-7: CLASSIFICATION OF LICENSES AND FEES:

3-3-7-1: CLASS A LICENSE:

- (A) A Class A license shall authorize sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale. Provided, however, that the Commissioner may authorize the licensed premises to offer liquor samples without charge to invitees as part of a promotional or advertising program. The granting of permission to give away such liquor samples shall be within the sole discretion of the Commissioner who shall be petitioned in writing to allow such a promotional or advertising activity at least three (3) days prior to the date upon which such activity is proposed to take place. It shall be unlawful for such an advertising or promotional activity to take place without the prior permission of the Commissioner. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. (Ord. 0-03-17, 4-3-2017)
 - (C) The number of Class A licenses shall be eleven (11). (Ord. 0-12-16, 4-4-2016; amd. Ord. 0-16-20, 8-3-2020)
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class A license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-2: CLASS B LICENSE:

- (A) The Class B license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a banquet hall or similar facility (where the predominant purpose of the premises is the holding of private or limited parties or events) only for consumption on the premises of the sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating a banquet hall or similar facility on the premises. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and it shall be unlawful to serve alcoholic liquor on the premises of such facility in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and to serve alcoholic liquor on the premises of sale in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-19-03, 4-21-2003)
 - (C) The annual fee for a Class B license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
 - (D) The number of Class B licenses shall be one (1). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-3: CLASS C LICENSE:

- (A) A Class C license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor for a country club (public/semipublic/private) only for consumption on the premises of the sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating a country club on the premises. Serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar shall be allowed under a Class C license to seated customers only. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and it shall be unlawful to serve alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail and to serve alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-24-14, 7-7-2014)
 - (C) The annual fee for a Class C license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
 - (D) The number of Class C licenses shall be one (1).
- (E) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-4: CLASS D LICENSE:

- (A) A Class D license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables, provided such operation is carried on in conjunction with a restaurant operation serving a menu offering complete meals. The bar service or service at tables where a full menu is not available shall take place in a separate room from the full menu restaurant operation. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class D liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor under a Class D liquor license between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-16-13, 8-5-2013)
- (C) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
 - (D) The number of Class D licenses shall be ten (10). (Ord. 0-05-17, 4-3-2017; amd. Ord. O-06-21, 5-3-2021)
 - (E) The annual fee for a Class D license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-5: CLASS E LICENSE:

(A) A Class E license shall authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package only but not for consumption on the premises of sale. Such license shall be authorized only at such location where prepackaged food is also sold and only in such locations where there are no seats for consumption of food on the premises. (Ord. 0-18-09, 6-15-2009)

- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail any beer or wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale any beer or wine at retail in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale between the hours of one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. (Ord. 0-41-08, 11-17-2008)
 - (C) The number of Class E licenses shall be four (4). (Ord. 0-07-12, 2-21-2012; amd. Ord. 0-16-20, 8-3-2020)
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class E license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-6: CLASS F LICENSE:

- (A) A Class F license shall only authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine for consumption at tables on the premises of sale provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of serving food on the premises or on a carryout basis. Beer shall be sold only by the glass or pitcher. Wine shall be sold only by glass or carafe.
 - (B) The serving of beer or wine for consumption while seated at a counter or bar shall not be permitted under a Class F license.
- (C) Delivery of beer or wine by the license holder or his employees with carryout orders shall not be permitted under a Class F license.
- (D) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale beer or wine in conjunction with a Class F liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale beer or wine under a Class F liquor license between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of beer and wine on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.
- (E) A Class F liquor license, where issued, shall be for an establishment which caters principally to elementary aged schoolchildren and their families. Entertainment in the form of theatrical or musical presentations directed toward children and their families shall be permitted within such an establishment. The use of automatic amusement devices shall be allowed at such an establishment to the extent that they are otherwise permitted by the ordinances of the City.
 - (F) The number of Class F licenses shall be one (1).
 - (G) The annual fee for a Class F license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-7: CLASS G LICENSE:

- (A) A Class G license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package for consumption off the premises and for consumption on the premises of sale. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. and on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-22-14, 7-7-2014)
 - (C) The number of Class G licenses shall be one (1).
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class G license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-8: CLASS H LICENSE:

- (A) A Class H license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises and the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of the sale of food on a carryout basis.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (1:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
 - (C) The number of Class H licenses shall be two (2). (Ord. 0-12-17, 7-17-2017)
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class H license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-9: CLASS | LICENSE:

- (A) A Class I license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating an approved amusement premises for which all permits have been previously granted by the City Council. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer to sell at retail or serve for consumption on the premises alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., and on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-41-08, 11-17-2008)
 - (C) The number of Class I licenses shall be one (1).

