CITY OF DARIEN GOAL SETTING SESSION MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING November 14, 2023, 6:30pm

Present: Mayor Joseph Marchese, Alderpersons Tom Belczak, Ralph Stompanato, Eric Gustafson, Joe Kenny, Ted Schauer, Mary Sullivan, Gerry Leganski, City Administrator Bryon Vana, and Director of Municipal Services Dan Gombac, Police Chief Greg Thomas, Senior Planner Jordan Yanke and Darien Chairman of the Board - Chamber of Commerce, Andy Blumenfeld.

1. Beautification Projects

Staff advised the City has completed a number of beautification projects including roadway landscape plantings, theme lighting, banners and welcome to Darien signs. Staff confirmed the Council is interested in continuing to plan and budget for beautification projects. Staff encouraged the elected officials to submit ideas for their wards.

2. <u>Chamber Grant</u>

Staff advised that in the current fiscal year the council approved a grant of \$35,000 for the Chamber. The grant covered the chamber's current membership dues of \$30,000, potential growth of 15 new Darien business memberships totaling \$3,375, and assists in miscellaneous expenses of \$1,625. The city council approved the MOU with the chamber on February 6, 2023 by a 5-2 vote. The council discussed continuing the grant for another year. The council generally favored continuing the grant but did ask for more specific examples of how the Chamber benefited from the grant. Staff advised that this issue would be discussed at an Administrative/Finance Committee meeting and council meeting before any decision is made.

3. <u>Resident Notification System</u>

Staff advised the primary source of resident information from the PD is done on twitter. Prior to Twitter, the PD used a texting system but did not have many subscribers. Some of the elected officials asked staff to look at a texting option as a way to send out messages to the public. Chief Thomas advised that the PD would be switching to a text alert system through our web site consultants. The PD will continue to provide general information on twitter by combining with city hall Twitter account.

4. <u>Citizen Survey</u>

There was a general discussion about the survey results. Administrator Vana advised there were some responses showing people use the Next-door app for information. Vana discussed some recent Next-door posts and stated many of the posts/responses are inaccurate, malicious and slanderous. The city always welcomes any feedback whether it is positive or negative. However, there were several posts, regarding the Gerber issue, that cross the line of reasonableness these posts are all public comments, not private messages between two parties. The council concurred that a civility statement regarding social media posts would be beneficial. The Administrative/Finance Committee will discuss this issue and provide the council with a recommendation.

5. <u>Elected official survey</u>

Mayor Marchese stated that due to the late hour he and Administrator Vana would meet individually with each Alderperson to discuss their survey responses.

6. Postcard Mailer

Mayor Marchese discussed the city mailing direct flyers to residents informing them of community events and provided cost estimate for the flyer. The Alderpersons supported this concept.

The meeting adjourned at 9:18pm.

City Council Meeting

Mayor Marchese:

- Honored Tobey Panice who celebrated his 99th birthday on November 18. He highlighted milestones in Mr. Panice's life including service to our country as a World War II veteran, he was awarded a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star. Mayor Marchese stated Mr. Panice is one of Darien's finest and one of the reasons we call Darien "A nice place to live." Mr. Panice received a round of applause and standing ovation. He is looking forward to his 100th birthday.
- Stated a year ago City of Darien applied to become one of the first municipalities in DuPage County to become an EV Ready Community. He read communication from Edith Makra, Director of Environmental Initiatives, with Metropolitan Mayors Caucus regarding the EV Readiness Program. Ms. Makra highlighted Director Gombac's extensive research, hard work integrating new policies into Darien's code, documentation to EV Readiness Team, creation of new permit process for both commercial and residential EV charging installation, and volunteering his time as an expert advisor. The Darien team will be awarded a bronze plaque at a celebration on December 7, 2023. Mayor Marchese noted how proud he was of our City and thankful for Director Gombac for devoting his time in bringing this designation to our City. Director Gombac commented on the great experience and appreciation for being recognized.
- Spoke of ownership changes and meetings with new owner of Chestnut Court, Kumar Bhavanasi, and his management team regarding the redevelopment of the shopping center. He explained the petitioner would like to rezone from R-1 Single-Family Residence District to R-3 Multi-Family Residence District. The proposed preliminary plat has 17 lots with 34 total dwelling units with access from 87th Street; two proposed ingress/egress cuts for Woodland Lane, one full access and one right-in, right-out.

City Planner Yanke stated case appeared before the Planning & Zoning Commission on October 18, 2023 and received a favorable recommendation with conditions. Case appeared before Municipal Services Committee on November 1, 2023; Municipal Services Committee upheld the recommendation, but changed one of the conditions to shift structures two feet instead of five feet on certain lots. He highlighted packet contents.

City Council Meeting

Director Gombac provided clarifying comments from Municipal Services Committee meeting; he spoke of stormwater, water flow, overland flow route, 87th Street being a DuPage County roadway, no traffic control light requirement, acceleration/deceleration lanes, stormwater location, wetland treatment and best management practices for detention area.

Alderwoman Sullivan, Aldermen Gustafson, Leganski, Kenny, and Belczak inquired about shift of residences 2 feet; ability to park on both sides of the street; retaining wall; fencing; landscaping; density requirements; snow plowing/snow placement; flooding/elevation changes; lift station; retention pond; geotechnical report; right turn only on east side; sanitary manhole; slowing speed on 87th Street; culvert pipe; ability to decrease number of units; and R1 versus R3.

Mayor Marchese inquired about impact fees; Jordan Yanke responded.

Director Gombac, City Planner Yanke and developer representatives, Steve Kranenborg, Project Engineer; James Healy, Attorney; Katrina Laflin, Landscape Architect; and Scott Stevens, V.P. Donven Homes, responded to Council questions.

Several residents voiced their concerns with development of Woodland Glen subdivision, which included: proximity to neighbors, size of backyards, trespassing, noise, removing "naturalness"/changing look of neighborhood, flooding, too small of an area, too close to 87th Street, safety issues exiting, existing variance for property to the east, geotechnical report not completed, impact on wildlife, increased traffic, and need to eliminate variances.

It was moved by Alderman Belczak and seconded by Alderman Schauer to approve the motion as presented.

Director Gombac responded to questions from Alderwoman Sullivan and Alderman Stompanato regarding geotechnical report status and next steps.

Alderman Gustafson and Alderwoman Sullivan expressed their safety concerns with residents entering and exiting 87th Street, acceleration/deceleration lanes, and speed of traffic on 87th Street.

Mayor Marchese noted that same traffic/safety concerns exist across the street with no restrictions. Director Gombac stated traffic study was completed; consultant did not anticipate concerns.

November 2023

Survey Results – Police Related

From 09/14/23 through 10/01/23 the City of Darien conducted a survey where residents were asked several key questions about operations within the city. Many of those questions were related to police services. They included:

- 1. Q-13: Do you feel safe in your neighborhood during the day?
- 2. Q-14: Do you feel safe in your neighborhood during at night?
- 3. Q-15: Do you feel safe in the Darien parks?
- 4. Q-16: Do you feel that the police patrol in Darien is sufficient?
- 5. Q-17: If you answered no to any questions (13-16), what is the issue that you believe most threatens your safety or perceptions of safety?
- 6. Q-18: What are the top three things the police department should focus on over the next five years in order to keep Darien a safe community?

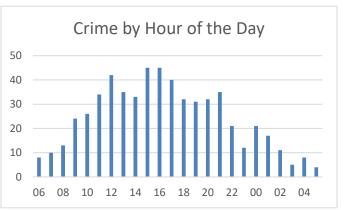
We thank the city for conducting the survey and very much appreciate the 511 respondents who completed the survey. Residents had an opportunity to write a narrative to explain their yes, no or no opinion response.

Daytime Neighborhood Safety (Q-13)

We were happy to see that nearly 96% of residents felt safe in their respective neighborhoods during daytime hours. Just over 2% felt unsafe and almost 2% had no opinion. Though only 2% of residents felt unsafe we have some work to do for everyone to feel safe.

Nighttime Neighborhood Safety (Q-14)

Residents' perception of safety changed significantly during nighttime hours where



14% of residents felt unsafe during nighttime hours versus only 2% during daytime hours. Approximately 6.5% of respondents had no opinion. Unfortunately there wasn't a lot of direction for the police department to take to address residents' perception or reality of crime at night from the narrative responses. That being said we have a desire for all to feel safe and be safe, all the time.

Here's what the data (facts) show. For this analysis we made it easy and just used 6:00am to 6:00pm for daytime and 6:00pm to 6:00am for nighttime. Approximately 61% of crime occurs during daytime hours and 39% occur at night. We average about 1.6 crimes per day, about 1 crime per day during daytime hours and 0.6 crimes per day during nighttime hours. Many crimes are not "street" crimes (e.g. domestic violence, retail theft, etc.) Again further reducing the amount of street level crime and how likely one is to be the victim of a crime.

Safety in the Parks (Q-15)

The perception of safety in the parks showed 62% felt safe, 7% unsafe and 30% had no opinion. We analyzed the three larger parks by reviewing four years of data (2020 through 2023). This is what we found:

The amount of calls were slight and most involved a belief of suspicious person, vehicle or activity. We appreciate the "see something, say something" attitude. Best to call if you think something is amiss and allow the police to investigate. The amount of crime reported was nearly non-existent. In three parks for four years there were a total of seven crimes reported. The types of crimes were theft, criminal damage to property and a domestic violence. Calls for service have decreased over time, comparing calls for service in 2020 to 2023 (1 less month) there was a 26% decrease in calls for service.

