Planning Overview/Discussion

Our Lady of Peace is in the process of reconstructing their parking lot, including relocating driveway entrances, incorporating landscape islands and new parking lot lighting. As part of those improvements, the church proposes installing a new sign along Plainfield Road.

The Sign Code exempts ground signs for religious institutions from a permit as long as the sign complies with the Sign Code. Such signs are limited to 32 square feet in area.

The proposed sign is 40 square feet, with an electronic message board. Electronic message board signs are not permitted.

The sign height and location comply. The Sign Code requires landscaping at the base of the sign, extending 4 feet out from the base, to be verified at final inspection.

To be consistent with previous approvals, staff offers the following conditions:

- 1. Messages will be held for 3-10 seconds.
- 2. Messages will change all at once.
- 3. Messages may display multiple colors.
- 4. Illumination will maintain a constant light intensity or brightness.
- 5. Illumination brightness will comply with the Sign Code, to be verified at time of sign permit issuance.

Per Section 4-3-18 of the Sign Code, the following shall be considered:

- 1. The available locations for adequate signage on the property.
- 2. The effect of the proposed sign on pedestrian and motor traffic.
- 3. The cost to the applicant in complying with the Sign Code as opposed to the detriment, if any, to the public from granting of the variation.
- 4. If undue hardships and practical difficulties result in complying with the Sign Code and if these hardships are a result of previous actions of the applicant.
- 5. The general intent of the Sign Code.

Section 4-3-2 of the Sign Code provides the general intent of the Sign Code:

This sign code is adopted for the following purposes:

- 1. To promote and protect the public health, safety, comfort, morals, convenience and general welfare of the residents of the City.
- 2. To enhance the physical appearance of the City by preserving the scenic and natural beauty of the area.
- 3. To promote the safety and recreational value of public travel.

- 4. To protect the public investment in streets and highways by reducing sign or advertising distractions that may increase traffic accidents.
- 5. To ensure compatibility of signs with surrounding land uses.
- 6. To enhance the economy of the City by promoting the reasonable, orderly and effective display of outdoor advertising.
- 7. To protect the pedestrians and motorists within the City from damage or injury caused by distractions, obstructions and hazards created by a proliferation of off-site advertising signs.
- 8. To prevent the proliferation of off-site advertising signs which distract from the development of the City in an aesthetically pleasing manner.
- 9. To preserve the character of the City which is a single-family residential community by assuring the compatibility of signs with the surrounding land uses.

Staff Findings/Recommendations

Staff finds the proposed sign an improvement over the existing sign, which includes a manual changeable copy message board. The proposed variation will not affect pedestrian and motor traffic and meets the general intent of the Sign Code by enhancing the economy of the City by promoting reasonable, orderly and effective display of signage.

Staff recommends the Commission make the following recommendation to approve the variation petition subject to conditions:

<u>Planning and Zoning Commission Review - August 5, 2015</u>

The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this matter on August 5, 2015. The following members were present: Beverly Meyer – Chairperson, Andrew Kelly, Ronald Kiefer, John Laratta, John Lind, Louis Mallers, Raymond Mielkus, Pauline Oberland, Kenneth Ritzert, Michael Griffith – Senior Planner and Elizabeth Lahey – Secretary.

Michael Griffith, Senior Planner, reviewed the agenda memo. He noted the recommended conditions of approval for the electronic message board.

Andy Heinen, Kimley Horn and Associates, described the proposed sign. He stated they did not object to staff's recommended conditions of approval for the electronic message board. He noted the existing sign is 48 square feet and the proposed sign is 40 square feet. He stated there will be landscaping around the sign base. He noted there are commercial signs on the same side of Plainfield Road with residential across the street, similar to Chuck's Café on Cass Avenue, noting they also have an electronic message board sign.

Commissioner Kelly asked if the new sign would be brighter.

Mr. Heinen stated yes, but it would comply with the City's Sign Code.

No one from the public offered comments.

Commissioner's Laratta, Kiefer and Oberland stated they found the proposed sign to be acceptable.

Without further discussion, Commissioner Laratta made the following motion seconded by Commissioner Kiefer:

Based upon the submitted petition and the information presented, the request associated with PZC 2015-11 is in conformance with the standards of the Darien City Code and, therefore, I move the Planning and Zoning Commission recommend approval of the petition subject to the following conditions:



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



Planning Overview/Discussion

The subject property is directly east of the City's Municipal Services Facility on S. Frontage Road, east of Cass Avenue. The property has been vacant for several years. Previously, it was used as a drop yard for semi-trailers.

Currently, on the property, there is a building at the north end of the property with the bulk of the property covered with stone (aggregate) where trailers were stored.

The proposed site plan a new building housing the shop, warehouse, and showroom/office support and a smaller office building. The bulk of the site will be stone (aggregate) for storing semi-trailers.

The proposed uses are summarized below:

- a. Garage for repairing, servicing trucks, trailers related to transport refrigeration, standby vehicle generators, cellular communications equipment, maintenance, body repair, painting and engine building. *Special use*.
- b. Retail sales of related equipment and parts. Text amendment
- c. Warehouse for distribution of related equipment and parts.
- d. Drop yard for trailers.
- e. Limited freight terminal. Special use.
- f. Cartage and express facility.
- g. Accessory outdoor storage. Special use.
- h. Office functions related to above uses.

The proposed site plan essentially maintains the current layout of the property. The variations requested primarily note existing conditions.

The landscape plan provides landscaping along the frontage of the property, meeting the required landscaping requirements. Landscape islands within the parking lot should show at least 1 shade tree and 16 shrubs. Adjacent properties are either Forest Preserve or the City's Municipal Services Facility. Therefore, staff does not find the need to require landscaping to the south of

the building given the uses on adjacent properties.

The building elevation drawing shows the following exterior predominately precast concrete.

The petitioner needs to provide signage details, specifically, the pole sign, since they are seeking variations related to sign height and area.

A small area of floodplain extends onto the east side of the property. The petitioner is working with the U.S. Army Core of Engineers and DuPage County to confirm jurisdiction over the wetlands. Assuming DuPage County has jurisdiction, DuPage County is required to certify the plans comply with floodplain/wetland regulations before the City can issue a permit for construction.

The City Engineer reviewed the plans. Stormwater water management, detention, is an issue yet to be resolved. Staff hopes to have an update on this matter at the meeting, see letter from Dan Lynch, PE, Christopher B. Burke, dated July 21, 2015.

Staff Findings/Recommendations

Staff will provide a recommendation at the meeting.

Planning and Zoning Commission Review - August 5, 2015

The Planning and Zoning Commission considered this matter on August 5, 2015. The following members were present: Beverly Meyer – Chairperson, Andrew Kelly, Ronald Kiefer, John Laratta, John Lind, Louis Mallers, Raymond Mielkus, Pauline Oberland, Kenneth Ritzert, Michael Griffith – Senior Planner and Elizabeth Lahey – Secretary.

Michael Griffith, Senior Planner, reviewed the agenda memo. He summarized the proposed uses and variations being requested, noting most of the variations related to existing conditions. He stated the proposed development plan is essentially the same current layout of the property.

He noted summarized the letter of objection dated August 5, 2015, from the DuPage County Forest Preserve District and noted a petition was submitted with two names on it objecting to the proposed use.

Bill Fritz, IAE, President/COO, described the company and proposed Darien facility. He stated the Darien facility will handle their transport refrigeration and distribution activities. He stated they sell and service Thermo King transport refrigeration units. He stated they plan to sell related parts. He stated this facility will have about 50 employees. He stated they value a clean, orderly operation both for their employees and customer benefit. He stated this site is ideal due to the frontage and access to I-55.

He stated they have organized their check-in procedures and site plan to make sure trucks are not sitting on S. Frontage road. He described where trucks enter/leave the site, noting the driveway

locations.

There was a question as to who had jurisdiction on the roadway.

He stated they plan to sub-lease a portion of their property for a trailer drop yard.

He introduced the IAE team:

Doug Caley, Director of Facilities

Robert Stearns, Manager, Central Avenue facility.

Paul Cohan, Principle Construction Corp., construction manager.

Chairperson Meyer asked about hours of operation.

Mr. Fritz stated: Monday – Friday: 7am – 11:30pm

Saturday: 7am - 3:30pm.

He stated there will be some 24-hour activity to handle emergencies where they send a mobile unit to service a stalled truck or piece of equipment.

Commissioner Laratta asked who is responsible for the operation and maintaining the leased area.

Mr. Fritz stated they are responsible for maintaining the property.

Commissioner Kiefer asked about fuel storage.

Mr. Stearns stated they store off-road diesel not motor fuel diesel.

Commissioner Mallers stated it seemed this was essentially the same use as before.

There was a question about trucks staying overnight with engines running. Mr. Stearns stated typically trucks are not parked overnight. He stated there may be a few CR England trucks parked overnight but most likely they will run their generators to heat/cool the truck cabin and not run the engines.

There was a question about security. Mr. Caley stated the entire site is surrounded by a fence and there is closed circuit TV.

Commissioners Lind and Oberland stated the modular building, the leased out space, should tie into the main building. Commissioner Oberland stated there are inexpensive ways to make the buildings coordinate.

Mr. Cohan stated they could accommodate that concern.

Commissioner Lind asked if the loading dock could be moved to the cast side of building.

Mr. Cohan stated the site is constrained by wetlands and that they want to maximize the bulk of the property for trailers. It was noted they receive 3 shipments per week on average. Mr. Lind was fine with that response.

Commissioner Lind asked if screening could be considered along the east side of the property to better screen property from the Frontage Road. Mr. Cohan stated there is landscaping and screening along the frontage of the property.

Commissioner Ritzert asked about noise from repairs.

Mr. Stearns stated equipment repairs occur inside the building, with the service bay doors on the backside of the building. It was noted the noise from I-55 would likely be louder than their operations.