(D) The annual fee for a Class I license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-10: CLASS J LICENSE:

Temporary license, daily fee.

- (A) A Class J license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption only at the location and on the specified dates designated for the special event in the license. Such temporary liquor licenses may be granted to organizations and clubs such as, but not limited to, veterans' organizations, educational, fraternal, political, civic, religious or other nonprofit organizations.
- (B) A Class J license shall be granted on a day to day basis, but not to exceed three (3) consecutive days. The Class J license shall authorize the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption only at the location until twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight on Friday and Saturday and until nine o'clock (9:00) P.M. on Sunday. An applicant for a temporary liquor license must submit with the application proof satisfactory to the Commissioner that the applicant shall provide dramshop liability insurance in the maximum limits. (Ord. 0-27-16, 8-1-2016)
 - (C) The fee for a Class J license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-11: CLASS K LICENSE:

- (A) A Class K license shall authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine for consumption on the premises of sale or at tables, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of serving food on the premises or on a carryout basis.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale beer or wine in conjunction with a Class K liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale beer or wine under a Class K liquor license between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of beer and wine on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)
- (C) The number of Class K licenses shall be three (3). (Ord. 0-24-16, 7-18-2016; amd. Ord. 0-27-19, 11-4-2019; Ord. 0-10-20, 6-15-2020)
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class K license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-12: CLASS L LICENSE:

(Rep. by Ord. 0-37-12, 10-15-2012)

3-3-7-13: CLASS M LICENSE:

- (A) A Class M license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables in premises operated by a nonprofit organization for members of the organization, their guests, and public patrons. The sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor shall be limited to the premises.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class M liquor license between eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.
 - (C) The number of Class M licenses shall be one. (Ord. 0-12-18, 5-7-2018)
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class M license shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).
- (E) All proceeds and profits made pursuant to the operation of a business activity under this license shall be for a lawful nonprofit organization. No officer or owner of any licensee under this section shall individually receive any remuneration or compensation from the business activities pursuant to this license. (Ord. 0-26-13, 10-7-2013)

3-3-7-14: CLASS N LICENSE:

- (A) A Class N license shall authorize the on premises consumption and retail sale of craft beer where the premises is that of a brewing facility. For the purposes of this subsection, "brewing facility" is defined as a place in which the primary business is the manufacturing, packaging, distribution, sale and storage of craft beer produced on the premises in compliance with Federal and State laws. The following regulations shall apply to the Class N license:
- 1. No more than a total of fifty thousand (50,000) gallons of beer shall be sold at retail in growlers, cans and/or bottles for off premises consumption per year.
 - 2. All growlers, cans and beers sold at retail for off premises consumption must be properly sealed.
- 3. Retail sales for off premises consumption and on premises consumption shall be limited to the retail portion of the licensed premises; except, however, on premises consumption may be allowed in other areas of the licensed premises during supervised tours and private events. The retail portion of the licensed premises shall not exceed three thousand (3,000) square feet.
 - 4. Product sampling shall be permitted in accordance with State law, at no charge.
- 5. Patrons under twenty one (21) years of age shall be allowed on the premises when accompanied by a person twenty one (21) years of age or older; except, however, classes and seminars on alcoholic related subjects shall only be open to patrons twenty one (21) years and older.
- 6. Live entertainment is restricted to the indoor retail portion of the premises; except, however, live entertainment may be permitted in other indoor areas of the licensed premises during private events. (Ord. 0-34-14, 11-3-2014)
- (B) It shall only be lawful to sell at retail or offer for sale at retail craft beer in conjunction with a Class N liquor license for off premises and/or on premises consumption between twelve o'clock (12:00) noon and eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M., Sunday through 11 Saturday. Except, however, private events shall not be restricted to the above hours. For private events it shall be unlawful to sell or

serve craft beer between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or serve craft beer between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours of lawful sale or service of craft beer on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-16-16, 5-16-2016)

- (C) The number of Class N licenses shall be one.
- (D) The annual fee for a Class N license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-34-14, 11-3-2014)

3-3-7-15: CLASS O LICENSE:

- (A) A Class O license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables, provided such operation is carried on in conjunction with a restaurant operation serving a menu offering complete meals. The bar service or service at tables where a full menu is not available shall take place in a separate room from the full menu restaurant operation.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class O liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor under a Class O liquor license between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.
- (C) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only.
 - (D) The number of Class O licenses shall be one.
 - (E) The annual fee for a Class O license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-21-15, 6-15-2015)