Police Patrol (Q-16)

Only 56% of residents felt the police patrols in their neighborhoods were enough, 13% felt there was not enough police patrols and 12% had no opinion. This is an interesting perception. With numbers like this we've failed whether a perception or reality. As a police department residents need to feel safe and seeing police is a part of that process. The first police related question, Q-13, showed 96% felt safe. This question (Q-16) is much lower. Does seeing the police have any relationship to feeling safe? Hard to understand based on the low number of detailed narrative responses. Not seeing the police may have to do with idea of seeing value in paying taxes – a return on investment of sorts when the police are seen in the neighborhood.

During several City Council meetings I explained changes to staffing allocations resulting in different staffing levels. This is our current situation compared to prior allocations.

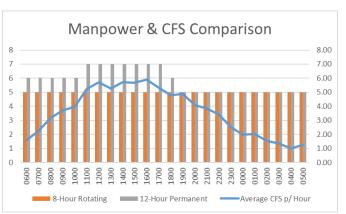

When I came to Darien we had 34 authorized positions and eight years later we continue to have 34 authorized positions. However, there is one less deputy chief (or similar position – regardless of title) and one less sergeant. There are two additional patrol officers, the sworn position that will

answer your call for service, investigate a crime, crash or concern, will take proactive actions, etc. "more on the street."

In the past we had rotating shifts. What happens with rotating shifts is you have to have a balance of officers on each shift even though one time period may have significantly less calls for service and crime and another shift may have higher crime and calls for service, but are staffed the same. In 2021 we went to permanent shifts which allows for officers to be assigned based on need – matching personnel allocations with workload.

This chart it shows the relationship between manpower by hour of the day and the average frequency of calls for service. There is a multiplier added to the frequency to account for multiple vehicle responses. There is also a multiplier added to ensure adequate policing for preventative patrol. You see by the graph that our manpower is sufficient. There are times that bad things happen that more officers are needed than we have on patrol. There are options, for



such instances, mutual aid, back up from surrounding agencies, Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System (ILEAS), etc.

There was a number of times last year that alderman would discuss comments from constituents about not seeing the police. I asked our County IT personnel to look at a street where the public commented on never seeing the police. I was able to demonstrate, looking at our GPS signals from patrol cars that, though the public said there were no patrols, there were police patrolling, in fact one squad drove the street three times in one shift when community said zero.

Threats to Safety (Q-17)

I reviewed the narrative responses and tried, best I could, to quantify them. Unfortunately most respondents to the survey wrote "crime" or "safety" or "traffic" with no detail. Some said things like gangs, robberies, etc. Some answers to concerns may be found in Question 18 Crime and Safety discussion to follow.

Focus of Keep Darien Safe (Q-18)

Reading through the responses three areas for the police department stood out. They were:

- 1. Communication
 - a. Notification (Texting Service)
 - b. Community Outreach
- 2. Visibility & Staffing
- 3. Crime & Safety

Notification

Survey comments were plentiful regarding the desire to have a notification system via text messaging. In the past we had such a system called Nixle. Unfortunately only 390 residents made use of Nixle. We opted to move to Twitter (X) and have over 2,400 followers and sometimes, depending on the posting, the Tweet gets retweeted – reaching an even larger audience. However, we continue to hear from the public and elected officials of the need for text messaging. Beginning early 2024 we will have a text notification system.

We'll put out text messages regarding emergency or urgent need to know items such as road blockage due to accidents, major events and safety concerns – robberies, residential burglaries, etc. We'll continue to use X, but tweets will be for outreach matters – Library Discussion, Cop on Top, Coffee with a Cop, Shop with a Hero, National Night Out and other outreach activities and public service announcements.

Community Outreach

We've been involved in many community engagement activities. We belong to a group called Unity Partnership. UP was started due to Sandra Bland, a black woman from Lisle who died while in police custody in Texas following a traffic stop. We continue to interact with this organization. One of our hopes with the organization was to have many conversations with the community on the topic of policing.

We are extremely proud of our officers who have donated their time, finances and skills. There are many examples, Movember saw \$1,500 raised for men's health. This month eight officers are donating time and money for children to have an opportunity to Shop with a Hero (police officer or fire fighter). At many events you may have attended such as National Night Out, Coffee with a Cop, etc. most of those officers were off-duty, not receiving overtime or other compensation.

We conduct several community talks. This year the Indian Prairie Public Library asked us to participate in a monthly safety dialogue. We started the discussions beginning in September. We continue to meet with neighborhood groups, social clubs and have events including Coffee with a Cop, Cop on Top, Shop with a Hero, Movember, National Night Out, Faith in Blue and others. We've used social media – Twitter and Facebook. We've been invited to various faith-based groups. For example, we attended an event on behalf of the Dawoodi Bohra Muslim community of Chicago located in Willowbrook on November 14th. The Muslim community hails from India, Pakistan and East Africa. Several police agencies were present for lunch, interacting and learning about their culture and religion

Visibility & Staffing

Visibility and staffing was discussed relative to question 16 – police patrols.

Crime & Safety

We group our efforts into three categories: crime, crashes and concerns. I reviewed the responses relative to safety to attempt to quantify the written responses. However, the lack of detail made it difficult.

I looked at crime as defined by Uniformed Crime Reports (UCR) standards back 27 years and it shows that crime is at an alltime low. The farthest back I could find data was 1996. I tried to look at every five years.

Because of the change from one method of counting crime UCR and National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) it is difficult to track crime over time. This

graph shows prior years data compared to 2023 using NIBRS data. Demonstrating that total crime continues to decrease.

Again the feedback is important and appreciated. You should, and can, have your say on police matters. We're available to have discussions at many various public meetings we have, that include: Cop on Top, Coffee with a Cop, National Night Out, Library, Neighborhood Meetings, etc.

Please review the monthly and annual reports that are put together as they give a lot of good information relative to crime, crashes and concerns as well as operations.

There is a lot the public can do to protect themselves.

Regarding thefts, our most frequent crime type, most were due to unsecure property.

Fraud is the next most frequent crime type. Here too there are means not to be a victim. We hosted a seminar at the Indian Prairie Library in October to discuss how not to be a victim.

Domestic battery & assaults and abuse is a terrible situation. To harm a loved one is bad. However, in context of being safe in the community, these offenses are not directed toward the masses, it is specifically directed to a family member. If this is you we're here to help. If it is not you, again in context of fear level of crime, this is not a "street" crime and this number doesn't impact the level of your "public" safety.

When we hear of the crimes on the news and about larger cities and the spill over into the suburbs we tend to get more fearful. It is important to take it into context. Understand that we're fearful and use that fear to be cautious, but not to isolate oneself and not enjoy life.

We perform a number of crime prevention / pro-active activities to try to ensure safety. We conducted, year to date, 7,365 proactive calls for service – traffic stops, checked suspicious persons, vehicles & circumstances, performed extra patrols, vacation watches, etc.

This month, based on data and previously reported areas of concern we deployed several Directed Patrols. Here is a snapshot of these areas and results. Again, these Directed Patrols were not generated due to a citizen's concern as documented at the end of this monthly report.

In our course of police work we also utilize the philosophy of Community-Oriented Policing (COP). Every contact is a COP contact and officer have visited lemonade stands, fixed bicycle chain, motorist assist, etc.

Crashes

I took a look at crashes as well. We need some type of measure of driving safety and crashes is one means of doing that. Crashes too have dropped from prior years. With our system I was able to look at data back to 2015 (8 years).



Concerns

On the last page of the Monthly Report we document the numerous citizen complaints that come to our attention through residents calling, resident talking to their alderman and the alderman talking to us, etc. Included in the reporting is what occurred, the frequency we were there, the number of minutes we were there, the number of stops and citations issued, etc.

Events

Library Community Discussion

There was a meeting held at Indian Prairie Public Library on Wednesday, December 6th at 10:00 am. The topic discussed was about self-protection. The meeting took place in the Board Room which is on the second floor of Indian Prairie Library. There were nine attendees interacting with Officer Rundell and Deputy Chief Norton who put together the presentation, on a community driven topic of self-protection. Discussions included situational awareness, see something say something, prevention, tools of protection and stress inoculation.

The next community discussion will be on Wednesday, January 3^{rd,} 2024 at 10:00 am again in the Board Room on the second floor of the library (<u>https://ippl.libcal.com/event/10650599</u>). The topic for this meeting is proposed to be fire safety. We are arranging to have a member of the fire department present this topic. Again, thank you to Indian Prairie Public Library and Marquitta Harris for hosting and putting these meetings together.

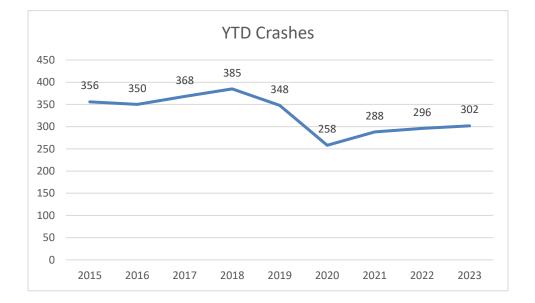

In 2016 the City Council passed ordinance O-12-16 amending the liquor code by periodically auditing the number of licenses in several classes so that there are no (open) licenses available that are not assigned to a particular business. The liquor licenses are updated as new requests are generated from businesses.