Commissioner Mielkus asked about paint spraying.

Mr. Caley stated there is not painting.

Doug Echner, Timber Lakes, stated his concern about underground fuel storage and with increased traffic on Frontage Road also used by bikers.

Joe Kremper, Lorraine, stated he is opposed to use, noting property is next to the Forest Preserve. Stated his concern with trucks managing the curved roads, hazardous materials, noise, lighting stating the chain link fence is ugly, opposed to 24-hour operation and light.

Larraine Leong, Timber Lakes, stated her concern with increased traffic and pollution, stated the variations are contrary to the City's Code.

Linda Painter, Timber Lakes, and Forest Preserve Commissioner, stated they are requesting too many variations. She stated the setback along Forest Preserve property should meet requirements, three entrances of Frontage Road is dangerous. She stated should go east as there is a weight restriction on those roads. She stated the pole sign and lighting will be offensive. She stated there should be more landscaping. She stated the outdoor storage will be offensive, further concerned with run-off and noise.

Ms. Painter read the letter dated August 5, 2015, from the Forest Preserve.

Steve Delurgio, Timber Lake, stated the property should be used for parking only. He stated is objection to 24-hour operation, concerned with light pollution, stated use changes character of the property, wants to see a solid fence around the site.

William VanDam, Timber Lake, stone surface should be a hard surface instead to eliminate dust, concerned with no perimeter landscaping.

Richard Rons, 89th Place, land should be residential instead of industrial, stating homes would be a better use.

William Mars, Timber Lake, stated his concerns about noise and light.

Mike Webster, Timber Lake, stated school buses use S. Frontage Road.

Bill Fritz responded to resident comments, noted they do not tow stall trucks/trailers to their location they instead send out a mobile unit to service the equipment. He stated it is not typical for trucks to be parked on the property over night with engines running, they would use their ontruck generators instead.

The Commission expressed concern about S. Frontage Road being able to handle truck traffic, with wetland and stormwater management comments not yet addressed, the modular building should tie into the main building aesthetically.

There was a motion to recommend denial based on not having a traffic study (motion made by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Mallers). However, the motion failed by a 2-7 vote. Several Commission members stated they were not ready to make a decision either way and the petitioner should be given an opportunity to return with additional information.

Without further discussion, Commissioner Ritzert made a motion to continue the item to give the petitioner time to address comments and concerns raised by residents and the Commission, including a traffic study, wetland and roadway jurisdiction, Commissioner Kiefer seconded the motion.

Upon a roll call vote, THE MOTION CARRIED by a vote of 9-0.

Planning and Zoning Commission Review - August 19, 2015

The petitioner provided additional information based on comments at the August 5, 2015, Planning and Zoning Commission meeting, including a traffic study, drawings of the modular building and pole sign.

Variation approval criteria:

- 1. Whether the general character of the property will be adversely altered.
- 2. Whether the overall value of the property will be improved and there will not be any potential adverse effects on the neighboring properties.
- 3. Whether the alleged need for the variation has been created by any person presently having a proprietary interest in the premises.

- 4. Whether the proposed variation will impair an adequate supply of light and air in adjacent property, substantially increase congestion in the public streets, increase the danger of fire or endanger the public safety.
- 5. Whether the proposed variation will adversely alter the essential character of the neighborhood.

Special Use approval criteria:

- 1. That the special use is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location specified.
- 2. That the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the special use will not be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare.
- 3. That the special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.
- 4. That the establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
- 5. That the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of any proposed structure will not be a variation with either the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of the structures already constructed or in the course of construction in the immediate neighborhood or the character of the applicable district, as to cause a substantial depreciation in the property values within the neighborhood.
- 6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
- 7. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
- 8. That the special use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the City Council pursuant to the recommendations of the planning and Zoning Commission and the Planning and Development Committee.

Sign Code variation criteria:

- 1. The available locations for adequate signage on the property.
- 2. The effect of the proposed sign on pedestrian and motor traffic.

As requested by email on August 12, 2015, we have reviewed the response to our July 21, 2015 letter as prepared by Spaceco, Inc. and dated August 12, 2015. As you know, Spaceco is an affiliate company of Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL). Based on the information provided on the preliminary plan, the development will not trigger a requirement to provide additional stormwater detention or water quality infrastructure, but they will be required to maintain the existing stormwater improvements on the site. This has been acknowledged, as have our other comments on the preliminary plan. The following item should be noted:

 We understand that the City will require the applicant to extend a sanitary service to their west property line for future connection of the Public Works Building. This will likely necessitate that a portion of the sewer be public, but we will defer to DuPage County, who owns the sewer.

Exhibit 'A'

Variance Request:

- 1. We are requesting a reduction of pavement setback from 30' to 10' and 17' at the south and east property lines respectively. The adjacent property to the south and east is the Waterfall Glen Forest Preserve. However, the County maps list the property as a residential use which would require a 30' pavement setback. It is our understanding that this property will remain undeveloped as a Forest Preserve. Additionally, the existing aggregate surface is as close as 5'-0" and 7'-0" to the south and east property lines respectively.
- 2. We are requesting that the pavement setback be changed to 5' along the west property line. The existing aggregate surface is as close as 4'-0" to the west property line. The adjacent west property is currently occupied by the Village of Darien Public Works Building and would require a 20' pavement setback. In order to accommodate the required quantity of trailer, tractor stalls and maneuvering clearances a 5' pavement setback is required by the user.
- 3. We are requesting to leave the existing stone aggregate on the south 'private' portion of the site. The majority of the south portion of the existing lot is stone aggregate. The north 'public' portion of the site, most visible from S. Frontage Rd. and used by the public, would be paved with asphalt or concrete paving. If the entire site were required to be paved, the cost along with the additional requirement for storm water detention would make the project economically infeasible.
- 4. We are requesting that the existing non-conforming impervious site area which exceeds the total impervious site area requirement be allowed to be maintained. Due to the unique nature of the user which requires a certain amount of tractor and trailer stalls, the required pervious surface area cannot be accommodated.
- 5. We are requesting that three driveway entrances be provided with the driveway separations indicated on our site plan. Three main entry drives are required to provide the needed vehicular flow for the users operations.
- 6. We are requesting that the loading dock be located in the front of the building. Landscape screening will be provided to minimize the visibility of the loading dock. Due to the unique nature of the user which requires a certain amount of tractor and trailer stalls, the recessed loading dock needs to be located on the north side of the building.
- 7. We are requesting the ability to use an 8' high chain link fence without any solid portions along the south east and west property lines. Zoning requires that a percentage of the fence be solid. Since the

adjacent property to the south and east is the Waterfall Glen Forest Preserve, there are no adjacent users that will be affected.

- 8. We are requesting the ability to install a pole mounted illuminated sign which is $12' \text{ W} \times 12' \text{ H} = 144$ SF and 57' H (overall sign height). The sign will be located at the northeast corner of the property providing our client maximum visibility and business identification along the I-55 interstate corridor. The size and location of the sign proposed provides business identification allowing for a reasonable amount of reaction time to potential customers driving at high rates of speed along I-55 from the east and the west so that they can react to and exit at the next available interstate exit. The current zoning / code does not allow for a pole mounted sign on our site. Due to the specific nature of our clients operation a pole mounted sign is necessary to provide business identification along the I-55 corridor.
- 9. We are requesting a variance from the requirement for planting and landscape materials along the south rear yard and the east interior side yard. These areas are presently devoid of landscaping and are immediately adjacent to the Waterfall Glen Forest Preserve. There are no adjacent users that will be affected and these areas will remain as undeveloped land. Additionally, we are requesting a variance from the requirements for planting and landscape materials along the corner side yard adjacent to the west property which is currently occupied by the Village of Darien Public Works Building. Since we address a variance request in item #2 above for a pavement setback along this area, we feel that a similar variance request for planting and landscape materials in this area is a direct function of this request.

Special Use Request:

- #1. We are requesting a special use consideration to allow for outdoor storage on-site. The outdoor storage area will be located south of the proposed building and will be enclosed on the north side with solid fencing in order to provide a visual block from the public way along S. Frontage Rd.
- #2. We are requesting a special use consideration to allow for garage storage, repair and or servicing of motor vehicles, including body repair, painting and engine rebuilding. These services are integral part of our client's business model and a part of the proposed plan for this particular site.
- #3. We are requesting a special use consideration to allow for a portion of our site, (private) along the south and west property lines to be used as a freight terminal. This service is a component of our client's business model and a service which they provide to their customers and is part of the proposed plan for this particular site.

Tax Amendment:

#1. We are requesting a tax amendment be provided to our client for retail sales in the I-1 zoning district as this is an integral part of our client's business model and part of the proposed plan for this particular site.

Illinois Auto Central Thermo King (IACTK) is a factory authorized sales and service dealer for Thermo King, the world leader in transport temperature control and auxiliary power units.

Illinois Auto Central and Thermo King's daily operation revolves around two main components, our shop operation with warehouse and office support staff and there is also a small modular office and truck yard that we lease to our customer CR England. We adhere to a strict set of high standards in keeping our facilities clean and safe. Honesty and fair service are integral parts of who we are.

Illinois Auto Central Thermo King

The way this site plan is designed to work, is that our customers will enter our site from the frontage road and enter onto the center driveway. This center driveway leads into our check-in/inspection area. At this point we evaluate our customers' needs and direct them to a designated location for the services to be completed. Once services are completed, the driver will exit our site through the east driveway.

Our shop is located adjacent to our office and warehouse support staff. The shop consists of nine service bays, fuel-island, wash bay, and roughly 30 mechanics over three shifts. Within our office area, we will have a retail showroom for customers to view and purchase related parts and accessories (retail sales). This space will also include private offices, conference rooms, lunchroom, restrooms, a service and parts counter and a customer waiting lounge.