3-3-7-16: CLASS P LICENSE:

- (A) A Class P license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises and the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of the sale of food on a carryout basis.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.
 - (C) The number of Class P licenses shall be one.
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class P license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-12-17, 7-17-2017)

3-3-7-17: CLASS Q LICENSE:

- (A) A Class Q license shall authorize sale at retail wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale where the premises is a gift shop operated by a not-for-profit religious organization and for the benefit of said religious organization. Provided, however, that the Liquor Commissioner may authorize the licensed premises to offer wine tastings at up to four (4) special events per year. The granting of permission to hold such wine tastings shall be within the sole discretion of the Commissioner who shall be petitioned in writing to allow such a wine tasting at least three (3) days prior to the date upon which the wine tasting is proposed to take place. It shall be unlawful for a wine tasting to take place without the prior permission of the Commissioner.
- (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer to sell at retail any wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M.
 - (C) The number of Class Q licenses shall be one (1).
 - (D) The annual fee for a Class Q license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-28-19, 11-4-2019)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3-3-7-4(D) OF THE DARIEN CITY CODE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 3-3-7-4(D) "Class D License", as amended is hereby amended to increase the number of Class D licenses from ten (10) to eleven (11), to read as follows:

3-3-7-4: CLASS D LICENSE:

CITY ATTORNEY

(D) The number of Class D licenses shall be eleven (11).

SECTION 2: Home Rule. This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent of the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 3: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A <u>resolution</u> accepting the unit price proposal for analytical soil testing fees from Clean Soils Consulting, LLC at the proposed unit prices for certain waste for a period of May 1, 2023 through April 30, 2024.

BACKGROUND

During the year, the department generates excavated materials from various Public Works projects, such as water main breaks, valve and hydrant replacements, landscape restorations and ditching projects. On July 30, 2011, Public Act 96-1416 Clean Construction or Demolition Debris (CCDD), became law. The law required the Illinois EPA to propose rules to establish technical requirements for CCDD facilities; set operating standards for uncontaminated soil fill operations; and develop standards for the maximum allowable concentrations of chemical constituents in uncontaminated soil generated during construction or demolition activities and used as fill material.

The law affects owners and operators of CCDD facilities and uncontaminated soil fill operations as well as governmental entities, road builders, landscapers, and other contractors and excavators that deliver CCDD or uncontaminated soil generated from construction or demolition activities to CCDD facilities and uncontaminated soil fill operations.

Staff requested competitive quotes for the required analytical testing services and received two (2) competitive quote (see <u>Attachment A</u>). The lowest bid was provided by Clean Soils Consulting, LLC. The pricing is to be held in place from May 1, 2023 to April 30, 2024.

The expenditure would come from the Water, Street and Capital accounts, depending on the specific project generating the waste. The total estimated costs for all maintenance and budgetary programs for this item are \$26,000.00.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends accepting the unit price proposal for analytical soil testing fees from Clean Soils Consulting, LLC at the proposed unit prices.

CSC MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTY OR GUARANTEE, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, WARRANTIES AS TO MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS OF THE SERVICES RENDERED FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, INFRINGEMENT, COURSE OF DEALING, AND USAGE OF TRADE EQUIPMENT OR MATERIALS TO BE PROVIDED UNDER THIS PROPOSAL OR OTHERWISE. CSC shall correct any services which are not performed in accordance with this warranty at no additional charge to Client. The remedy contained in this paragraph shall be the exclusive remedy of Client with respect to any deficit of service.
- 11. Nothing contained in this proposal shall be construed or interpreted to require CSC to assume the status of Generator, or as a Storage, Treatment or Disposal facility as those terms are defined by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, 43 USC Sec 6901 et seq., as amended (hereafter referred to as RCRA), or any state statute, rule or regulation governing the generation, treatment, storage or disposal of hazardous or solid waste. By accepting this proposal, the Client acknowledges that it shall properly classify its waste and evaluate and select the proper disposal site for treatment or disposal of its waste, and shall be solely responsible therefore.

ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval of a <u>resolution</u> awarding a contract to Yellowstone Landscape Group in an amount not to exceed \$178,267.50 for the City's 2023/24 Tree Trimming and Removal Program.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The proposed tree trimming program consists of trimming approximately 1,750 parkway trees, approximately 65 tree removals and stump grinding. Below are the subdivisions to be trimmed:

- Farmingdale Village
- Woodmere Townhomes
- Tara Hill Subdivision
- Carriage Way West

- Carriage Hill
- Glen Eagles
- Darien Woods
- Waterfall Glen

This year's program includes contract pricing for the *Private Property Tree Trimming Program* to all the residents. The program would allow residents to have their private property trees trimmed or removed and stump grinding at the residents expense. The trimming includes removal of perished, diseased, interfering and weak branches, as well as removal of under branches as requested. The bid included unit prices for Private Property Tree Trimming that would be paid for directly by the residents. The bid price for the Private Property tree trimming is \$175.00 per tree in the front yard and \$300.00 per tree in the back yard. The contract also includes unit pricing for private property tree removal, and stump grinding.

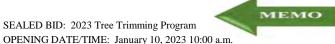

Provisions in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS unmodified by this Contract shall be in full force and effect in their unaltered condition.

SECTION 2: SCOPE OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT: The CONTRACTOR agrees to provide labor, equipment and materials necessary to provide the services as described in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and further described below:

Unit Pricing for Tree Trimming, Removals and Stump Grinding within the City of Darien and Tree Trimming, Removals and Stump Grinding for Private Properties

(Hereinafter referred to as the "WORK") and the CITY agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR

pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act (50 ILCS 505/1 et seq.) the following amount for performance of the described unit prices.

SECTION 3: ASSIGNMENT: CONTRACTOR shall not assign the duties and obligations involved in the performance of the WORK which is the subject matter of this Contract without the written consent of the CITY.

This Contract shall terminate upon completion of the WORK, but may be terminated by either of the PARTIES for default upon failure to cure after ten (10) days prior written notice of said default from the aggrieved PARTY. The CITY, for its convenience, may terminate this Contract with thirty (30) days prior written notice.

SECTION 5: INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE: The CONTRACTOR shall

indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, PARK DISTRICT, its officials, officers, directors, agents, employees and representatives and assigns, from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liability of any character, incurred due to the alleged negligence of the CONTRACTOR, brought because of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons or property on account of any act or omission, neglect or misconduct of said CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents and/or employees arising out of, or in performance of any of the provisions of the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, including any claims or amounts recovered for any infringements of patent, trademark or copyright; or from any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Act" or any other law, ordinance, order or

decree. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the CITY, its officials, officers, directors, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. The CONTRACTOR shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities. The Contractor shall not make any settlement or compromise of a lawsuit or claim, or fail to pursue any available avenue of appeal of any adverse judgment, without the approval of the City and any other indemnified party. The City or any other indemnified party, in its or their sole discretion, shall have the option of being represented by its or their own counsel. If this option is exercised, then the Contractor shall promptly reimburse the City or other indemnified party, upon written demand, for any expenses, including but not limited to court costs, reasonable attorneys' and witnesses' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by the City or other indemnified party in connection therewith. Execution of this Contract by the CITY is contingent upon receipt of Insurance Certificates provided by the CONTRACTOR in compliance with the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

SECTION 6: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The bidder shall at all times observe and comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the federal, state, local and City governments, which may in any manner affect the preparation of bids or the performance of the Contract. ISSUE STATEMENT

A <u>resolution</u> authorizing the Mayor to execute a contract extension with SKC Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$227,580 for the 2023 Crack Fill Program.

AND

A <u>resolution</u> approving a contract extension with SKC Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$15,000 for the 2023 city hall parking lot seal coating and striping.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The FY 23/24 Budget includes funds for the 2023 Crack Fill Program. Crack sealing is a routine maintenance treatment that will significantly delay roadway deterioration. The sealing material is applied into the cracks before they become too large and before the freeze-thaw cycles have an opportunity to shift the pavement and develop larger cracks (alligatoring). Flexible rubberized asphalt sealants bond to crack walls and move with the pavement, preventing water from entering the road base. The life of the road is extended and maintenance costs are greatly reduced over time.

The scope of the program includes all cracks to be routed with a low dust mechanical router to a depth of ½" and a width of approximately 3". Upon completion of the routing, all dirt, debris, and water is removed from the cracks. The method of removal is completed by utilizing a blow pipe which blows compressed air from a pull behind conventional air compressor. The crack is then filled with a rubber sealant which is feathered to a width of approximately 3-inches in width.

