#### 7. <u>RECEIVING OF COMMUNICATIONS</u>

Alderman Schauer...

...received a telephone call from Mike Magee of 1302 Iroquois regarding coyotes living under the deck of a nearby home. Mayor Weaver recommended residents watch the educational coyote video on the City's website. Alderman McIvor reminded residents that coyotes are scavengers and stressed the importance of not feeding wildlife, and to keep trash contained. She suggested residents contact Willowbrook Wildlife Center for suggestions on dealing with coyotes. Assistant Administrator Coren noted that small pets are in danger due to territorial issues, but there have been no documented attacks on humans.

Alderman Beilke...

...received a call from Jerry Haley of 516 Easy Street requesting the City expedite dealing with an unsightly, dying parkway ash tree that is infected with the Emerald Ash Borer. Director Gombac will review.

...received communication from David Siebold of 7317 Sunrise regarding an overgrowth of dandelions on City property located adjacent to his home near the High School ball field on Sunrise and Elm, and concerns regarding a parking issue. Alderman Beilke suggested Director Gombac monitor the parking on Brookbank, Evans, and Elm prior to

addressing other parking issues around the high school. In regards to the overgrowth of dandelions, Director Gombac advised that there is no budgeted line item for treatment of this and nine other City owned detention basins and large parkways. Alderman Marchese noted that many residents take care of cul de sacs and parkways with their own lawns. Alderman Beilke requested Director Gombac determine the cost of treating those properties. Administrator Vana recommended treatment pricing for the ten properties be obtained and submitted to Municipal Services Committee for review. Mayor Weaver concurred.

Alderman McIvor...

...requested Director Gombac contact the Park District to follow-up on the algae overgrowth in the Farmingdale Village ponds.

Mayor Weaver...

...thanked the Darien Chamber of Commerce, and the many volunteers for their hard work on the Darien Dash. She noted there were 442 participants, and that the event was very well organized.

Alderman Kenny...

...received communication from Joan Kielbasa of 7210 Richards, whose property backs up to Fairview in Downers Grove, regarding a problem with dandelions. Director Gombac advised that he has contacted Downers Grove regarding this problem and has not received a response.

...received communication from the resident at 7113 Summit regarding smoke from a neighbor's fire pit which is infiltrating her home. Alderman Kenny advised that there is nothing the City can do, and requested that residents be respectful of their neighbors when using fire pits.

Alderman McIvor thanked the Darien Park District for the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration.

### 8. MAYOR'S REPORT

#### A. DARIEN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE UPDATE

Clare Bongiovanni provided an update as follows:

- Welcomed new Chamber Member DiAnna McCarter of HR Concierge of Illinois.
- Announced the 14<sup>th</sup> Darien Dash was a great success, and extended gratitude to: the sponsors, volunteers, supporters of the event, Race Director Ted Schauer, the Darien Dash Committee, Steve Hiatt and the Darien Lions Club, Kris Sant, Darien VFW Post 2838, Mayor Weaver, former Citizen of the Year, Cathy Marchese. and Clare Wagner.
- Congratulated Lace School on their \$1,000 Darien Dash award for having the highest student participation.
- Congratulated the Darien Park District on their 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.
- Announced the Darien Park District will be hosting a Farmer's Market every Wednesday from June 11 through October 8, 2014.
- Announced the Darien Chamber is excited to sponsor the first concert of the summer on June 11, 2014 featuring Heartache Tonight at Darien Community Park.

Clare Bongiovanni welcomed and introduced Pat Hirshman, Debbie Sherwood, Bill Bowman, Deb Coulman, Jolene Bazon, and Comfort Dog Shami of St. John's Lutheran Church.

Pat Hirshman of the Communication Team spoke of St. John's annual events, participation in community events, and the sharing of the church with various organizations. Debbie Sherwood, Vacation Bible School Coordinator, explained the program's curriculum, activities, events, and pricing. Bill Baumann, Chairman of Elders spoke of the Early Learning Center and Safe Haven Program. Jolene Bazon spoke of the interaction between Comfort Dog Shami and the people at churches, schools, nursing homes, hospitals, special events and in disaster response situations.

Clare Bongiovanni welcomed and introduced DiAnna McCarter of HR Concierge of Illinois.

DiAnna McCarter provided her business and educational qualifications, and enumerated the services of her human resource business. She announced that, in addition to her company being the newest member of the Darien Chamber of Commerce, she has been appointed to their Board of Directors.

Alderman Kenny congratulated Clare Bongiovanni on her performance at Dancing with the Starz.

# 9. <u>CITY CLERK'S REPORT</u>

## 10. CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Vana introduced Mark Morrissey and Edward F. Paliatka of Darien Pointe, LLC, the proposed purchaser and developer of Heritage Center. Mr. Paliatka spoke of the proposed development which he feels will greatly improve the appearance and aesthetics of the area, provide a nice shopping area, and improve parking for the apartments and the center.

Assistant Administrator Coren provided an update on the City's Electric Aggregation Program, and the one year, accepted bid. He advised that the market has changed significantly, and the City was unable to get the low rate from two years ago. He noted that, as in the past, residents will have the ability to opt out at any time. The new rate will go into effect with the July, 2014 billing.

He advised that the cost savings will be monitored with the goal of street light replacement throughout the city.

#### 18. **QUESTIONS, COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS – GENERAL**

## A. DARIEN HISTORICAL SOCIETY REQUEST

Alice Brennan provided a brief history of Old Lace School and the Darien Historical Society. Debbie Kieras spoke of artifacts, archives, and programs to Warren Anderson spoke of the desire to remain a 501C3 raise awareness. organization, manage and collect artifacts, maintain Old Lace School, sponsor two annual fundraising events, budget a predictable amount of investment from the City, work with City staff on an annual budget, and allow for an annual audit of funds by the City. Dean Rodkin spoke of the benefits to the community to maintain and invest in the Darien Historical Society. Alice Brennan announced the names of the Darien Historical Society Board Members. Ms. Brennan advised that the lease arrangement between District 61 and the City is on the May 27, 2014 District 61 School Board Meeting agenda for review and discussion. Mayor Weaver stated that the City would be reluctant to invest without ownership of the property. Mayor Weaver requested Administrator Vana contact Superintendent Carlo to notify him of the City's desires. Alderman Seifert commented that he would be more inclined to invest if the City owned the property. Alice Brennan was unaware the City wanted ownership of the property and thought a 100 year lease would suffice. She clarified that the Historical Society is not asking the City to finance the \$42,000 for capital needs but is seeking an agreement for a steady revenue stream. A lengthy discussion took place on the Historical Society's need to prioritize projects, budget accordingly, set long term goals, and increase fund raising efforts. A brief discussion took place on providing an annual stipend for a specified use. Mayor Weaver suggested further discussion and review be placed on hold until District 61 makes a decision on the property. Administrator Vana

advised that he will contract District 61 to learn the topic of discussion at their meeting on May 27, 2014.

Matt Goodwin, Commander of the VFW Post 2838 announced the following events:

- Culver's will be participating in a Day of Giving fundraising effort on May 20 for the Honor Flight Chicago.
- Invited all to attend a Memorial Day remembrance ceremony at Clarendon Hills Cemetery on May 26, 2014 at 9:00 A.M.
- Invited all to attend a Memorial Day remembrance ceremony at Darien Community Park on May 26, 2014 at 11:00 A.M.

Commander Goodwin acknowledged that the VFW will be moving out of Heritage Center within the next 30 days, and thanked the City Council, Director Gombac, Administrator Vana, Assistant Administrator Coren, and City Staff for providing a home for VFW Post #2838 and for all their help and guidance.