After reviewing my notes, bullet points from the PZC meeting last night:

Commission:

- West building elevation to tie into main building.
 - O A preliminary rendering of the West building elevation will be submitted on Monday 8/17/2015. The façade of this West building will be aesthetically pleasing and will complement the design of the East building. The size of this building is still up for review and subject to change based upon needs.
- Commission concerned that vehicle repair language from Zoning Ordinance is too broad, seemed to want it better defined as to what is being approved.
 - IAC is asking for the special use "To permit a garage for storage, repair and servicing of motor vehicles, including body repair, painting and engine rebuilding within the I-1 General Industrial zoning district, Zoning Ordinance Section 5A-9-4-4."
- Traffic study, mainly whether S. Frontage Road and intersection with Cass Ave. can accommodate semi-truck traffic.
 - IAC is working with KLOA a traffic and transportation / engineering firm to complete a traffic evaluation study. This traffic evaluation study will be submitted to the City of Darien on Monday 8/17/2015 for review.
- Stormwater management not resolved.
 - This development will meet all of the applicable codes with regard to storm water management. This project will be required to meet the DuPage County Stormwater Ordinance. We have prepared preliminary plans and met with the City of Darien and DuPage

- County to review the stormwater detention, wetlands, and floodplain aspects of the project. Both Darien and DuPage County have given us positive feedback regarding the preliminary plans. No variances to the stormwater, wetlands, or floodplain requirements are being requested by the petitioner.
- August 12, 2015, SPACECO Engineers submitted a response to the City of Darien related to the review of preliminary plans performed by Christopher B. Burke Engineers on July 21, 2015 (subject: Illinois Auto Central: 1033-1035 S. Frontage Road, CBBEL Project No. 950323H1840). These letters will be submitted to the City of Darien on Monday 8/17/2015 to be included with the submittal.

Dress up fence screening along front.

o IAC looked at various options in gates to provide the best functionality, security and screening. All gates previously were a barrier style similar to a toll booth arm. After further review, IAC has decided to install a slide gate on East exit, a slide gate at the center inspection entry/exit and a swing gate at the West entry/exit. These gates and the front fence will have limited to no opacity.

Retail Sales

o In regards to your request, below is a summary of the annual retail sales for the years 2012 through 2014 along with what the one percent portion of the sales tax that the city of Darien would have received from these retail sales.

Residents (unincorporated):

- Traffic. Increased traffic, traffic from semi-trucks, trucks along with bike riders, school buses and other motorists on S. Frontage Road will increase accidents. Trucks not able to make turns/curves from Cass Avenue.
 - o IAC is working with KLOA a traffic and transportation / engineering firm to complete a traffic evaluation study. This traffic evaluation study will be submitted to the City of Darien on Monday 8/17/2015 for review.
- Noise from truck traffic, engines running, refrigeration units running outdoors and overnight, repair activities. (IAE testimony: CR England truckers [sub-leased area] may park their truck overnight, most likely running their generators and not engines.)
 - o IAC is working with Optimum Safety Management who conducted a noise assessment at the property on 8/13/2015 and 8/14/2015 to support the intended development. This report will be provided to the City of Darien on Monday 8/17/2015 for review.
 - o The types of noise that will be generated at this facility include:
 - Fork Lifts, Semi-Trucks, truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems running, auxiliary power units, truck and trailer repair.
 - o IAC plans to run 3 shifts at this site:
 - Shift 1 Start time 7:00am, end time 3:30pm
 - 65% of the service work is performed between 7:00am and 3:30pm. During this time the operations include sales and service of truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems, auxiliary power units along with truck and trailer repair. Between these hours we have service advisors, office and warehouse staff to support these functions. There will be roughly 28 employees supporting this operation during this time.

- Shift 2 Start time 3:00pm, end time 11:30pm
 - 30% of service work will be performed between 3:30pm and 11:30am. During this time the operations include sales and service of truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems, auxiliary power units along with truck and trailer repair. Between these hours we have service advisors and limited warehouse staff to support these functions. There will be roughly 8 employees supporting this operation during this time.
- Shift 3 Start time 11:00pm, end time 7:30am
 - 5% of service work will be performed between 11:00am and 7:30am. During this time the operations include service of truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems and emergency call outs to provide remote service for customers off-site. No other support staff other than mechanics are on hand during this time. There will be roughly 3 employees supporting this operation during this time.
- o Regarding the CR England activities, this location will be used to manage a portion of their Chicagoland fleet trucks and trailers. These trucks are day cab trucks without sleepers or generators, they are not left running when not in use. 60% of the CR England traffic observed on 8/10/2015 were trucks only without a trailer entering and exiting. Because they operate within the Chicagoland area, when their drivers have completed their shift they park their truck onsite, shut it down and leave until the next day.
- Light pollution.
 - o Site lighting will comply with the local ordinance. Shields will be installed where required.
- Fuel storage, refrigerant storage, hazardous materials.
 - o Any fuel storage, refrigerant storage or hazardous material storage will be handled with the appropriate permits and inspection to meet jurisdictional requirements.
 - o IAC currently maintains a 15,000 gallon underground storage tank (UST) at the existing Chicago facility. IAC plans to install a similar tank at this site while following the appropriate permits and inspections to meet the jurisdictional requirements.
- 24-hour operation (IAE testimony: late night/overnight activities are mostly IAC going off-site
 to stalled truck for emergency repairs of refrigeration units).
 - o It is IAC's intent to have a 24-hour service operation. IAC will respect all zoning requirements related to the zoning ordinance affecting this development and use.
 - o IAC plans to run 3 shifts at this site:
 - Shift 1 Start time 7:00am, end time 3:30pm
 - 65% of the service work is performed between 7:00am and 3:30pm. During this time the operations include sales and service of truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems, auxiliary power units along with truck and trailer repair. Between these hours we have service advisors, office and warehouse staff onsite to support these functions. There will be roughly 28 employees supporting this operation.
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 - Shift 3 Start time 11:00pm, end time 7:30am
 - 6 5% of service work will be performed between 11:00am and 7:30am. During this time the operations include service of truck and trailer mounted temperature control systems and emergency call outs to provide remote service for customers off-site. No other support staff other than mechanics are on hand during this time. There will be roughly 3 employees supporting this operation.

- Lack of screening along back portion of property.
 - o Our plan provides for an 8'h chain link fence along the south, east and west limits of the property.
- Opposed to use. Property should be parking only. One resident stated property should be residential use.
 - o This development is presently zoned as I-1 which is industrial. This zoning is appropriate for our proposed development.
- Too many variations requested.
 - o We feel that the variance request items previously presented to staff are reasonable and should be considered for approval by this commission.
- Lack of setback from Forest Preserve property. Should provide landscaping along sides and rear.
 - o We are reducing the impervious surfaces by 15% on the east and 21% on the south. Additionally, we are improving the existing surface areas at the site perimeter and placing turf grass and native ground cover-
- Pole sign would be evesore.
 - A pole sign would provide visibility to IAC's customer base. There are pole signs along the I-55 corridor on industrial sites, this site is zoned I-1 and our request for a pole sign is not an unreasonable request. IAC is working with a few pole sign contractors to further develop signage requirements. A preliminary rendering of what the sign will look like will be submitted to City of Darien prior to the meeting on 8/19.
- Trailer parking area should be hard surface to eliminate hazardous materials seeping into ground, eliminate dust.
 - o The existing aggregate surface is an existing condition which will be improved upon. The north parking lot areas and all entry / exit drives will be new asphalt paving. 50' of concrete will be added to the south of the service shop and indicted on the site plan.

- COMMENT 1: If the original development plans for this property can be located in City archives, then the volume of stormwater detention identified on those plans will take precedence. If they cannot be located, the existing volume as calculated by the design engineer will be appropriate.
- RESPONSE 1: Noted. If the City is able to locate the original development plans, we will provide the stormwater detention required on those plans. If the City is unable to locate those plans, we will provide stormwater detention to meet the current volume provided on-site. Per the DuPage County Ordinance, post construction stormwater BMPs will be required if the impervious coverage of the site is increased by 2,500 s.f. or more. Additionally, site runoff storage will be required if the impervious coverage of the site is increased by 25,000 s.f. or more.

The proposed development will not increase the existing impervious coverage by more than 2,500 s.f. Therefore, no post construction stormwater EMPs or site runoff storage are required to be provided.

- COMMENT 2: It is our understanding that City staff will determine if the property will have to be resubdivided.
- RESPONSE 2: If the City requires the property to be subdivided, a Plat of Subdivision will be prepared.
- COMMENT 3: It should be clarified if any of the proposed sanitary sewer will be public or if it will all be a private service.
- RESPONSE 3: The sanitary sewer is proposed as a private service to serve both buildings.
- COMMENT 4: The City should consider if the sanitary sewer could be extended to the west property line to serve the Public Works building.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the request of Illinois Auto Electric Company, Optimum Safety Management performed a noise survey at the property located at 1033 S. Frontage Rd., Darien, IL, on the evening of Thursday, August 13, 2015, and the morning of Friday, August 14, 2015. The noise survey was performed in order to document ambient noise levels present on the property and the noise levels produced by the Thermo King refrigeration unit and a tractor-truck. These noise levels were recorded at specific locations on-site, as well as off-site at eleven (11) locations throughout the surrounding area and residential subdivisions. A trailer, equipped with a Thermo King refrigeration unit found in photo 14 of Appendix 3, was staged on the property during the noise survey on both occasions. Recordings were documented while the unit was both on and off. In addition, a tractor-truck was present during the second occasion in order to capture the noise level of an idling tractor engine alone, and in combination with the refrigeration unit.

None of the other readings taken onsite and offsite varied excessively while the Thermo King refrigeration unit was on or off. In addition, there was a slight increase in noise levels at distances of 0′, 10′ and 25′ while both the tractor-truck and Thermo King refrigeration were on and connect to each other.