In 2022, the City of Darien teamed up with local public agencies which included Burr Ridge, Downers Grove, DuPage County, Elmhurst, Lombard, Villa Park, West Chicago, Wheaton, and Woodridge and solicited competitive bids, collectively. Attached and labeled as <u>Attachment A</u> is the bid results from the bid opening held by the Village of Woodridge on February 1, 2022. The list of roads scheduled for this year's program are attached and labeled as <u>Attachment B</u>. This would be the first extension of a (3) year program.

The City Hall parking lot is scheduled for sealcoating and striping this year and would be awarded to the proposed vendor at the submitted unit prices per Attachment B.

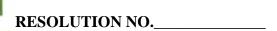

A <u>resolution</u> accepting a proposal from Rags Electric to install a backup electrical disconnect and generator plug-in at the 75th Street Pumping Station in an amount of \$11,155.

AND

A motion authorizing a contingency in the amount of \$2,000 for restoration and unforeseen work that may be required for the backup electrical disconnect.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The City's water system has the capability to flow through two incoming lines from the DuPage Water Commission transmission lines. One line is adjacent to the Plainfield Road water tower and the second line is adjacent to the pumping station located on 75th Street, fronting Home Depot. In the event of a power loss, a backup diesel generator is on standby at the Plainfield Road pumping station. That generator will run the entire plant in the event of a power loss from ComEd.

The 75th Street Pumping Station is equipped with pumps that were installed several years ago to maintain optimal system pressure for the southwest quadrant of town. The facility does not have any backup power capabilities. The proposed backup electrical switching equipment would allow for a mobile generator to be brought in, in the event additional pumps are required to satisfy water demand.

The scope of work through Rags Electric includes the following:

- Provide and install a manual 480 volt, 3 phase, 200 amp transfer switch
- Install load side of meter onto line side of switch
- Install panel feed onto load side of switch
- Wire cam locks for generator onto emergency feed of switch
- Provide conduit, cable and connectors

Rags Electric will be utilizing the equipment and hourly rate based on the 2022 Street Light Contract unit prices.

Funds for the proposed project are budgeted in the FY22/23 Budget and would be expended from the following line item:

ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval of a <u>resolution</u> authorizing the purchase of one (1) new Caterpillar Model: 305-07CR Mini Hydraulic Excavator, from ALTORFER CAT in an amount not to exceed \$90,050.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The Water Division currently utilizes a standard backhoe/loader, combination machine, for day to day excavations, backfilling and loading. Specifically, the backhoe is typically utilized to dig infrastructure from 1 foot to approximately 10 foot in depth. While the backhoe is a very versatile tool, today's underground infrastructure continues to increase and become further congested. The infrastructure includes items such as:

Private Drain Pipes

Storm Sewer Pipes

Sanitary Pipes

Com Ed Main trunks and Services

Street Light cable

Public and Private Fiber optics

AT&T Infrastructure

Comcast Infrastructure

Nicor-Mains and Services

Water Mains and Services

The above infrastructure excluding water mains and sewers are typically installed at an average depth of 7 feet, whereas other utilities are buried 18-36 inches in depth. Digging tasks particularly during a water main repair or sewer repairs with a backhoe are increasingly becoming more challenging due to the underground congestion.

During the year Staff has reviewed mini hydraulic excavators to assist in excavating with the combination machine. The Department has concluded that the optimal mini-excavator is the CAT 305-07CR Mini Hydraulic Excavator. The equipment would allow for safer excavations and mobility due to its compact size especially during water main break events. Further, the machine would allow for excavations around shallower critical utilities and provide ample room for the combination machine to assist or complete the excavation at hand. The mini excavator is a versatile machine that would be utilized in hard to navigate situations with a larger machine.

The proposed Caterpillar Model: 305-07CR Mini Hydraulic Excavator would be purchased through ALTORFER CAT See <u>Exhibit A</u>, through the Source well Purchasing Cooperative, Contract No 32119, see <u>Attachment A</u>.

While the FY22/23 Budget includes funding for the machine it will be over budget by approximately \$30,000. The City Staff has been informed that the pricing will be increasing May 1, 2023 by a minimal of 10%. The dealer has the proposed machine in their inventory and would hold for the City

until March 7, 2023. The water fund account balance has the ability to absorb the shortfall. Funds would be expended from the following account.

Our pricing model is simple. We offer a deep discount off the current machine and work tool list prices to all Sourcewell members.

We have provided base machine pricing in **Attachment F.** However, for execution of the agreement we will ask our dealers and Sourcewell members to use the Caterpillar price list that is current at the time of the quote. Dealers, in consultation with the member, will configure the machine to the desired specifications and apply the agreed upon stated minimum discount to that configured List Price amount. Dealers and members should remember to factor in any expected price increases if a machine will be built to order.