Mayor Marchese received a request from Jam n' Jelly restaurant for a sale and serve liquor license for on-site consumption only. The license required for the request is a D License and would increase the number of D licenses from twelve (12) to thirteen (13). Mayor Marchese as Liquor Commissioner has indicated he supports the request.

3-3-7: CLASSIFICATION OF LICENSES AND FEES:



3-3-7-1: CLASS A LICENSE:

(A) A Class A license shall authorize sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale. Provided, however, that the Commissioner may authorize the licensed premises to offer liquor samples without charge to invitees as part of a promotional or advertising program. The granting of permission to give away such liquor samples shall be within the sole discretion of the Commissioner who shall be petitioned in writing to allow such a promotional or advertising prior to the date upon which such activity is proposed to take place. It shall be unlawful for such an advertising or promotional activity to take place without the prior permission of the Commissioner.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M.

(C) The number of Class A licenses shall be ten (10).

(D) The annual fee for a Class A license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994; amd. Ord. 0-12-16, 4-4-2016; Ord. 0-03-17, 4-3-2017; Ord. 0-16-20, 8-3-2020; Ord. O-16-22, 8-1-2022)

3-3-7-2: CLASS B LICENSE:

(A) The Class B license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a banquet hall or similar facility (where the predominant purpose of the premises is the holding of private or limited parties or events) only for consumption on the premises of the sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating a banquet hall or similar facility on the premises. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and it shall be unlawful to serve alcoholic liquor on the premises of such facility in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and to serve alcoholic liquor on the premises of sale in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-19-03, 4-21-2003)

- (C) The annual fee for a Class B license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).
- (D) The number of Class B licenses shall be one (1). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-3: CLASS C LICENSE:

(A) A Class C license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor for a country club (public/semipublic/private) only for consumption on the premises of the sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating a country club on the premises. Serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar shall be allowed under a Class C license to seated customers only. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail and it shall be unlawful to serve alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail and to serve alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-24-14, 7-7-2014)

(C) The annual fee for a Class C license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).

(D) The number of Class C licenses shall be one (1).

(E) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-4: CLASS D LICENSE:

(A) A Class D license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables, provided such operation is carried on in conjunction with a restaurant operation serving a menu offering complete meals. The bar service or service at tables where a full menu is not available shall take place in a separate room from the full menu restaurant operation.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class D liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor under a Class D liquor license between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

(C) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only.

(D) The number of Class D licenses shall be twelve (12).

(E) The annual fee for a Class D license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994; amd. Ord. 0-16-13, 8-5-2013; Ord. 0-05-17, 4-3-2017; Ord. O-06-21, 5-3-2021; Ord. O-02-23, 3-6-2023; Ord. O-21-23, 11-6-2023)

3-3-7-5: CLASS E LICENSE:

(A) A Class E license shall authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package only but not for consumption on the premises of sale. Such license shall be authorized only at such location where prepackaged food is also sold and only in such locations where there are no seats for consumption of food on the premises. (Ord. 0-18-09, 6-15-2009)

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail any beer or wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale any beer or wine at retail in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale between the hours of one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. (Ord. 0-41-08, 11-17-2008)

(C) The number of Class E licenses shall be four (4). (Ord. 0-07-12, 2-21-2012; amd. Ord. 0-16-20, 8-3-2020)

(D) The annual fee for a Class E license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-6: CLASS F LICENSE:

(A) A Class F license shall only authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine for consumption at tables on the premises of sale provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of serving food on the premises or on a carryout basis. Beer shall be sold only by the glass or pitcher. Wine shall be sold only by glass or carafe.

(B) The serving of beer or wine for consumption while seated at a counter or bar shall not be permitted under a Class F license.

(C) Delivery of beer or wine by the license holder or his employees with carryout orders shall not be permitted under a Class F license.

(D) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale beer or wine in conjunction with a Class F liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale beer or wine under a Class F liquor license between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of beer and wine on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

(E) A Class F liquor license, where issued, shall be for an establishment which caters principally to elementary aged schoolchildren and their families. Entertainment in the form of theatrical or musical presentations directed toward children and their families shall be permitted within such an establishment. The use of automatic amusement devices shall be allowed at such an establishment to the extent that they are otherwise permitted by the ordinances of the City.

(F) The number of Class F licenses shall be one (1).

(G) The annual fee for a Class F license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-7: CLASS G LICENSE:

(A) A Class G license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package for consumption off the premises and for consumption on the premises of sale. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. and on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-22-14, 7-7-2014)

- (C) The number of Class G licenses shall be one (1).
- (D) The annual fee for a Class G license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-8: CLASS H LICENSE:

(A) A Class H license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises and the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of the sale of food on a carryout basis.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

(C) The number of Class H licenses shall be two (2). (Ord. 0-12-17, 7-17-2017)

(D) The annual fee for a Class H license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-9: CLASS I LICENSE:

(A) A Class I license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of operating an approved amusement premises for which all permits have been previously granted by the City Council. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer to sell at retail or serve for consumption on the premises alcoholic liquor in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., and on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., and on Sundays when it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail or serve for consumption on the premises in the City between two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-41-08, 11-17-2008)

- (C) The number of Class I licenses shall be one (1).
- (D) The annual fee for a Class I license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-10: CLASS J LICENSE:

Temporary license, daily fee.

(A) A Class J license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption only at the location and on the specified dates designated for the special event in the license. Such temporary liquor licenses may be granted to organizations and clubs such as, but not limited to, veterans' organizations, educational, fraternal, political, civic, religious or other nonprofit organizations.

(B) A Class J license shall be granted on a day to day basis, but not to exceed three (3) consecutive days. The Class J license shall authorize the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption only at the location until twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight on Friday and Saturday and until nine o'clock (9:00) P.M. on Sunday. An applicant for a temporary liquor license must submit with the application proof satisfactory to the Commissioner that the applicant shall provide dramshop liability insurance in the maximum limits. (Ord. 0-27-16, 8-1-2016)

(C) The fee for a Class J license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day. (Ord. 0-39-94, 9-19-1994)

3-3-7-11: CLASS K LICENSE:

(A) A Class K license shall authorize the sale at retail of beer and wine for consumption on the premises of sale or at tables, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of serving food on the premises or on a carryout basis.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale beer or wine in conjunction with a Class K liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale beer or wine under a Class K liquor license between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of beer and wine on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

(C) The number of Class K licenses shall be four (4).

(D) The annual fee for a Class K license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00).

3-3-7-12: CLASS L LICENSE:

(Rep. by Ord. 0-37-12, 10-15-2012)

3-3-7-13: CLASS M LICENSE:

(A) A Class M license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables in premises operated by a nonprofit organization for members of the organization, their guests, and public patrons. The sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor shall be limited to the premises.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class M liquor license between eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

- (C) The number of Class M licenses shall be one. (Ord. 0-12-18, 5-7-2018)
- (D) The annual fee for a Class M license shall be one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

(E) All proceeds and profits made pursuant to the operation of a business activity under this license shall be for a lawful nonprofit organization. No officer or owner of any licensee under this section shall individually receive any remuneration or compensation from the business activities pursuant to this license. (Ord. 0-26-13, 10-7-2013)

3-3-7-14: CLASS N LICENSE:

(A) A Class N license shall authorize the on premises consumption and retail sale of craft beer where the premises is that of a brewing facility. For the purposes of this subsection, "brewing facility" is defined as a place in which the primary business is the manufacturing, packaging, distribution, sale and storage of craft beer produced on the premises in compliance with Federal and State laws. The following regulations shall apply to the Class N license:

1. No more than a total of fifty thousand (50,000) gallons of beer shall be sold at retail in growlers, cans and/or bottles

for off premises consumption per year.

2. All growlers, cans and beers sold at retail for off premises consumption must be properly sealed.

3. Retail sales for off premises consumption and on premises consumption shall be limited to the retail portion of the licensed premises; except, however, on premises consumption may be allowed in other areas of the licensed premises during supervised tours and private events. The retail portion of the licensed premises shall not exceed three thousand (3,000) square feet.

4. Product sampling shall be permitted in accordance with State law, at no charge.

5. Patrons under twenty one (21) years of age shall be allowed on the premises when accompanied by a person twenty one (21) years of age or older; except, however, classes and seminars on alcoholic related subjects shall only be open to patrons twenty one (21) years and older.

6. Live entertainment is restricted to the indoor retail portion of the premises; except, however, live entertainment may be permitted in other indoor areas of the licensed premises during private events. (Ord. 0-34-14, 11-3-2014)

(B) It shall only be lawful to sell at retail or offer for sale at retail craft beer in conjunction with a Class N liquor license for off premises and/or on premises consumption between twelve o'clock (12:00) noon and eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M., Sunday through Saturday. Except, however, private events shall not be restricted to the above hours. For private events it shall be unlawful to sell or serve craft beer between the hours of one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or serve craft beer between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours of lawful sale or service of craft beer on special occasions such as New Year's Eve. (Ord. 0-16-16, 5-16-2016)

(C) The number of Class N licenses shall be one.