INTRODUCTION

At the request of Illinois Auto Electric Company, Optimum Safety Management performed a noise survey at the property located at 1033 S. Frontage Rd., Darien, IL, on the evening of Thursday, August 13, 2015, and the morning of Friday, August 14, 2015. The noise survey was performed in order to document ambient noise levels present on the property and the noise levels produced by the Thermo King refrigeration unit and a tractor-truck. These noise levels were recorded at specific locations on-site, as well as off-site at eleven (11) locations throughout the surrounding area and residential subdivisions. A trailer, equipped with a Thermo King refrigeration unit found in photo 14 of Appendix 3, was staged on the property during the noise survey on both occasions. Recordings were documented while the unit was both on and off. In addition, a tractor-truck was present during the second occasion in order to capture the noise level of an idling tractor engine alone, and in combination with the refrigeration unit.

Noise levels were taken and recorded by Doug Anderson, representing Optimum Safety Management, on Thursday, August 13, 2015 and Friday, August 14, 2015.

NOTSE LEVEL SURVEY

The purpose of this report is to describe noise levels associated with the various locations on the property, surrounding area and residential subdivisions.

Sample Size

The sample size consisted of eight (8) locations onsite at different increments from the staged refrigeration unit, as well as four (4) property lines. Photographs at these locations can be viewed in Appendix 3, photos 1-13. Distances of the eight locations onsite were measured using a measuring wheel, shown in Appendix 3, photo 11. In addition, eleven (11) offsite locations were sampled. These locations are identified in Appendix 1 – NOISE STUDY MAP. The twenty-three (23) total locations were sampled twice on two (2) occasions.

A noise sample of a 2007 International 8600 Tractor, depicted in photo 16 of Appendix 3, can be found in Appendix 2 – NOISE STUDY DATA table dated on August 14, 2015. In addition, the combination noise sample, depicted in photo 17 of Appendix 3, can be found in Appendix 2 – NOISE STUDY DATA table dated on August 14, 2015.

Sampling Equipment

The equipment used to perform the noise survey consisted of a Quest Edge 4 Sound Level Meter. Field calibrations were performed prior to and after the surveys with a Quest QC-10 Acoustical Calibrator. The noise level meter was programmed as follows:

Criterion: 90 dB Exchange Rate: 5 dB

Upper Measurement Limit 115 dB

Weighting: "A" Response: Slow

Copies of the instrument calibration certificates are provided in Appendix 4.

Conditions

<u>August 13, 2015</u> – Clear weather conditions existed throughout the evening. An increase of insect activity along the South property line was experienced at dusk. Moderate vehicular traffic was present on Interstate 55 throughout the sampling period. While sampling along the North property line and along S. Frontage Rd, direct reads of the sound level meter varied between 68 dB – 76 dB. This was clearly due to the type of vehicular traffic passing the test locations (i.e. tractor-trailers, motorcycles...).

<u>August 14, 2015</u> – Clear weather conditions existed throughout the morning. Moderate vehicular traffic was present on Interstate 55 throughout the sampling period. While sampling along the North property line and along S. Frontage Rd, direct reads of the sound level meter varied between 68 dB – 76 dB. This was clearly due to the type of vehicular traffic passing the test locations (i.e. tractor-trailers, motorcydes...).

RESULTS

The tables located in Appendix 2 – NOISE STUDY DATA provide results of each sample taken. The table identifies the locations of the tests, the corresponding numbers with the map in Appendix 1 – NOISE STUDY MAP, the date, time of the readings and results while the refrigeration unit was on and off.

CONCLUSIONS

The following conclusions were reached regarding noise exposure monitoring:

<u>August 13, 2015</u> – Based on the data recorded during the noise survey performed in the evening while the Thermo King refrigeration unit was on versus off, the noise produced by the refrigeration unit was detectable at the distances of 0' and 10' from the Thermo King refrigeration unit. None of the other readings taken onsite and offsite varied excessively while the Thermo King refrigeration unit was on or off.

<u>August 14, 2015</u> – Based on the data recorded during the noise survey performed in the morning while the Thermo King refrigeration unit was on versus off, the noise produced by the refrigeration unit was detectable at the distances of 0', 10' and 25' from the Thermo King refrigeration unit. None of the other readings taken onsite and offsite varied excessively while the Thermo King refrigeration unit was on or off. In addition, there was a slight increase in noise levels at distances of 0', 10' and 25' while both the tractor-truck and Thermo King refrigeration were on and connect to each other.



This memorandum presents the findings of a summary traffic evaluation conducted by Kenig, Lindgren, O'Hara, Aboona, Inc. (KLOA, Inc.) for the proposed Illinois Auto Central Thermo King (IACTK) facility to be located in Darien, Illinois. The site, which is zoned I-1 (heavy industrial) in the City of Darien, is located at 1033 South Frontage Road just east of the Darien Public Works Department facility. As proposed, the site will be redeveloped to contain an IACTK sales and service facility with a portion of the site leased to CR England for truck parking and storage. The proposed facility, including the CR England truck yard, will replace an existing facility located in Chicago, Illinois. Access to the facility is to be provided via the I-55 South Frontage Road.

The purpose of this evaluation was to examine the existing conditions of the South Frontage Road, determine the traffic characteristics of the facility and evaluate whether the South Frontage Road has sufficient capacity to accommodate the additional traffic.

Existing Conditions

South Frontage Road

The I-55 South Frontage Road is a two-lane road that serves as a local frontage road to I-55 and extends from just east of Clarendon Hills Road to just west of Woodward Avenue. Within the vicinity of the site, the South Frontage Road has curb and gutter provided at the access drives to the Darien Public Works Department facility and the existing site. Through truck traffic and trucks over five tons are prohibited on the South Frontage Road east of the site via a "Through Truck Traffic is Prohibited" sign and a "5-Ton Weight Limit" sign located along the eastbound lane of the South Frontage Road just east of the site. Both approaches of the South Frontage Road are under stop sign control at its intersection with Cass Avenue and both approaches of Fern Street (South Frontage Road) are under stop sign control at its intersection with Clarendon Hills Road. The South Frontage Road has a posted speed limit of 35 mph and is under the jurisdiction of the City of Darien.

Existing Traffic Counts

To determine the existing traffic volumes along the South Frontage Road, daily traffic counts were obtained from the City of Darien. The traffic counts were performed just east of Cass Avenue from Wednesday, August 12 through Friday, August 14, 2015. The following summarizes the results of the traffic counts:

- The South Frontage Road had an average two-way traffic volume of approximately 1,500 vehicles per day with a maximum of approximately 1,700 vehicles per day.
- The South Frontage Road had a two-way volume of approximately 87 vehicles during the morning peak hour (6:30 to 7:30 A.M.) and approximately 235 vehicles during the evening peak hour (5:30 to 6:30 P.M.).

Facility Traffic Characteristics

Proposed Facility and Site Plan

As proposed, the site will be redeveloped and contain two buildings. The largest building will be the IACTK shop/office and warehouse and the second building will be leased to CR England. IACTK is a factory-authorized sales and service dealer for Thermo King which is a producer of transport temperature control and auxiliary power units. The facility is proposed to provide service and repairs for the units, a retail showroom for customers to view and purchase related parts and accessories, office and support space and a warehouse that will receive and distribute all parts related to the sales and service operations. CR England is a customer of IACTK and will lease a portion of the site to park their commercial tractors and trailers.

As proposed, the site will provide approximately 90 off-street parking spaces. The truck yard will provide approximately 106 spaces for CR England trucks and approximately 101 spaces for IACTK trucks. Access to the development is proposed to be provided via three full access drives on the South Frontage Road.

Directional Distribution

Given the truck restrictions along the South Frontage Road, all of the truck traffic will access the site via the west on the South Frontage Road and its intersection with Cass Avenue. No truck traffic will be allowed to access the site via the east on the South Frontage Road. It is anticipated that the majority of the truck traffic will be traveling to and from the area via I-55. While I-55 can experience congestion, particularly during the morning and evening peak periods, it is expected that the truck traffic will still use I-55 to access the facility as opposed to traversing the local roadway system.

Trip Generation

According to IACTK, the facility is anticipated to have a total of approximately 39 employees that will typically work one of the following three shifts:

- Approximately 28 employees will work from 7:00 A.M. to 3:30 P.M.
- Approximately 8 employees will work from 3:00 P.M. to 11:30 P.M.
- Approximately 3 employees will work from 11:00 P.M. to 7:30 A.M.

CR England is anticipated to have a total of 60 to 65 drivers that will typically work one of the following three shifts:

- Approximately 16 drivers will work from 4:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M.
- Approximately 42 drivers will work from 12:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M.
- Approximately 7 drivers will work from 8:00 P.M. to 4:00 A.M.

In addition, CR England is anticipated to have approximately 8 employees that will work one of three shifts. Other than the IACTK morning shift, very few of the employees/drivers are expected to arrive at or depart from the facility during the weekday morning or evening commuter peak hours.

The volume of truck traffic projected to be generated by the facility was based on the operation of the existing IACTK facility located in Chicago which is to be relocated to the subject site. Table 1 shows the number of truck trips generated by the existing facility on August 10, 2015 during the morning and evening commuter peak hours along the South Frontage Road and per day. In addition, Table 2 provides a breakdown of the type of trucks that were generated by the facility. The following summarizes the volume of truck traffic anticipated to be generated by the facility:

- The facility is anticipated to generate approximately 225 total truck trips per day. However, it is important to note that the truck traffic will be distributed throughout the day with the facility anticipated to generate a maximum of approximately 22 truck trips in any one hour.
- The facility is anticipated to generate a limited volume of truck trips during the critical morning and evening commuter peak hours with a total of approximately 7 trips during the morning peak hour and 9 trips during the evening peak hour.
- Approximately 47 percent of the truck trips consisted of single unit trucks and 53 percent consisted of semi-trailers. As such, only approximately 50 percent of the truck traffic is anticipated to consist of the larger semi-trailers.