Attachment G shows the discount offered for each new machine.

Additionally, we are pleased to offer a discount of 15% off all products and consulting services under the Cat Safety Services Umbrella; and 5% off our Technology Enabled Safety Solutions.

Our discount range varies between 3% and 30%. It's important to note that discount comparisons between different machines cannot be considered an apple-to-apples comparison. Caterpillar product managers have broad leeway in product pricing, and there are some significant variations on pricing strategy. For example, a discount of 10% on Product A, may be equivalent to a 20% discount on Product B. The discounts offered to Sourcewell members are better than what is widely available to non-member/private purchasers.

Customers and dealers are responsible for including their Sourcewell member numbers on all documentation related to these purchases. Caterpillar Inc. is not a party to these sales and is exempted from including them in the quarterly reports. For audits, inclusion of a customer's Sourcewell member number on the PO and/or invoice shall be deemed sufficient.

Machines are unique in their requirements for preparation prior to use. Some may require local final assembly due to their large size, others may have locally installed options (fire suppression, beacons, auto lube systems for example). When a dealer issues a quote for a machine, any additional costs will be itemized separately and are not subject to the Sourcewell discount.

There is no additional cost to members who choose to pick up their machine from the Cat dealer. Dealers may charge fees for delivery to the member's location.

We plan to continue our very robust process to ensure reporting speed, accuracy, and contract compliance.

Caterpillar and our Cat dealers have very close and trusting relationships. Our dealers are long-established, and the current process is working well.

- To ensure pricing accuracy, we maintain our current Sourcewell customer discount sheet on our dealerfacing pricing pages. Dealers integrate these numbers automatically in their quoting software.
- To ensure new machine and work tool sales are recorded properly, we use our post-sale credit system. In a nutshell, this means that we corporately support the pricing offered in this contract at a level below what's available to other customers. To receive this additional monetary support after the machine is delivered, dealers must supply the member's name, address, and member number. There is no additional burden or cost to our dealers to use the Sourcewell contract and this is part of the reason for their high engagement and our high reporting accuracy.
- After month end, we gather the new machine and work tool sales data attributed to Sourcewell and aggregate it for our reporting.
- After quarter end, we will send the quarterly sales report and administration fee payment to Sourcewell
 for all items that are subject to the administrative fee.

For customers who retain maintenance responsibilities, we have several tools available to facilitate that. As an example, My.Cat.Com makes it easy for customers to access critical information about their fleet.

STARTER CONNECTIVITY: If the customer purchases a machine with a factory-installed Product Link device, the customer will receive Cat Daily connectivity at no cost (for seven years on Building Construction Products machines; 12 years on Global Construction & Infrastructure machines). Cat Daily provides basic information once per day via My.Cat.Com or via a mobile app as described below.

My.Cat.Com users have access to:

- Equipment location
- Hours
- Diagnostic and operational events
- Fuel burn
- Dealer work orders
- Parts lists and Preventive Maintenance Checklists
- Parts ordering
- Safety service letters
- Rental documentation
- Warranty information

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- Operation and maintenance manuals
- Preventive maintenance alerts and scheduling
- Cat Inspect outcomes
- S-O-S fluid analysis results

A subset of this information is also available in the Cat App: Fleet Management (IOS and Android).

In some situations, information available through My.Cat.Com provides an agency with sufficient data. But sometimes the equipment manager/public works director wants a more comprehensive view of their assets and/or the ability to manage an entire fleet. To meet that need, Caterpillar offers VisionLink—a powerful, flexible platform with enhanced capabilities, like customizable reports and notifications, that makes it easier to optimize productivity, manage assets and reduce costs.

ADVANCED CONNECTIVITY TRIAL: For any construction machine with a Product Link device, the customer will receive a six-month complimentary VisionLink Essentials trial. After the trial period ends, customers may elect to continue access at several different levels:

- VisionLink Daily offers convenient, affordable, once-a-day telematics information. Ideal for customers who only need once-per-day reporting
- VisionLink Basic provides basic asset management features including hour and location monitoring as well as geographic fencing and maintenance management. Recommended for machines that only report hours, where data updates and related features are needed more frequently than once per day.
- VisonLink Essentials includes all the features of Basic plus health, utilization, and productivity
 features with frequent data updates. Ideal for customers needing up-to-date information about site
 operations, productivity, asset location, and operator performance, as well as timely notification of
 issues as they occur.

Another free app we offer is designed to help customers focus on safety and preventive maintenance. The "Cat Inspect" app offers multiple features geared to make regular machine inspections simple and useful.