(D) The annual fee for a Class N license shall be two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00). (Ord. 0-34-14, 11-3-2014)

3-3-7-15: CLASS O LICENSE:

(A) A Class O license shall authorize the sale at retail and serving of alcoholic liquor at a counter or bar and at tables, provided such operation is carried on in conjunction with a restaurant operation serving a menu offering complete meals. The bar service or service at tables where a full menu is not available shall take place in a separate room from the full menu restaurant operation.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor in conjunction with a Class O liquor license between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M., except on Saturdays and Sundays when it shall be unlawful for anyone to sell or offer for sale alcoholic liquor under a Class O liquor license between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

(C) Live music shall be permitted. Such music may be provided by a band, musical group or an individual playing an instrument. No person providing such music shall be under the age of eighteen (18). Such music shall be for the dancing or listening pleasure of patrons only.

(D) The number of Class O licenses shall be one.

(E) The annual fee for a Class O license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-21-15, 6-15-2015)

3-3-7-16: CLASS P LICENSE:

(A) A Class P license shall authorize the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises and the sale at retail of beer and wine in original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale, provided such sale and serving is accessory to the main purpose of the sale of food on a carryout basis.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale at retail in the City between one o'clock (1:00) A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. The Commissioner may extend the hours for lawful sale and service of alcoholic liquor on special occasions such as New Year's Eve.

(C) The number of Class P licenses shall be two (2).

(D) The annual fee for a Class P license shall be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00). (Ord. 0-12-17, 7-17-2017; amd. Ord. 0-15-22, 8-1-2022)

3-3-7-17: CLASS Q LICENSE:

(A) A Class Q license shall authorize sale at retail wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale where the premises is a gift shop operated by a not-for-profit religious organization and for the benefit of said religious organization. Provided, however, that the Liquor Commissioner may authorize the licensed premises to offer wine tastings at up to four (4) special events per year. The granting of permission to hold such wine tastings shall be within the sole discretion of the Commissioner who shall be petitioned in writing to allow such a wine tasting at least three (3) days prior to the date upon which the wine tasting is proposed to take place. It shall be unlawful for a wine tasting to take place without the prior permission of the Commissioner.

(B) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer to sell at retail any wine in the original package but not for consumption on the premises of sale in the City between one minute past twelve o'clock (12:01) A.M. and seven o'clock

(7:00) A.M.

(C) The number of Class Q licenses shall be one (1).

(D) The annual fee for a Class Q license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). (Ord. 0-28-19, 11-4-2019)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3-3-7-4(D) OF THE DARIEN CITY CODE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> Section 3-3-7-4(D) "Class D License", as amended is hereby amended to increase the number of Class D licenses from twelve (12) to thirteen (13), to read as follows:

3-3-7-4: CLASS D LICENSE:

(D) The number of Class D licenses shall be thirteen (13).

SECTION 2: Home Rule. This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent of the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

<u>SECTION 3: Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

PLANNING OVERVIEW/DISCUSSION

The subject property was platted in 1977 and is part of the Brookeridge Creek Subdivision. The parcel is improved with a single-family residence. The property slopes toward its rear where a wetland feature (creek) and floodplain exist. These natural features do not impact the proposal. According to the submitted application and site plan, the petitioner is proposing a garage expansion by adding a third bay.

The proposed garage expansion would result in a corner side yard setback of 17.5' from the parcel's southern property line that curves along Creekside Lane. The underlying zoning district (R-2) has a corner side yard setback of 15' regularly, but the subject lot was approved under an ordinance (O-25-77) specifying a 25' corner side yard setback for the property. Thus, the expansion requires approval of a variance and the result would be a 7.5' encroachment into the required 25' setback.

Site Plan Review & Findings of Fact

City staff has reviewed the petitioner submitted documents and staff does not have any review comments on the site plan. The submittals include a *justification narrative* and description of the request. For reference, the set of criteria the Planning and Zoning Commission votes on for this request is included below:

Variation Criteria:

The City may grant variations based on the finding-of-fact that supports the following criteria outlined below by the City to be the most relevant to the subject property situation.

- a) The property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations in the zone.
- b) The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances.
- c) The variation if granted will not alter the essential character of the locality.
- d) Essential Need: The owner would suffer substantial difficulty or hardship and not mere inconvenience or a decrease in financial gain if the variation is not granted.
- e) Problem with Property: There is a feature of the property such as slope or shape or change made to the property, which does not exist on neighboring properties, which makes it unreasonable for the owner to make the proposed improvement in compliance with this title. Such feature or change was not made by the current owner and was not known to the current buyer at the time of purchase.
- f) Smallest Solution: There is no suitable or reasonable way to redesign the proposed improvements without incurring substantial difficulty or hardship or reduce the amount of variation required to make such improvements.
- g) Create Neighbor Problem: The variation, if granted, will not cause a substantial difficulty,

undue hardship, unreasonable burden, or loss of value to the neighboring properties.

- *h)* Create Community Problem: The variation, if granted, may result in the same or similar requests from other property owners within the community, but will not cause an unreasonable burden or undesirable result within the community.
- *i)* Net Benefit: The positive impacts to the community outweigh the negative impacts.
- *j)* Sacrifice Basic Protections: The variation, if granted, will comply with the purposes and intent of this title set forth in subsection 5A-1-2(A) of this title and summarized as follows: to lessen congestion, to avoid overcrowding, to prevent blight, to facilitate public services, to conserve land values, to protect from incompatible uses, to avoid nuisances, to enhance aesthetic values, to ensure an adequate supply of light and air, and to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

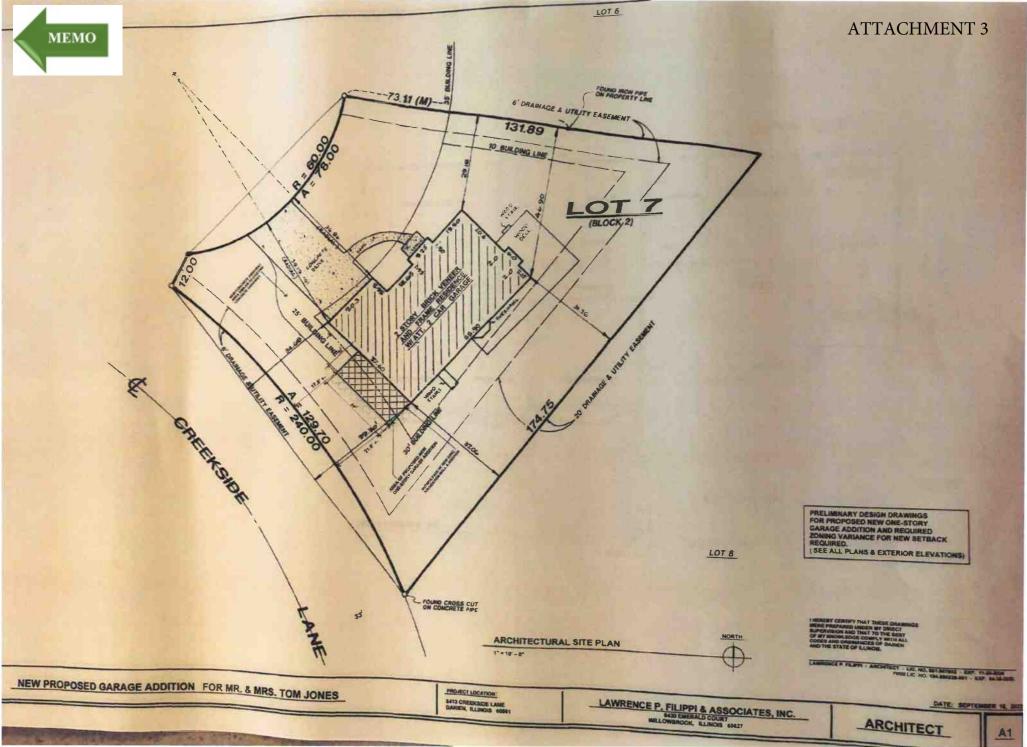
We are applying for this variation to enable us to add and additional (third) bay to our current 2 car garage to be used for parking, and additional storage.