Traffic Evaluation

Based on the average daily traffic counts provided by the City of Darien, the South Frontage Road had a maximum daily traffic volume of approximately 1,700 vehicles. Further, the road had a morning peak hour (6:30 to 7:30 A.M.) two-way volume of 87 vehicles and an evening peak hour (5:30 to 6:30 P.M.) two-way volume of 235 vehicles. Given that a typical two-lane road has a capacity of approximately 10,000 vehicles per day, the South Frontage Road is currently utilizing only approximately 17 percent of the roadway's daily capacity.

Based on the existing operation in Chicago, the facility is anticipated to generate approximately 225 total truck trips per day. However, it is important to note that the truck trips will be distributed throughout the day and will consist of approximately 50 percent single unit vehicles and 50 percent semi-trailers. More important, the facility is anticipated to generate a limited volume of traffic during the critical morning and evening commuter peak hours with a total of approximately 7 trips during the morning peak hour and 9 trips during the evening peak hour. Finally, other than the IACTK morning shift, very few of the employees/drivers are expected to arrive at or depart from the facility during the weekday morning or evening commuter peak hours. The total traffic anticipated to be generated by the facility will only utilize approximately 5 percent of the total daily capacity of the South Frontage Road.


With the addition of the facility-generated traffic, the South Frontage Road is anticipated to be operating at only approximately 22 percent of the roadway's capacity. Furthermore, the facility is projected to add only a limited volume of peak hour traffic. Therefore, it can be seen that the South Frontage Road has sufficient reserve capacity to accommodate the additional traffic to be generated by the proposed facility. Finally, as previously indicated, truck traffic is anticipated to travel to/from the west on the South Frontage Road given the location of the I-55 ramps along Cass Avenue and the fact that trucks are restricted from traveling east along the frontage road just east of the site.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution to enter into a contract agreement with Concrete Solutions International LLC. for the labor, material and installation of a Concrete Floor Finish for the Public Works Facility Garage in the amount of \$38,500.

BACKGROUND

The FY15/16 Budget includes funds to refurbish the garage floor at the Public Works facility located at 1041 South Frontage Road. The floor requires maintenance due to years of wear and tear from salt, water, and traffic thus causing spalling and cracks. The current conditions also make it difficult to move equipment and shop tools across the floor.

The garage floor refinishing project will allow the floor to be reconditioned to a uniform surface and allow ease of cleaning. The scope of the work includes the following:

- Shot Blasting
- Polymer Filling/Leveling Agent
- Epoxy Coating

Bid invitations and a legal notice were sent out and one sealed responsive bid was opened on August 13, 2015. Concrete Solutions provided a bid in the amount of \$40,155, see attached bid sheet labeled as Attachment A. The FY15/16 Budget allocated \$38,500 and the bid is over budget by \$3,000. Staff had reached out to them requesting consideration to negotiate the pricing to \$38,500. Concrete Solutions agreed to the negotiated price; see attached e-mail labeled as Attachment B. The additional bid from Drake Specialized Services was non-responsive and rejected.

SECTION 6: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: The bidder shall at all times observe and comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the federal, state, local and City governments, which may in any manner affect the preparation of bids or the performance of the Contract. Contractor and subcontractors shall be required to comply with all applicable federal laws, state laws and regulations regarding minimum wages, limit on payment to minors, minimum fair wage standards for minors, payment of wage due employees,

and health and safety of employees. Contractor and subcontractor are required to pay employees all rightful salaries, medical benefits, pension and social security benefits pursuant to applicable labor agreements and federal and state statutes and to further require withholdings and deposits therefore. The CONTRACTOR shall obtain all necessary local and state licenses and/or permits that may be required for performance of the WORK and provide those licenses to the CITY prior to commencement of the WORK if applicable.

The CONTRACTOR'S personnel shall, at all times present a neat appearance and shall be trained to handle all contact with City residents or City employees in a respectful manner. At the request of the Director of Municipal Services or a designee, the CONTRACTOR shall replace any incompetent, abusive or disorderly person in its employ.

SECTION 9: PAYMENTS TO OTHER PARTIES: The CONTRACTOR shall not obligate the CITY to make payments to third parties or make promises or representations to third parties on behalf of the CITY without prior written approval of the City Administrator or a designee.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a contract with Alliance Contractors Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$120,545.00, which includes \$10,000 contingency for unforeseen condition requiring attention, for the reconstruction of the Carlisle Court Storm Water Drainage Infrastructure Reconstruction Project located within the 8700 block of Carlisle Court.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

In 2014, staff identified that the existing Carlisle Court Bridge was in need of repair. Staff had identified deficiencies with the structure consisting of vertical and horizontal cracks along with displacement. A structural review of the infrastructure was completed by Christopher B. Burke Engineering and the engineer had recommended replacing the structure. The structure serves as a roadway bridge and a tributary creek. In 2014, the Kentwood Court Bridge underwent similar renovations.

The scope of the proposed contract includes the removal and replacement of the concrete box culverts under Carlisle Court along with embankment improvements on both sides of the roadway. The roadway will be realigned to match the existing roadway and includes landscape restoration.

Attached and labeled as Attachment 1 is the bid tally and Attachment 2 is the recommendation from Christopher B. Burke Engineering.

ISSUE STATEMENT

Approval of a resolution authorizing additional funding in the amount of \$30,000 for the purpose of sharing costs for construction items associated with the Street Lighting Project within limited locations of the 75th Street Corridor and the Cass Avenue Corridor.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The City Council approved an Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of Dupage on May 4, 2015 for the Street Lighting Project within limited locations of the 75th Street Corridor and the Cass Avenue Corridor. See attached agenda memo labeled as Attachment A for additional background.

On July 31, 2015 the Illinois Department of Transportation opened bids for the project. The lowest bid was \$709,215.40 and is over the engineer's estimate by approximately \$20,000. Staff had requested a copy of the bid tally and IDOT will not release the bid tally until the project is awarded. Telephone conversations with Fawad Aqueel, IDOT Federal Aid Coordinator, indicated that the following items were over the engineer's estimate:

Decorative Luminaires Underground Conduit

Pending bid results, there may be an opportunity for additional cost share funding through the CMAQ grant. Since the County is the lead agency for the project, the additional funding request will need to be submitted by the County. The City staff is further requesting a contingency in the amount of \$10,000 for construction due to potential unforeseen field conditions.

The County of Dupage and IDOT has requested of the City to respond by August 26, 2015 to proceed with the project. If the City does not respond by said date the project may be rejected by the proposed vendor and/or IDOT and would require a rebid. The construction for project could start as early as late September, pending IDOT protocols.

Attached is the proposed detailed funding schedule labeled as Attachment B. Please note, proposed savings have been identified from the Carlisle Bridge Project and have been applied to the 75th Street Lighting Project to cover the shortfall and a \$10,000 contingency. Below please see the proposed cost summary.



BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The City of Darien has jointly succeeded with the County of DuPage in securing an extension of the CMAQ funding for the 75th Street Reconstruction Project as it relates to the replacement of street lighting along certain segments of 75th Street and along Cass Avenue, see attached plan labeled as Attachment A. Please recall 30 street light poles were removed as part of the reconstruction project. The street lights are owned and were installed by the City in the 80's and per the Intergovernmental Agreement on file. The County was not required to replace the street lighting. The CMAO funding allows for the replacement lighting, in kind, design construction and construction engineering at a local match of 20%. The City Council also recently authorized theme lighting at specific locations within the 75th Street and Cass Avenue corridors. The theme lighting is not grant eligible and will be funded by the City 100%.

In summary the scope of the project includes the following limits:

- 75th Street Williams Street to Nantucket Drive
- Cass Avenue Plainfield Road to approximately 500 feet north of 75th Street
- Plainfield Road East and West of Cass Avenue approximately 250 feet in each direction

The proposed time line allows for the engineering plans, IDOT Letting and construction to be completed by December 2015. Pending lead times for the fixtures and weather, the project may carry into Spring of 2016. Should the Project require completion in 2016, an additional Construction Engineering expense may be incurred in the amount approximately \$65,000 of which the City would be responsible for \$21,450.

Attachment C is the 15th Street Corridor and Cass Avenue Corridor Cost Summary. Since the budgeting of this item, DuPage County's engineering consultant for the project has updated the cost schedule and pricing for the fixtures has increased, see attached e-mail labeled as Attachment D. Pending the bid results, staff will bring this item back to the City Council should the Construction Cost exceed the City Share in the amount of \$218,345. Pending the bid results, should the Construction Cost exceed the amount of \$218,345 this item will be brought back to the City Council for further consideration including rejecting the bids. The Construction Engineering Cost is estimated not to exceed a City Share of \$30,585.34. A contingency in the amount of \$21,450 for Winter Construction Engineering is included in the event that the Project will carry into Spring of 2016. The total cost of the project including Engineering Contingency shall not exceed \$275,588.64.

Upon completion of the Project, the City will own and maintain the Street Lights per the conditions of the Permit labeled as Exhibit B.

Attached is a copy of the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with DuPage County for the Plainfield Road Project, labeled as Exhibit A.





Dan:

As a follow up to our conversation from earlier this week (with regard to the 75th Street Lighting pre-final cost estimate), V3 has gone back and taken another look at the estimated unit costs. Based on our review, we do not teel comfortable in reducing any of the suggested unit costs. We took the most in depth look at the decorative luminaire/arm cost (estimated at \$1800/each) and feel that it is appropriate based on the most recent conversations we have had with various lighting reps. Although V3 had initially estimated a unit cost of \$850 for this item, it was at the very early concept stage before we had an opportunity to discuss this item in detail with lighting reps. In addition, the initial cost had underestimated the cost associated with the decorative arm.