- Daily Walkaround inspections are designed primarily for operators who are guided where to look on their particular machine and allows them to document and report any abnormalities.
- Preventive Maintenance inspections are more in-depth and are designed for customer or dealer technicians to inspect components for signs of wear and to ensure that all recommended preventive maintenance procedures are completed and recorded.
- Technical Analysis inspections are the most in-depth and are normally used once per year or when a machine is at the end of a customer's ownership period.

This app includes the ability to take pictures, make notes and complete and share inspections electronically. Inspection reports are also integrated into both My.Cat.Com and VisionLink, providing visibility to overall fleet health.

For customers who intend to rely on dealers for maintenance, they can schedule the work themselves as needed, or we propose a variety of CSAs (Customer Support Agreements). These are completely customizable, but we offer starting points for several levels with corresponding price points which vary by product.

- Total maintenance and repair agreement the Cat dealer covers service and maintenance for any one piece of equipment or the entire fleet. This agreement can include guaranteed availability and uptime.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A <u>resolution</u> authorizing the purchase of the Phase 1-Leak Logger Program, consisting of fifty-two leak logger units from Gutermann Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$58,965.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The proposed leak detection system would be utilized by the Water Division to proactively locate and pinpoint leaks while they are small. The detectors, (loggers) are placed in water vaults and/or hydrant auxiliary valves. The loggers detect leaks through sound waves. When a leak occurs, the sound will amplify from the pipe and the adjacent area. As the detection state changes, a water sensor will be awakened on the radio and send data to a wireless gateway. Through a correlation process the loggers calculate the origin of the leak and process the information through the Gutermann I-Cloud gateway service. The cloud-based technology than sends an alert to a monitoring app on a mobile device or desktop application.

This program will also eliminate the need to outsource leak locating services at a cost of approximately \$15,000-\$20,000 per year. The loggers will provide monitoring 24 hours per day 365 days a year. The program will have hosting costs after the initial five years, see attached sheet labeled as **Attachment A**.

This program is considered Phase 1 of 3 and is budgeted over a three-year program, pending budget considerations. The cost of the entire program will be approximately \$616,000 with reoccurring costs after the initial five years of each phase. As stated in the attached email, the pricing will be good for the entire project, see Attachment B. A further evaluation on the the return on investment throughout each phase was calculated and the program would pay for itself in 2.25 to 2.5 years. The reoccurring costs would be budget beginning 2027/2028. Please see Attachment A, summarizing the phases and costs.

Staff reviewed leak logger manufacturers and contacted municipalities that have deployed such systems. Upon review, it was determined that two vendors would meet the needs for the City of Darien. As additional information, $\underline{\textbf{Attachment C}}$ is technical information regarding the system.

Staff had solicited quotes for the leak loggers and received the following competitive quotes:

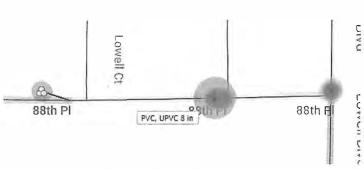

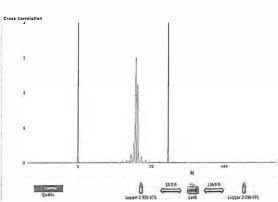

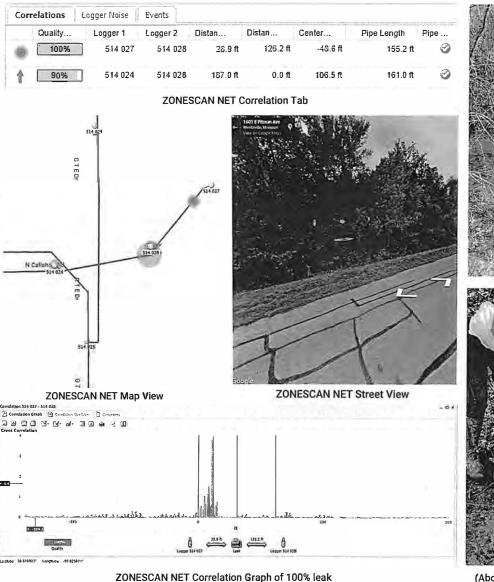

With the cost of equipment, and liberal estimates of man power hours, Wentzville's return on investment for finding the two leaks in question was over \$73,000.