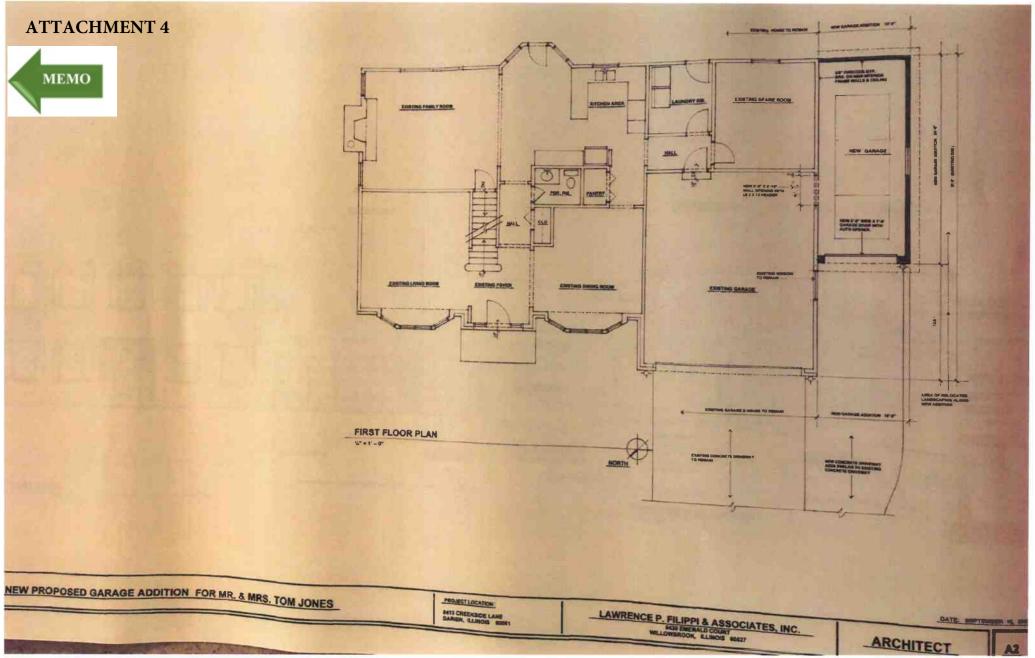
We believe the addition will NOT negatively alter the character of our locality, BUT will actually improve the aesthetic and financial value of our home and those homes near to our property.

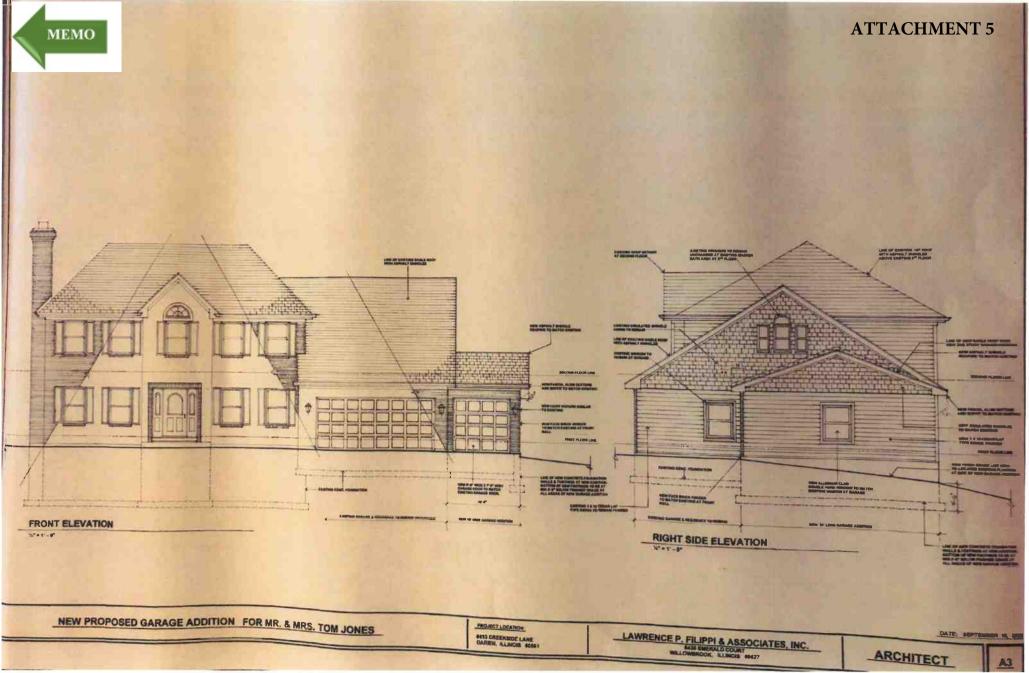
We see no problems that could be created for neighboring properties. There are multiple homes in our area, including 2 of our neighbors, with 3 car garages

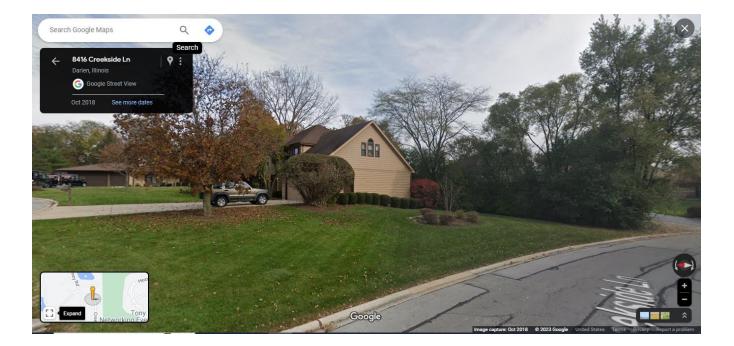

PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION MEETING

Wednesday, November 15, 2023

PRESENT: Lou Mallers – Chairperson, Robert Erickson, Chris Jackson, Shari Gillespie, Chris Green, John Johnson, Julie Kasprowicz

ABSENT: Bryan Gay, Hilda Gonzalez

OTHER: Jordan Yanke - City Planner

Chairperson Lou Mallers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Darien City Hall, Council Chambers, 1702 Plainfield Road, Darien, Illinois. Chairperson Mallers declared a quorum present and swore in the audience members wishing to present public testimony.

Regular Meeting – New Business

a. Public Hearing – PZC2023-10 - 8413 Creekside Lane – Variation Petitioner Thomas Jones seeks approval of a variation from City Code Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the Zoning Ordinance. The petition specifically requests to allow for an addition to an existing single-family residence, with the addition being a garage expansion. Property is located within the R-2 Single-Family Residence Zoning District and the variation request is to the following standard in the R-2 District of the City of Darien Zoning Ordinance:- Section 5A-7-2-6 (A): Variation request to reduce the required corner side yard setback.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that the subject property was platted in 1977 and is part of the Brookeridge Creek Subdivision. He reported that the parcel is improved with a single-family residence and that the property slopes toward its rear where a wetland feature (creek) and floodplain exist and that the natural features do not impact the proposal.

Mr. Yanke reported that the petitioner is proposing a garage expansion by adding a third bay which would result in a corner side yard setback of 17.5' from the parcel's southern property line that curves along Creekside Lane. He reported that the underlying zoning district (R-2) has a corner side yard setback of 15' regularly, but the subject lot was approved under an ordinance specifying a 25' corner side yard setback for the property and that the approval of a variance would be a 7.5' encroachment into the required 25' setback.

Commissioner Julie Kasprowicz questioned if the petitioner would need to build upward.

The petitioners Mr. Thomas Jones and Mr. Lawrence Fluppl, architect reported that they are keeping the garage floor slant and keeping the same as the two-car garage. He stated that there will be a slight berm and slight drop.

Commissioner Chris Green questioned the reason for the change in setback.

Mr. Yanke reported that the intention and best guess was it was there to maintain a relative distance to Creekside Lane.

Mr. Yanke reported that there is a 6 ft easement that was not on the original plat and that the petitioner would have to do the necessary erosion control.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Jackson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Green to recommend approval of a variation from City Code Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the Zoning Ordinance. The petition specifically requests to allow for an addition to an existing single-family residence, with the addition being a garage expansion. Property is located within the R-2 Single-Family Residence Zoning District and the variation request is to the following standard in the R-2 District of the City of Darien Zoning Ordinance:- Section 5A-7-2-6 (A): Variation request to reduce the required corner side yard setback.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

 Public Hearing – PZC2023-11 (PAGE 28) 2019 75TH Street, 7906 Cass Avenue, and 8226 Cass Avenue – Special Use Petitioner USAgain, LLC requests approval of a special use pursuant to Section 5A-2-2-6 of the City Zoning Code. The petition specifically requests to allow for the placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties. Properties are within the B-2 Community Shopping Center Business District, B3 General Business District, and the Office (0) District.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that the petitioner is requesting approval for placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties in the City. He reported that while the zoning ordinance does not directly regulate such use, staff has determined the request requires approval of a special use.

Mr. Yanke reported that the petitioner elected to submit a bundled application, meaning the special use request includes three properties. He reported that the most comparable case and proposal in the City's past is AMVETS, which is in the parking lot outside of Walmart and required zoning approval. He further reported that the petitioner submitted a justification narrative with a detailed description of the project, in addition to findings of fact that would support the application request.

Mr. Andrew Proctor, petitioner USAgain, LLC stated that they operate in 13 states. He stated that the corporate headquarters is in West Chicago and that there is a growing need for locations.

Chairperson Lou Mallers questioned how frequently the bins are looked at to make sure they are not overflowing.

Mr. Proctor stated that they pick up once a week or can do more if needed. He stated that there is a sensor inside the bin which notifies the staff and they can also place cameras. He further stated that they work with the property owner and they get used a lot but do not cause traffic. Mr. Proctor stated that if there is site that doesn't work that they would be happy to look at another location if needed.

Commissioner Gillespie stated that she liked the tree program. The petitioner stated that they could plant the trees in Darien. She questioned what happens once the donations are made.

Mr. Proctor stated that the items get shipped to a location where they get bailed and place in a shipping container. He stated that they work through a broker and then they get sold to thrift shops. He further stated that they are sold 25 percent in the US and 75 percent international.

Commissioner Julie Kasprowicz questioned if there is theft and lighting.

Mr. Proctor stated that they do not experience theft in Illinois but more in San Francisco. He stated that they do not have lights on the small containers. He further stated that the lease with the landlord is one year and that they are making a little revenue but no concerns.