As another way to potentially reduce the overall project cost, the County is going to revisit the estimated construction engineering fee. Otherwise we may have to look at reducing the scope of the improvements proposed.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DU PAGE

AND

THE CITY OF DARIEN

FOR

STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF COUNTY HIGHWAY 33/75TH STREET

(ADAMS STREET TO PLAINFIELD ROAD)

SECTION NO. 15-00233-07-LT

This Intergovernmental Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT") is entered into this 9th day of June, 2015, between the County of DuPage (hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY"), a body corporate and politic, with offices at 421 North County Farm Road, Wheaton, Illinois and the City of Darien (hereinafter referred to as the "CITY"), a municipal corporation with offices at 1702 Plainfield Road, Darien, Illinois. The COUNTY and the CITY are hereinafter sometimes individually referred to as a "party" or together as the "parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the CITY in order to ensure the safety of the motoring public is desirous of replacing existing street lighting (hereinafter referred to as "STREET LIGHTING," Section 15-00233-07-LT) impacted by the construction of CH 33/75th Street, from Adams Street to Plainfield Road, County Section No. 12-00233-07-PV (hereinafter referred to as "PROJECT"); and

WHERAS, the PROJECT is currently under construction and it has been determined that the STREET LIGHTING is eligible for federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funds currently obligated to the PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, CMAQ funds obligated for the PROJECT in excess of what is estimated to be necessary to complete the PROJECT can be redistributed to the STREET LIGHTING as a separate project; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY's design consultant for the PROJECT has been directed to perform said STREET LIGHTING design work; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY desire to cooperate in the STREET LIGHTING because of the benefit of the STREETING

LIGHTING to the residents of DuPage County, the CITY and the public; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the CITY desire to establish the parties' mutual project, cost and maintenance responsibilities with respect to the STREET LIGHTING; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY by virtue of its power set forth in "Counties Code" (55 ILCS 5/1-1001 et seq.) and "Illinois Highway Code" (605 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq.) and the CITY by virtue of its power set forth in the "Illinois Municipal Code" (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et seq.) are authorized to enter into this AGREEMENT; and

WHEREAS, a cooperative intergovernmental agreement is appropriate and such an agreement is authorized and encouraged by Article 7, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution and Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the mutual covenants, terms, and conditions herein set forth, and the understandings of each party to the other, the parties do hereby mutually covenant, promise and agree as follows:

1.0 INCORPORATION.

- 1.1. All recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made part hereof, the same constituting the factual basis for this AGREEMENT.
- 1.2. The headings of the paragraphs and subparagraphs of this AGREEMENT are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not be deemed to constitute part of this AGREEMENT or to affect the construction thereof.

2.0 SCOPE OF STREET LIGHTING

- 2.1. The STREET LIGHTING includes, but is not limited to, street lighting along 75th Street between Adams Street and Plainfield Road and along Cass Avenue from 75th Street to Plainfield Road.
- 2.2. The design of the STREET LIGHTING will include painting the light poles, decorative treatments and

new street lighting as requested by the CITY and subject to CITY cost share as noted herein below.

3.0 RESPONSIBILITIES - JOINT

- 3.1. The COUNTY and CITY agree to cooperate in and make every effort to cause the construction of the STREET LIGHTING.
- 3.2. The COUNTY and the CITY agree that the estimated cost of the STREET LIGHTING that includes design, construction and construction engineering is \$776,048.96, and the CITY's share is \$254,138.64 as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3.3. The COUNTY and CITY agree that the contract documents for the STREET LIGHTING will be prepared in an effort to minimize the need to relocate CITY utilities. Should field conditions result in unexpected utility conflict(s), reasonably demonstrated to be the result on the information provided to the COUNTY from the CITY, all reasonable costs associated with resolving said utility conflict(s) shall be at the sole cost of the CITY.
- 3.4. The COUNTY and the CITY acknowledge that no right-ofway is required for the STREET LIGHTING.

4.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNTY

- 4.1. The COUNTY shall act as the lead agency and be responsible for completing all design engineering and coordination for a letting with IDOT as well as construction engineering for the STREET LIGHTING with reimbursement by the CITY as hereinafter referenced.
- 4.2. Both the COUNTY and CITY agree that the CITY reserves the right to request that IDOT not award the contract if the bid prices are unacceptable to the CITY for the STREET LIGHTING.
- 4.3. Both the COUNTY and CITY agree that the COUNTY shall administer the contract for the construction of the STREET LIGHTING. The COUNTY agrees to administer the STREET LIGHTING contract in the best interest of both

parties and to consult with, and keep advised, officials of the CITY regarding the progress of the STREET LIGHTING and any problems encountered or changes recommended. No change order which affects the CITY's facilities, or CITY cost, except normal minor variations in quantities of pay items required to complete the STREET LIGHTING shall be authorized except with prior written or e-mail approval by the CITY.

4.4. The COUNTY shall submit the Pre-final Plans and Specifications for the STREET LIGHTING to the CITY for review. The CITY shall provide review comments within fourteen (14) days of receipt of the Pre-final Plans and Specifications. The COUNTY will correct any errors and address other reasonable comments prior to the submittal of Final Plans and Specifications to the CITY.

5.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY

- 5.1. The CITY shall immediately notify the COUNTY, in writing, if the bid is unacceptable to the CITY for the STREET LIGHTING and shall inform the COUNTY to reject the bid.
- 5.2. The CITY shall, upon completion and acceptance of the STREET LIGHTING own, operate, and maintain the STREET LIGHTING and be financially responsible to repair, relocate, and replace the STREET LIGHTING, if necessary, due to future roadway improvements. Acceptance of the STREET LIGHTING shall not be unreasonably withheld by the CITY.
- 5.3. The CITY also agrees that upon completion and acceptance of the STREET LIGHTING, the CITY shall assume all future energy costs for the STREET LIGHTING and will be invoiced directly by the energy provider. The parties acknowledge that the STREET LIGHTING is separate from the COUNTY's combination poles at signalized intersections within the PROJECT.
- 5.4. The CITY shall assign a representative to the STREET LIGHTING construction to inspect the work and consult with the COUNTY or COUNTY's resident engineer on a regular basis.

5.5. The CITY agrees to reimburse the COUNTY for the 20% local match of the CMAQ funding for design engineering (or balance not covered by CMAQ), in addition to the CITY's share of costs for construction/construction engineering as shown on Exhibit A based upon actual construction bid costs plus the cost of any additional items required as a part of the STREET LIGHTING authorized in writing or via email by the CITY and the final construction engineering costs, less any federal shares. The CITY agrees to pay the COUNTY eighty (80%) percent of the Total Estimate of CITY's Cost as referenced on Exhibit A upon submittal of an invoice. Upon completion and acceptance by the CITY of the STREET LIGHTING and based upon the documentation of final costs and quantities, submitted by the COUNTY and a final invoice, the CITY agrees to reimburse the COUNTY for the balance of the STREET LIGHTING cost within sixty (60) days of receipt of a properly documented invoice from the COUNTY. The CITY agrees that any elements of the STREET LIGHTING requested by the CITY that are not CMAQ eligible will be at 100% CITY cost.

6.0 INDEMNIFICATION

- 6.1. The COUNTY shall to the extent permitted by law, indemnify, hold harmless and defend the CITY, its officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against all liability, claims, suits, demands, proceedings and action, including costs, fees and expense of defense, arising from, growing out of, or related to, any loss, damage, injury, death, or loss or damage to property resulting from, or connected with, the COUNTY's negligent or willful acts, errors or omissions in its performance under this AGREEMENT to the extent permitted by law. The COUNTY does not hereby waive any defenses or immunity available to it with respect to third parties.
 - 6.1.1. The COUNTY and the CITY acknowledge that the COUNTY has made no representations, assurances or guaranties regarding the COUNTY's or any successor's or assign's authority and legal capacity to indemnify CITY as provided for in this AGREEMENT. In the event a court of

competent jurisdiction holds that the COUNTY, or any successor or assign, is deemed to lack the lawful authority or ability to indemnify, defend or hold harmless the CITY, or any person or entity claiming a right through CITY, or in the event of change in the laws of the State of Illinois governing COUNTY's or any successor's or assign's indemnification authority, such occurrence(s) shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the remainder of this AGREEMENT or the parties rights and obligations provided for therein.

- 6.2. The CITY shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the COUNTY, its officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against all liability, claims, suits, demands, proceedings and action, including costs, fees and expense of defense, arising from, growing out of, or related to, any loss, damage, injury, death, or loss or damage to property resulting from, or connected with, the CITY'S negligent or willful acts, errors or omissions in its performance under this AGREEMENT to the extent permitted by law. The CITY does not hereby waive any defenses or immunity available to it with respect to third parties.
- 6.3. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as prohibiting the COUNTY, its officials, directors, officers, agents and employees, from defending through the selection and use of their own agents, attorneys and experts, any claims, suits, demands, proceedings and actions brought against them. Pursuant to Illinois law, 55 ILCS 5/3-9005, any attorney representing the COUNTY, under this paragraph or paragraph 6.1, who is not already an Assistant State's Attorney, is to be appointed a Special Assistant State's Attorney, as provided in 55 ILCS 5/3-9008. The COUNTY'S participation in its defense shall not remove CITY'S duty to indemnify, defend, and hold the COUNTY harmless, as set forth above.
- 6.4. Neither party waives, by these indemnity requirements, any defenses or protections under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1 et seg.) or otherwise

- available to it, or to the other party, under the law.
- 6.5. Any indemnity as provided in this AGREEMENT shall not be limited by reason of the enumeration of any insurance coverage herein provided. The CITY'S and COUNTY'S indemnification under Section 6.0 hereof shall terminate when the PROJECT is completed and the CITY assumes its maintenance responsibilities as set forth in Section 5.2 hereof.