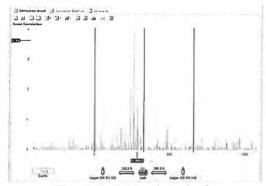

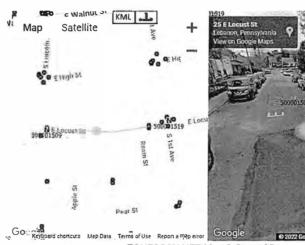

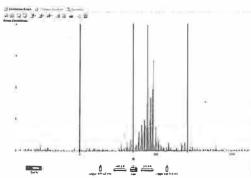

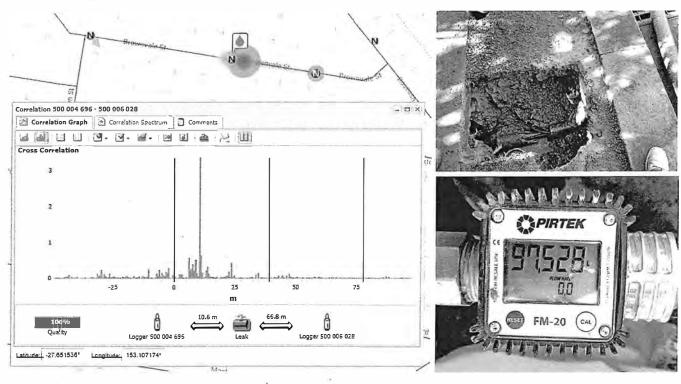

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the existing roof at the Public Works facility is approximately 40 years in age and requires maintenance. He reported that the proposed work includes a review of the existing deck material, limited replacement of the roof deck as identified, application of the Liquid Applied Elastomeric Roofing System. He further reported that additional work consists of waterproofing all protrusions and parapet walls adjacent to the roof deck with the re-roof system covered under a 5-year workmanship guarantee and a 12-year prorated material warranty.

Alderman Eric Gustafson asked if staff was confident in the work.

Alderman Joe Kenny questioned this process versus a roofing company.

Mr. Gombac reported that the other quote was a conventional sheeting and more money and based on the pricing and the warranty that this process can be done two times at a much lower cost. He reported that they would like to start the work in February weather permitting.

Alderman Gustafson made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Kenny approval of a Resolution to accept a proposal from M&M Home Remodeling Services for the material and installation of the Liquid Applied Elastomeric Roofing System for a re-roof project at the Public Works Facility, 1041 S Frontage Road in an amount not to exceed \$51,500.

s. Resolution – Authorizing the Mayor to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Darien and the Flagg Creek Reclamation District (FCWRD) for the discontinuance of City water service due to non-payment of sanitary charges.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the City is serviced by three sanitary districts, DuPage County Sanitary District, Downers Grove Sanitary District and Flagg Creek Water Reclamation District (FCWRD). He reported that Flagg Creek serves fifty-four residents adjacent to 67th Street, between Clarendon Hills Rd and Cass Ave. and that the City has an IGA in place with the County to read the City's meters and bill residents.

Mr. Gombac reported that the County forwards FCWRD the water consumption for the fifty-four residents and FCWRD forwards them an invoice. He reported that the sanitary districts do not have any mechanical means to terminate a sanitary service with the exception of an excavation within a City right of way and that the typical protocol is that the municipality would terminate the water service for the respective sanitary district until the financial obligation is resolved.

Mr. Gombac reported that while the City has an ordinance to terminate water service, there are no provisions to terminate water service for lack of sanitary payment. He reported that recently the FCWRD has requested the City to terminate water service due to non-payment of the sanitary charges and the City was unable to accommodate. He further reported that the FCWRD has requested an IGA, which would allow the City to terminate water service due to lack of payment for sanitary charges.

Chairperson Tom Belczak questioned if the notification protocol to shut off the water was the same as the other utilities.

Mr. Gombac reported that the protocol was the same.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Kenny made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Gustafson approval of Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Darien and the Flagg Creek Reclamation District (FCWRD) for the discontinuance of City water service due to non-payment of sanitary charges.

Upon voice vote, the MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY 3-0.

t. Minutes - November 28, 2022 Municipal Services Committee

Alderman Gustafson made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Belczak approval of the November 28, 2022, Municipal Services Committee Meeting Minutes.

Upon voice vote, the MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY 2-0. Alderman Kenny abstained.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported on the upcoming storm and stated that with the frigid conditions that staff will be doing some deicing following snow removal on a few streets to see if it is beneficial.

Alderman Eric Gustafson suggested adding something in Direct Connect asking residents to not blow snow into the streets.

Chairperson Tom Belczak announced that the next meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 23, 2023.