Mr. Chris Jackson questioned the parking spot for the container.

Mr. Yanke reported that the container does take up a parking space but that the sites still meet the minimum parking requirements. He reported that there are no building codes applicable but that the PZC could suggest that the City do final inspections on placement.

There was some conversation regarding the pickup.

Mr. Proctor stated that they could get there within 24-36 hours.

Chairperson Mallers opened the meeting to anyone wishing to present public comment.

Ms. Barb Herber, stated that she lived behind KinderCare. She stated that she has no cooperation from the KinderCare. She further stated that there are trucks coming in and out in the middle of the night and that having another bin is going to be a problem. Ms. Herber stated that she did not think KinderCare was a good location. She suggested a church or grocery store location.

Chairperson Mallers suggested that KinderCare put in a chain link.

There was no one else wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Johnson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Green to recommend approval of a special use pursuant to Section 5A-2-2-6 of the City Zoning Code. The petition specifically requests to allow for the placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties. Properties are within the B-2 Community Shopping Center Business District, B3 General Business District, and the Office (O) District Variation. The recommendation is subject to the following condition:

1. Donation bin areas shall be kept clean on properties.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

Regular Meeting – Old Business

a. Public Hearing – PZC2023-06 – Mixed-Use District Text Amendment Petition from the City of Darien to amend the Zoning Ordinance (i.e. Text Amendment) to create a Mixed-Use Zoning District.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that he presented the PZC with some of the comments and brought it back to move it forward. He reported that he will bring it back for a final reading in December with final comments submitted to him before Thanksgiving then to the City Council.

Mr. Yanke reported that there were some comments and recommendations on prohibited uses.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Jackson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Gillespie to continue the Public Hearing – PZC2023-06 – Mixed-Use District Text Amendment Petition from the City of Darien to amend the Zoning Ordinance (i.e. Text Amendment) to create a Mixed-Use Zoning District.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

WHEREAS, the City of Darien is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, as a home rule unit of local government, the City may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government except as limited by Article VII, Section 6; and

WHEREAS, the property legally described in Section 1 (the "Subject Property"), is zoned R-2 Single-Family Residence District pursuant to the Darien Zoning Ordinance;

WHEREAS, on September 6, 1977, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. O-25-77, "An Ordinance Annexing a Certain Territory to the City of Darien", which imposed a corner side yard setback of 25 feet for the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner has requested approval of a variation from the terms of the Darien Zoning Ordinance, Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the City Code and Ordinance No. O-25-77, to allow for the construction of a third bay addition to an attached garage on the Subject Property, which has a corner side yard setback of 17.5 feet; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice as required by law, the City's Planning and Zoning Commission conducted a public hearing on November 15, 2023, and has forwarded its findings and recommendation of approval of this petition to the City Council; and ORDINANCE NO.

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2023, the City's Municipal Services Committee reviewed the petition and has forwarded its recommendation of approval of this petition to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the findings and recommendations described

above and now determines to grant the petition subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations

described herein below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Subject Property. This Ordinance is limited and restricted to the property

generally located at 8413 Creekside Lane, Darien, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

LOT 7 IN BLOCK 2 IN BROOKERIDGE CREEK, A SUBDIVISION OF LOT 3 IN AUSTIN TALBERT'S ASSESSMENT PLAT OF PART OF THE SOUTH EAST ¹/₄ OF SECTION 32 AND THE SOUTH WEST ¹/₄ OF SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 11, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT OF SAID BROOKERIDGE CREEK RECORDED FEBRUARY 1, 1978 AS DOCUMENT R78-09239, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

SECTION 2: Variation Granted. A variation is hereby granted from the Zoning Ordinance, Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the City Code and Ordinance No. O-25-77, to allow for the construction of a third bay addition to an attached garage on the Subject Property, which has a corner side yard setback of 17.5 feet instead of the required 25 feet.

SECTION 3: Home Rule. This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a)

contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent of the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supercede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

<u>SECTION 4: Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

PLANNING OVERVIEW/DISCUSSION

The petitioner has requested approval for placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties in the City. While the zoning ordinance does not directly regulate such use, staff has determined the request requires approval of a special use. The petitioner elected to submit a bundled application, meaning the special use request includes the three (3) properties referenced above and in the attachments. The most comparable case and proposal in the City's past is AMVETS, which is located in the parking lot outside of Walmart and required zoning approval.

The petitioner submitted a *justification narrative* with a detailed description of the project, in addition to *findings of fact* that would support the application request. Those items are attached to this memo along with the proposed site plans and other supporting documents. For reference, the set of criteria the Planning and Zoning Commission votes on for the special use request is included below.

Special Use Criteria:

No special use shall be recommended to the City Council by the Plan Commission, nor approved by the City Council, unless findings of fact have been made on those of the following factors which relate to the special use being sought:

- 1. That the special use is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location specified.
- 2. That the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the special use will not be detrimental

to, or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare.

- 3. That the special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.
- 4. That the establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
- 5. That the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of any proposed structure will not be at variation with either the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of the structures already constructed or in the course of construction in the immediate neighborhood or the character of the applicable district, as to cause a substantial depreciation in the property values within the neighborhood.
- 6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
- 7. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
- 8. That the special use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the City Council pursuant to the recommendations of the Plan Commission and Planning and Development Committee.

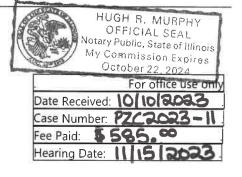

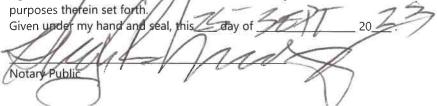

To achieve these goals, we collaborate with businesses, schools, municipalities, retail chains, property management companies, malls, to place our TreeMachines and Clothing Drop Spots in these locations. We also educate municipalities about the importance of recycling and promote USAgain through local marketing and community events. We actively engage with local causes, give presentations, and hold classes at local schools to influence and educate the younger generation – Generation C. By instilling environmental awareness and knowledge for the younger generation, USAgain is creating a future generation that is equipped to address to the challenges of global warming and climate change.

Therefore, as part of our continued expansion we are seeking a special use permit from the Community Development Department to allow us to place four TreeMachines in the City of Darien in each of the following locations: 8109 S. Cass Avenue, 8226 S. Cass Avenue, 7906 S. Cass Avenue, and 2019 75th Street. Strategically placing the four TreeMachines in the specified locations is deemed necessary for the public convenience, as it will provide the residents of Darien with accessible and convenient recycling options for their unwanted clothes and shoes. As a result, this effort will help divert these items from the United States landfills and contribute to environmental sustainability. Residents will no longer need to go out of their way to find recycling facilities, as these bins will be conveniently located in areas, they already frequent, increasing the likelihood of them participating in the recycling process. Our TreeMachines have played a crucial role in allowing us to be successful in collecting a significant amount of clothes and shoes. In 2022, USAgain collected 38.7 million pounds of used clothes and shoes. By the end of 2023, we expect to collect 45 million pounds, and our goal for 2024 is to collect 55 million pounds. As a for-profit company with a strong environmental profile, we set ourselves apart by going beyond just mere collection efforts. We combat global warming and climate while also supporting communities in need. Through our partnership with the nonprofit organization Trees for the Future, we plant a tree every time a TreeMachine bin is filled with clothes. Since 2013, we have planted a total of one million trees, positively

impacting communities in developing countries in sub-Saharan regions. The addition of four more TreeMachines in the City of Darien can help us achieve that goal. Through our collective efforts, we actively reduce the demand for manufacturing and minimize greenhouse gas emissions from the textile industry. By doing so, we effectively combat global warming and climate change. Additionally, this translates into a reduced need for extracting natural resources such as water, land, and raw materials that are required for textile manufacturing.

The USAgain TreeMachine ("clothing donation bin") provides a convenient and nonintrusive method for the general public to donation clothes and shoes. It occupies one parking space, does not require any utility hook ups, and is serviced/maintained on a weekly basis. USAgain has a lease agreement with the property owner to place the TreeMachine on the property for one year with the option to renew. The property owner also selects the parking space to ensure minimal if any impact to the property's current operations.

2. That the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the special use will not be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare.

The four TreeMachines will not be detrimental or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare. The TreeMachine is constructed to function safely, they are constructed from durable metal with the dimensions of 6.5'H x 3.75' W x 3.75'D, which have been chosen to minimize any negative impact of the immediate vicinity. To facilitate easy donations, residents place their items inside the TreeMachine by effortlessly lifting a handle, which then drops the donation securely in the bin. The exterior architectural design of the TreeMachine is painted white and green along with a USAgain logo decal, making sure it's in harmony with the existing structures in the neighborhood and the character of the applicable district.

Because USAgain services/maintains the TreeMachine on a weekly basis, we address any maintenance or operation needs in a timely manner. Our site hosts also report any issues immediately to USAgain operational staff to report any issues and we typically are able to address them the same day with our regional staff on the ground.