7.0 GENERAL

- 7.1 It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this AGREEMENT is intended to address mutual STREET LIGHTING cost and maintenance responsibilities and improvements requested by the CITY and no changes to existing highways and appurtenances maintenance and/or jurisdiction are proposes.
- 7.2 The parties agree that this AGREEMENT shall serve in lieu of a separate DuPage County Division of Transportation permit for the STREET LIGHTING. By execution of this AGREEMENT, the CITY agrees to be bound by the Highway Permit Conditions, attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof, and the DuPage County Highway Rights-of-Way Permit and Fee Ordinance (ODT-0001A-06) incorporated herein by reference and amended from time to time including all insurance requirements as they exist on the date of the execution of this AGREEMENT by the COUNTY.
- 7.3 Whenever in this AGREEMENT, approval or review of either the COUNTY or CITY is provided for, said approval or review shall not be unreasonably delayed or withheld.
- 7.4 In the event of a dispute between the COUNTY and CITY representatives in the preparation of the Plans and Specifications, or changes thereto, or in carrying out the terms of this AGREEMENT, the County Engineer of the COUNTY and the City Administrator of the CITY shall meet and resolve the issue.
- 7.5 No later than fourteen (14) days after the execution of this AGREEMENT, each party shall designate a representative to the other party who shall serve as

the full time representative of said party during the carrying out of the construction of the STREET LIGHTING. Each representative shall have authority, on behalf of such party, to receive notices and make inspections relating to the work covered in this AGREEMENT. Representatives shall be readily available to the other party.

7.6 This AGREEMENT may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall be deemed one in the same instrument.

8.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

8.1 This AGREEMENT represents the entire AGREEMENT between the parties with respect to the STREET LIGHTING, and supersedes all previous communications or understandings whether oral or written.

9.0 NOTICES

9.1 Any notice required hereunder shall be deemed properly given to the party to be notified at the time it is personally delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or sent by confirmed facsimile, to the party's address. The address of each party is as specified below; either party may change its address for receiving notices by giving notices thereof in compliance with the terms of this subsection.

10.0 AMENDMENT, MODIFICATION OR TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

11.0 ASSIGNMENT

11.1 This AGREEMENT shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

12.0 GOVERNING LAW

- 12.1. This AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois as to both interpretation and performance.
- 12.2. The forum for resolving any disputes concerning the parties' respective performance, or failure to perform, under this AGREEMENT, shall be the Judicial Circuit Court for DuPage County.

13.0 AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE/RELATIONSHIP

- 13.1 The parties hereto have read and reviewed the terms of this AGREEMENT and by their signature as affixed below represent that the signing party has the authority to execute this AGREEMENT and that the parties intend to be bound by the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 13.2 This AGREEMENT shall not be deemed or construed to create an employment, joint venture, partnership or other agency relationship between the parties.

14.0 SEVERABILITY

14.1 In the event, any provision of this AGREEMENT is held to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, the enforceability thereof shall not affect the remainder of the AGREEMENT. The remainder of this AGREEMENT shall be construed as if not containing the particular provision and shall continue in full force, effect, and enforceability, in accordance with its terms.

15.0 FORCE MAJEURE

15.1 Neither party shall be liable for any delay or nonperformance of their obligations caused by any contingency beyond their control including but not limited to Acts of God, war, civil unrest, strikes, walkouts, fires or natural disasters.

PERMIT CONDITIONS:

1. Equipment and materials shall NOT be stored within the County's rights-of-way.

2. Existing sidewalk, curb/gutter and pavement disturbed or damaged due to the permitted work shall be replaced in kind as directed by the County Engineer, the duly authorized assign.

3. Pavement, curb/gutter and storm structures shall be maintained free of mud/debris at all times.

4. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor shall furnish all material, labor, and pay all costs required to restore said County rights-of-way to a condition similar or equal to the conditions that existed before the commencement of the described work. It shall be the responsibility of the Permittee to properly grade, install a min. of 6" topsoil and seed (with crossion control blanket or hydro seeding) or sod (salt tolerant and staked in place) any portions of the rights-of-way disturbed during the described work.

5. Construction and erosion control measures shall comply with the minimum requirements of the "DuPage County Stormwater and Floodplain

Ordinance" and any supplemental specifications made thereto.

6. The permitted improvements shall be located and constructed per the DuPage County standards and to the satisfaction of DuPage County Division of Transportation. The material used and method of construction shall comply with and conform to IDOT's "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction" (latest edition) and "Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions" (latest edition).

- 7. The Pennittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor agrees to provide traffic control with advance warning signs, an arrow board and barricades conforming to the FHWA's "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" and IDOT's Highway Standards, "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction" (latest edition) and "Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions" (latest edition) or as specified. The Pennittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor agrees to provide controlled flow of traffic at all times by approved detour or flag persons (with applicable warning signage) to minimize the inconvenience to traffic. Daily lane closures of County roadways are permitted Monday through Friday between 9:00 s.m. and 4:00 p.m. ONLY.
- 8. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor assumes all risk and liability and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County of DuPage, its successors, assigns or employees, for any injury incurred to persons and/or damage to property in conjunction with and/or due to the permitted work/event.

9. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor shall not trim, remove, or in any way disturb trees or shrubs along and/or within the highway or trail system rights-of-way without prior written approval by or from the DuPage County Division of Transportation.

10. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor shall properly maintain all existing regulatory, warning and/or informational traffic control signage and/or devices along or within the DuPage County rights-of-way within the limits of the work covered under the permit and for the duration of said event permitted work/event. The DuPage County Division of Transportation shall be notified prior to construction and/or potential conflicts with existing signage due to the permitted construction. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor furthermore shall reimburse the DuPage County Highway Maintenance Dept. for any relocation and/or replacement of, due to conflicts with and/or damage to, said signage, posts and/or equipment.

DuPage County reserves the right to make changes, additions and/or repairs to and relocations of, within its statutory limits, the facilities and/or their appurtenances constructed under this permit within the County rights-of-way as may at any time be considered necessary to permit the relocation, reconstruction, widening and/or maintaining of the highway, trail and/or path and/or to provide proper protection to life and property on or adjacent to the County rights-of-way. However, in the event this permit is granted to construct, locate, operate and/or maintain facilities on and/or within the County rights-of-way, the Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor upon written notification from the County Engineer to the Permittee, shall perform such alterations or change of location of the facilities, solely at the permittee's cost as far as statutory authority dictates, without expense to DuPage County. Should the Permittee fail to make satisfactory arrangements to comply with said request within a reasonable time, DuPage County reserves the right to make such alterations to, change of location of and/or remove the facilities, and the Permittee, furthermore, shall pay for any costs incurred by DuPage County for said work.

12. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor shall notify the DuPage County Division of Transportation a minimum of 48 hours prior to the start of construction, to arrange for any inspections and at the completion of the described work according to County procedures and/or policy.

13. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor shall contact J.U.L.I.E. (1-800-892-0123) for utility locations a min. of 48 hours prior to the start of construction.

14. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor agrees to reimburse the County for any costs incurred by DuPage County for any repair, relocation and/or adjustment to the traffic signals and related equipment that is in conflict with or is damaged due to the permitted work. All construction shall be coordinated with the County's Signal Coordinator Contact the Division of Transportation pertaining to traffic signal related equipment at (639) 407-6900 a minimum of 48 hours prior to the start of construction to coordinate inspections.

15. The Permittee, it's agent, successor, assign, and/or contractor is required to contact the local agencies (including, but not limited to, municipal fire and police departments and the DuPage County Sheriff's Department) notifying them of all roadway construction or special event and traffic restrictions and/or temporary detours a minimum of 72 hours prior to the start of said construction/event.



ESTABLISH QUORUM

Chairperson Marchese called the meeting of the Municipal Services Committee to order at 6:30 p.m. at the City Hall – City Council Chambers, Darien, Illinois and declared a quorum present.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Ordinance - Darien Immediate Care, 8190 Cass Avenue - Petitioner seeks approval of a variation from the Sign Code to permit a wall sign on the side of the building which is not the front façade within the O Office Zoning District.

Mr. Michael Griffith, Senior Planner reported the variation request is for the sign location and not for the size of the sign or illumination. He reported the PZC considered this matter and recommended approval 6-1. He further reported Chairperson Meyer voted against the petition and that there were comments against the petitioner as well.

Chairperson Marchese questioned if there was any other business with a sign on the side.

Mr. Griffith reported that there were no other businesses with a sign on the side. He stated that the request is for an Immediate Care Facility and that patients with emergencies are having a difficult time locating the facility. He reported the PZC felt that because of the nature of the business that there was justification for a sign.

Chairperson Marchese stated he was concerned if others in the office park would be requesting the same type of signage.

Mr. Griffith stated signs are allowed if they face the street. He stated if the property was zoned business they would not need a variation.

Alderman Belczak stated this was a unique situation and they will probably not see such a request again. He stated he cannot foresee why an office would need a variance.

Mr. Michael Coren, 8170 Cass Avenue stated his office building is immediately to the north. He provided some history of the development and stated the area was originally zoned for business but the developer asked the City to zone it office because of the homes in the area. Mr. Coren stated he was concerned for the variance because of aesthetics and that a precedent is being set. He further stated the PZC approved the variance for a certain circumstance and he is

at a significant financial disadvantage should a business want to add a sign. Mr. Coren stated if the City allows one to have a sign they should all be given the same.

Chairperson Marchese stated every situation is looked at individually and the task is to look at ways to help businesses. He stated he likes the look of the office park but he also wants to help out the business.

Alderman Belczak stated it is more to help those with an emergency and not so much the business.

Mr. Coren stated there are other urgent care facilities down the street and the petitioner should have done research beforehand.

Mr. Griffith reported that the Association does not object to a sign on Cass Avenue.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director questioned the member of the Association.