3. That the special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.

To ensure that the TreeMachines are in good condition and are properly functioning, each bin is maintained regularly by USAgain staff either daily, weekly, or as needed when bins are filled with donations. Once the bins are filled with donations, it is collected and transported to the West Chicago warehouse by USAgain drivers. To address potential concerns, each TreeMachine includes a 24-hour phone line where the public can report any instances of donations placed outside the bin or if they notice the bin is full. Upon receiving such reports, we dispatch one of our staff to the location within 24 to 36 hours. Their responsibilities include cleaning the area and collecting any donations left outside the TreeMachine and any other improper disposals nearby to maintain cleanliness and prevent contamination. In addition,

regular inspections and repairs will be done by USAgain welders at the West Chicago warehouse to promptly address any physical damage to the bins. Along with these measures, we keep track of improper disposals and log them into our Central Management Services database. This not only demonstrates our commitment to responsible waste management but also ensures that the presence of the four TreeMachines will not diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood, preventing any depreciation in property values.

USAgain places "No Dumping Signs" on the TreeMachines to discourage fly dumping and overflows. We are also able to place security cameras at the locations to allow 24/7 monitoring of the site to address any issues as they arise. The property owner earns additional revenue through the our lease agreement and has the opportunity to increase foot traffic to their business by patron's use of the TreeMachine.

4. That the establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.

To construct and operate each TreeMachine, USAgain will provide all the necessary utilities and materials. The planned placements for each TreeMachine will be situated in a private parking lot and will be placed within a designated parking stall, chosen by the property owner. All the TreeMachines have been carefully planned to avoid causing traffic congestion on public streets. This strategic placement ensures that the TreeMachines do not interfere with the flow of traffic or disrupt the operations of nearby businesses. Since all the TreeMachines will be in private parking lots, they will not occupy space on public streets where vehicles would park or drive through. Lastly, USAgain's proposed four TreeMachines in the City of Darien will be in full compliance with all the regulations of the district in which they are anticipated to be located at, ensuring their seamless integration into their respective locations.

The TreeMachine only occupies one parking space on the property. The property owner also picks the location for their ideal placement to have minimal if any impact on their current operations. If operational issues do arise, we relocate and/or remove the TreeMachine at the property owner's request.

5. That the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of any proposed structure will not be a variation with either the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of the structures already constructed or in the course of construction in the immediate neighborhood or the character of the applicable district, as to cause a substantial depreciation in the property values within the neighborhood.

This question really is not applicable to the TreeMachine, however, USAgain has taken great steps to design a clothing donation bin that is aesthetically pleasing to the eye, blends in with the rest of the area but still somewhat noticeable, and takes great pride in how we maintain the TreeMachine to make sure it is an attractive feature of the

property. The TreeMachine is USAgain's brand and if the TreeMachine looks bad, then that reflects poorly on our brand as a business.

6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

Not really applicable. The TreeMachine has no utility hook ups, does not require any access roads (other than one parking space), and will not affect drainage.

7. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.

The TreeMachine only occupies one parking space and the property owner picks the space to have minimal if any affect on the property's traffic flow, ingress, and egress. While the TreeMachine is visited by patrons to making clothing and shoe donations, it is very rare, if ever, that there are multiple people there at a time to cause a traffic line. The typical person spends about 30 seconds to 1 minute at the TreeMachine location to park in front of the TreeMachine, get out of the car, grab their donations, and place them in the donation bin.

8. That the special use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the City Council pursuant to the recommendations of the planning and Zoning Commission and the Planning and Development Committee.

The TreeMachine will have minimal if any impact on the property in the zoning district. The TreeMachine is only 3 feet wide and 6.5 feet high and only occupies one parking space on the property that is selected by the property owner. In some regards the TreeMachine will have less impact on the property than a motor vehicle that would be otherwise by located in this parking space. And as stated above, because of USAgain's commitment to service, maintenance, and operating the donation bin to have minimal if any impact on the current operations of the business on the property, the TreeMachine will not have an adverse affect on the property and will provide a convenient benefit to the surround community by providing an easy way for residents to donated unwanted clothes and shoes rather than throwing them away into the community's waste stream ending up in the landfill.

Information About USAgain and Environmental Impact of Textile Waste

The Problem - Environmental Impact of Textile and Clothing Waste

According to the US EPA, over 17 million tons of textile waste is generated nationwide each year with nearly 70% of that waste ending up in our nation's landfills. It takes over 200 years for textile waste to decompose in landfills which generate greenhouse methane gas and leaches toxic chemicals and dyes into the groundwater and our soil. For every pound of clothes that is collected for reuse purposes saves 15 pounds of CO2 emissions.

The Solution – The TreeMachine

The typical Clothing Drop Spot collects between 300 to 500 pounds of donated clothes, shoes, and textiles each week that are typically thrown away if a convenient donation facility is not available. This can result in over 15,600 to 26,000 pounds of clothes, shoes, and textiles being reused or recycled and diverted from your community's landfill. This equates to a positive environmental impact of saving 234,000 to 390,000 pounds of CO2 emissions on a yearly basis.

Originally founded in 1999 in Seattle, Washington, USAgain started with a mission to create a better world where PEOPLE and PLANET are given the value and priority they deserve. Our headquarters is in West Chicago, Illinois, we operate in 13 states and in over 500 cities.

fight against Global Warming and the Climate Crisis. Together we have planted more than 1 million trees since 2013.

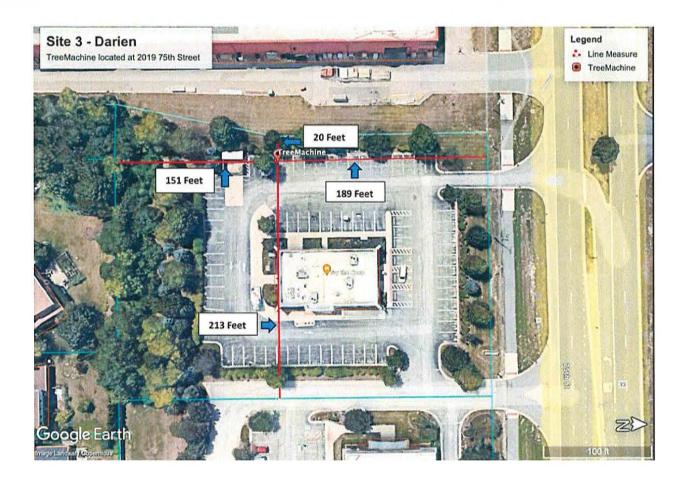

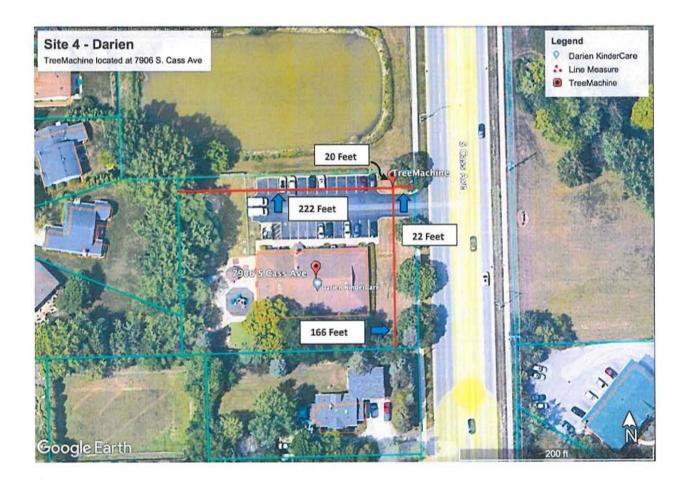

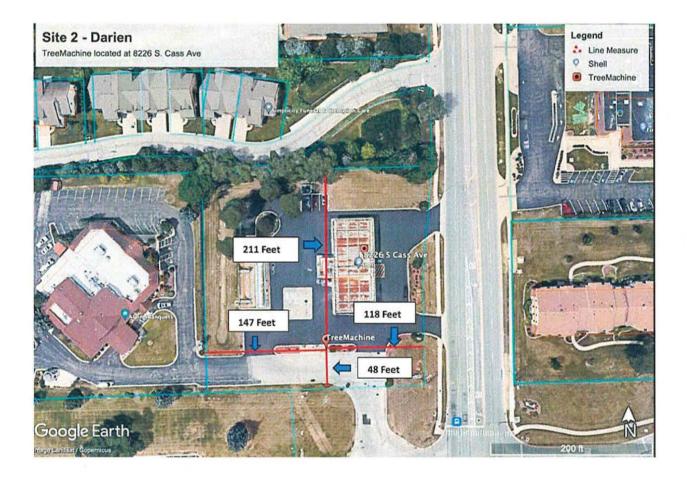

MINUTES CITY OF DARIEN

PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION MEETING

Wednesday, November 15, 2023

PRESENT: Lou Mallers – Chairperson, Robert Erickson, Chris Jackson, Shari Gillespie, Chris Green, John Johnson, Julie Kasprowicz

ABSENT: Bryan Gay, Hilda Gonzalez

OTHER: Jordan Yanke - City Planner

Chairperson Lou Mallers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Darien City Hall, Council Chambers, 1702 Plainfield Road, Darien, Illinois. Chairperson Mallers declared a quorum present and swore in the audience members wishing to present public testimony.