Mr. Coren stated that each owner has one sixth vote.

There was no one else wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Marchese to approve an Ordinance - Darien Immediate Care, 8190 Cass Avenue -a variation from the Sign Code to permit a wall sign on the side of the building which is not the front façade within the O Office Zoning District.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 2-0.

B. 113 68th Street - Petitioner seeks approval of the following variations from the Zoning Ordinance in order to construct a new single-family home on an existing foundation: 1. To reduce the required front yard setback from 35 feet to 30.8 feet, 2. To reduce the required west interior side yard from 10 feet to 9.2 feet, within the R-2 Single Family Residence Zoning District.

Mr. Michael Griffith, Senior Planner reported the petitioner's home was destroyed in a fire and the petitioner is proposing to build a new home on the existing foundation with a front porch. He reported the PZC held a public hearing and voted in favor of the petition. He further reported there were no comments or objections.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Marchese approval of the following variations from the Zoning Ordinance in order to construct a new single-family home on an existing foundation: 1. To reduce the required front yard setback from 35 feet to 30.8 feet, 2. To reduce the required west interior side yard from 10 feet to 9.2 feet, within the R-2 Single Family Residence Zoning District.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 2-0.

C. Discussion - Class D Liquor License - Amending the hours liquor can be served from a Class D Liquor License.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that Chuck's Southern BBQ Café requested changing the hours of when liquor can be served. He reported on the hours of the businesses in the area and stated that staff surveyed adjacent communities as well. Mr. Gombac reported that amending the license affects all of the businesses holding the Class D Liquor License.

The petition stated that he would like to change the hours in order to accommodate the working class as well as for weddings or banquets to visit the bar afterwards.

Mayor Kathy Weaver stated that she was not in favor of it.

There was discussion about setting a precedent and the Committee discussed and felt a separate license was more appropriate.

The petitioner stated that he has a full service menu seven days a week.

Alderman Belczak stated that this was a unique entity and that he doesn't have a huge problem with the morning but had concern regarding the late night hours.

Mr. Gombac questioned the petitioner's motivation for the change of hours.

The petitioner stated that this would allow him more wiggle room to accommodate customers that have early hours instead of late hours. He further stated that the gaming is tied to the Liquor License and that he would hate to see people go somewhere else. The petitioner stated that his Burbank business has 7:00 a.m. and that he hardly sells any liquor.

Mayor Weaver stated that extensions are not favorable and that she has an issue with 3:00 a.m.

The petitioner stated that the late time is not the most important to him.

Mayor Weaver stated that a new license could be created to go along with the 7:00 a.m. request but not the 3:00 a.m. request.

Mr. Gombac stated that he was concerned that Dotty's would have to be addressed. He stated that he would look into who is serving breakfast.

Chairperson Marchese stated that if Dotty's is serving breakfast then they have the ability to ask for the same.

The Committee agreed to a separate license and that the recommendation would go to the City Council for discussion and then back to the Committee for approval.

Mr. Gombac reported that he received an email from Resident Joe Weber in opposition of any changes in the late hours and was amicable to the early hours.

Mr. Gombac reported that the Committee recommendation will be to propose early hours only. There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

D. Resolution – Accepting a proposal from Associated Technical Services (ATS) for the 2015 Water Leak Survey, in an amount of \$8,761.89 for the Leak Detection Phase and per unit cost for the Leak Location Phase in the amount of \$395.00 per mainline or service leak, and \$95.00 per fire hydrant leak or mainline valve for a total amount not to exceed \$14,700.00.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that this is a proposal from Associated Technical Services (ATS) for the 2015 Water Leak Survey. He reported that ATS was the lowest competitive bid.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Marchese to approve a Resolution accepting a proposal from Associated Technical Services (ATS) for the 2015 Water Leak Survey, in an amount of \$8,761.89 for the Leak Detection Phase and per unit cost for the Leak Location Phase in the amount of \$395.00 per mainline or service leak, and \$95.00 per fire hydrant leak or mainline valve for a total amount not to exceed \$14,700.00.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

E. Resolution - Authorizing the Mayor to accept a proposal from Superior Road Striping Co. in an amount not to exceed \$10,500.00 for the 2015 Road Striping Program.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that is the awarded vendor for the Northwest Municipal Conference Joint Purchasing Cooperative for road striping to municipalities within the Midwest.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Marchese made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Belczak to approve a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to accept a proposal from Superior Road Striping Co. in an amount not to exceed \$10,500.00 for the 2015 Road Striping Program.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 2-0.

F. Resolution - Authorizing the purchase of six (6) various Steel Road Plates from Lee Jensen Sales Co. in an amount not to exceed \$10,360.00.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the road plates are used for excavating when a hole needs to temporarily be left open. He reported that it is better to own versus renting.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

ESTABLISH QUORUM

Chairperson Marchese called the meeting of the Municipal Services Committee to order at 6:30 p.m. at the City Hall – City Council Chambers, Darien, Illinois and declared a quorum present.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Ordinance - Minor PUD Amendment to the Darien Towne Centre PUD Amvets Collection Center at Wal-Mart, 2189 75th Street: Location Change.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the City Council granted a minor amendment to the PUD to allow an Amvets Collection Center to the west of Walmart. He reported that recently, Walmart required Amvets to move their collection center to the far northwest area of the parking lot to an underutilized area of the parking lot.

Mr. Gombac reported that staff tried to work with Walmart to an adjacent location as per the ordinance, but they were not in agreement. He stated that the proposed location is an out lot and the Darien Towne Center representatives were amicable to there were no problems or concerns for the out lot.

There was no one else wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Chlystek to approve an Ordinance - Minor PUD Amendment to the Darien Towne Centre PUD Amvets Collection Center at Wal-Mart, 2189 75th Street: Location Change.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

B. Resolution - Authorizing the purchase of a Kubota Model ZD326P-60 zero turn riding mower from Russo Power Equipment Inc. in the amount of \$11,998.00.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that this resolution authorizes the purchase of a turn riding mower to be utilized to maintain 33 acres of grass cutting and various right-of-ways. He reported that the 2006 Kubota would be declared surplus property and brought forward under a separate agenda memo.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Marchese approval of a Resolution authorizing the purchase of a Kubota Model ZD326P-60 zero turn riding mower from Russo Power Equipment Inc. in the amount of \$11,998.00.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

C. Resolution - Allowing the City of Darien to perform maintenance and emergency work on City owned infrastructure on State of Illinois maintained Right-of-ways for 2015 and 2016.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that this resolution is required by the State of Illinois and allows the City of Darien to perform maintenance and emergency work on City owned infrastructure on State of Illinois maintained right of ways right-of-ways for two years, 2015 and 2016.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Chlystek approval of a Resolution allowing the City of Darien to perform maintenance and emergency work on City owned infrastructure on State of Illinois maintained Right-of-ways for 2015 and 2016.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

D. Resolution – Accepting a quote from Advanced Automation and Controls Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$14,070 for the following:

Item 1 - Updating of Water System Computer Hardware, Software and Programming - \$8,720.

Item 2 - Plant 2- Programming Logic Controller for Variable Speed Pumps - Hardware and Programming - \$5,350.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the existing computer and hardware was installed in 2008 operating on Windows XP which is no longer supported by Microsoft. He reported that the proposed purchase is for the computer hardware, software and programming. The system is a stand-alone system and is utilized to monitor and control the City's water system.

Mr. Gombac further reported that Item 2 is for updating the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system. The proposed Program Logic Controllers for the variable pumps will allow for optimal operation of the pumps. The improvement will allow for the pumps to operate at variable flow rates as the system demands. He reported that there will be additional cost saving opportunities as they relate to maintenance of equipment and energy.

Alderman Chlystek questioned staff is trained and if there is a warranty.

Mr. Gombac reported that there is a one-year warranty and the Water Plant Operators for the City are required to complete continue educating classes including SCADA operations. There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Chylstek made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Marchese to approve a Resolution accepting a quote from Advanced Automation and Controls Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$14,070 for the following:

Item 1 - Updating of Water System Computer Hardware, Software and Programming - \$8,720.

Item 2 - Plant 2-Programming Logic Controller for Variable Speed Pumps - Hardware and Programming - \$5,350.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

E. Resolution - Authorizing the Mayor to execute a contract with Patriot Pavement Maintenance Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$132,368 for the 2015 Crack Fill Program.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the resolution is for the 2015 Crack Fill Program. He reported that crack sealing is a routine maintenance treatment that delays roadway deterioration by sealing the water out of the pavement and base. Staff inventories the existing cracks approximately a year in advance and determines quantities for the crack seal program. The operation is completed on three year intervals or up to 9 years of treatment upon the resurfacing of a roadway. He further reported that severe winter conditions increases the cracks and adjusts the quantities to reflect the conditions.

Mr. Gombac reported that the references for Patriot Pavement were favorable.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion, and it was seconded by Alderman Chylstek to approve a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a contract with Patriot Pavement Maintenance Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$132,368 for the 2015 Crack Fill Program.

Upon voice vote, THE MOTION CARRIED unanimously 3-0.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that the City and the Darien Park District were denied a recent grant for Birchwood Park. He reported that Speedway and Brookhaven are working on an agreement for a cross access agreement. He stated that this will create optimal convenience between the two businesses and that Speedway would incur all costs.

Mr. Gombac reported that Darien Pointe has contracted with an outside broker for retail tenant agreements. The developers have reported there are many inquiries and no commitments. He reported that the owner of the former Phillips 66 is working with a major coffee brand retailer.

Alderman Marchese stated that the owner for Darien Pointe is not doing much for prospective businesses regarding the build out.

Mr. Gombac stated that City staff continue to work with the potential tenants.

Mr. Gombac reported that staff has been trying to schedule the painting of the speakers at Darien Pointe but there is too much rain. He also reported that the road program is behind because of the weather as well.