Regular Meeting – New Business

a. Public Hearing – PZC2023-10 - 8413 Creekside Lane – Variation Petitioner Thomas Jones seeks approval of a variation from City Code Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the Zoning Ordinance. The petition specifically requests to allow for an addition to an existing single-family residence, with the addition being a garage expansion. Property is located within the R-2 Single-Family Residence Zoning District and the variation request is to the following standard in the R-2 District of the City of Darien Zoning Ordinance:- Section 5A-7-2-6 (A): Variation request to reduce the required corner side yard setback.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that the subject property was platted in 1977 and is part of the Brookeridge Creek Subdivision. He reported that the parcel is improved with a single-family residence and that the property slopes toward its rear where a wetland feature (creek) and floodplain exist and that the natural features do not impact the proposal.

Mr. Yanke reported that the petitioner is proposing a garage expansion by adding a third bay which would result in a corner side yard setback of 17.5' from the parcel's southern property line that curves along Creekside Lane. He reported that the underlying zoning district (R-2) has a corner side yard setback of 15' regularly, but the subject lot was approved under an ordinance specifying a 25' corner side yard setback for the property and that the approval of a variance would be a 7.5' encroachment into the required 25' setback.

Commissioner Julie Kasprowicz questioned if the petitioner would need to build upward.

The petitioners Mr. Thomas Jones and Mr. Lawrence Fluppl, architect reported that they are keeping the garage floor slant and keeping the same as the two-car garage. He stated that there will be a slight berm and slight drop.

Commissioner Chris Green questioned the reason for the change in setback.

Mr. Yanke reported that the intention and best guess was it was there to maintain a relative distance to Creekside Lane.

Mr. Yanke reported that there is a 6 ft easement that was not on the original plat and that the petitioner would have to do the necessary erosion control.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Jackson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Green to recommend approval of a variation from City Code Section 5A-7-2-6 (A) of the Zoning Ordinance. The petition specifically requests to allow for an addition to an existing single-family residence, with the addition being a garage expansion. Property is located within the R-2 Single-Family Residence Zoning District and the variation request is to the following standard in the R-2 District of the City of Darien Zoning Ordinance:- Section 5A-7-2-6 (A): Variation request to reduce the required corner side yard setback.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

 Public Hearing – PZC2023-11 (PAGE 28) 2019 75TH Street, 7906 Cass Avenue, and 8226 Cass Avenue – Special Use Petitioner USAgain, LLC requests approval of a special use pursuant to Section 5A-2-2-6 of the City Zoning Code. The petition specifically requests to allow for the placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties. Properties are within the B-2 Community Shopping Center Business District, B3 General Business District, and the Office (0) District.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that the petitioner is requesting approval for placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties in the City. He reported that while the zoning ordinance does not directly regulate such use, staff has determined the request requires approval of a special use.

Mr. Yanke reported that the petitioner elected to submit a bundled application, meaning the special use request includes three properties. He reported that the most comparable case and proposal in the City's past is AMVETS, which is in the parking lot outside of Walmart and required zoning approval. He further reported that the petitioner submitted a justification narrative with a detailed description of the project, in addition to findings of fact that would support the application request.

Mr. Andrew Proctor, petitioner USAgain, LLC stated that they operate in 13 states. He stated that the corporate headquarters is in West Chicago and that there is a growing need for locations.

Chairperson Lou Mallers questioned how frequently the bins are looked at to make sure they are not overflowing.

Mr. Proctor stated that they pick up once a week or can do more if needed. He stated that there is a sensor inside the bin which notifies the staff and they can also place cameras. He further stated that they work with the property owner and they get used a lot but do not cause traffic. Mr. Proctor stated that if there is site that doesn't work that they would be happy to look at another location if needed.

Commissioner Gillespie stated that she liked the tree program. The petitioner stated that they could plant the trees in Darien. She questioned what happens once the donations are made.

Mr. Proctor stated that the items get shipped to a location where they get bailed and place in a shipping container. He stated that they work through a broker and then they get sold to thrift shops. He further stated that they are sold 25 percent in the US and 75 percent international.

Commissioner Julie Kasprowicz questioned if there is theft and lighting.

Mr. Proctor stated that they do not experience theft in Illinois but more in San Francisco. He stated that they do not have lights on the small containers. He further stated that the lease with the landlord is one year and that they are making a little revenue but no concerns.

Mr. Chris Jackson questioned the parking spot for the container.

Mr. Yanke reported that the container does take up a parking space but that the sites still meet the minimum parking requirements. He reported that there are no building codes applicable but that the PZC could suggest that the City do final inspections on placement.

There was some conversation regarding the pickup.

Mr. Proctor stated that they could get there within 24-36 hours.

Chairperson Mallers opened the meeting to anyone wishing to present public comment.

Ms. Barb Herber, stated that she lived behind KinderCare. She stated that she has no cooperation from the KinderCare. She further stated that there are trucks coming in and out in the middle of the night and that having another bin is going to be a problem. Ms. Herber stated that she did not think KinderCare was a good location. She suggested a church or grocery store location.

Chairperson Mallers suggested that KinderCare put in a chain link.

There was no one else wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Johnson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Green to recommend approval of a special use pursuant to Section 5A-2-2-6 of the City Zoning Code. The petition specifically requests to allow for the placement of a clothing donation bin on three (3) separate properties. Properties are within the B-2 Community Shopping Center Business District, B3 General Business District, and the Office (O) District Variation. The recommendation is subject to the following condition:

1. Donation bin areas shall be kept clean on properties.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

Regular Meeting – Old Business

a. Public Hearing – PZC2023-06 – Mixed-Use District Text Amendment Petition from the City of Darien to amend the Zoning Ordinance (i.e. Text Amendment) to create a Mixed-Use Zoning District.

Mr. Jordan Yanke, City Planner reported that he presented the PZC with some of the comments and brought it back to move it forward. He reported that he will bring it back for a final reading in December with final comments submitted to him before Thanksgiving then to the City Council.

Mr. Yanke reported that there were some comments and recommendations on prohibited uses.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Jackson made a motion seconded by Commissioner Gillespie to continue the Public Hearing – PZC2023-06 – Mixed-Use District Text Amendment Petition from the City of Darien to amend the Zoning Ordinance (i.e. Text Amendment) to create a Mixed-Use Zoning District.

Upon roll call vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

Staff Updates & Correspondence

Mr. Yanke reported that there is a new business going where the old Montessori School opening in Brookhaven is located.

Chairperson Mallers reported that he received a lot of correspondence regarding Gerber. He stated that there is going to be potential legal action.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Jackson make a motion seconded by Commissioner Kasprowicz to approve the Planning & Zoning Commission October 4, 2023 and the October 18, 2023 Meeting Minutes.

Upon voice vote the MOTION CARRIED 7-0.

Mr. Yanke announced that the next meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE (PZC2023-11: USAGAIN)

WHEREAS, the City of Darien is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 6 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, as a home rule unit of local government, the City may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government except as limited by Article VII, Section 6; and

WHEREAS, the property legally described in Section 1 (the "Subject Property"), is zoned B-2 Community Shopping Center Business District pursuant to the Darien Zoning Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner has requested approval of a special use to allow for a clothing donation bin within the B-2 zoning district; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice as required by law, the City's Planning and Zoning Commission conducted a public hearing on November 15, 2023, and has forwarded its recommendation of approval of this petition to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2023, the City's Municipal Services Committee reviewed the petition and has forwarded its recommendation of approval of this petition to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the findings and recommendations described above and now determines to grant the petition subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations

described herein below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE

POWERS, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Subject Property. This Ordinance is limited and restricted to the property

generally located at 2019 75TH Street, Darien, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

THE SOUTH 179.4 FEET OF THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED TRACT OF LAND; THE WEST 242.4 FEET OF THE EAST 292.4 FEET OF THE SOUTH 359.4 FEET OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 38 NORTH, RANGE 11, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, IN DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

PIN: 09-29-409-021

SECTION 2: Special Use Granted. Pursuant to Section 5A-2-2-6 of the Darien Zoning

Ordinance, a special use is hereby granted to allow for a clothing donation bin.

<u>SECTION 3: Condition.</u> The special use is subject to the following condition:

1) Donation bin area shall be kept clean on property.

SECTION 4: Home Rule. This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent of the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supercede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A motion approving a memo of understanding for the authorization of creating a new position within the Employee Slot-In under the Mechanics Slot as 2^{nd} Water Operator in Charge.

MEMO OF UNDERSTANDING

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

Over the course of the last few years, Staff has been reviewing the Water Plant Operators and the Operator in Charge for the City of Darien. Currently, The City of Darien has two active licensed water operators within the Water Division. The Superintendent of the Municipal Services Department is the City's Operator in Responsible Charge. By definition **operator in responsible charge** means the person(s) designated by the owner to be the licensed operator(s) who makes decisions regarding the daily operational activities of a public water system, water treatment facility and/or distribution system that will directly impact the quality and/or quantity of drinking water.

The primary duties of the Operator in Charge include the following:

Monitoring and responding to the Water Plant Alarms through the supervisory control and data acquisition system, (SCADA). Examples of such are Chlorine leak, high flow, low flow, tank levels

Coordinating and sampling of water bacteriological samples in multiples of 30 per month

Annual EPA mandated sampling for organic contaminants such as lead and copper

Recording of daily pumpage-incoming/outgoing

Fire hydrant flushing

Maintenance programs-Valve exercising, leak detection and general infrastructure

Developing monthly EPA mandated reports

Developing annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)

Completing annual EPA mandated Water Audit

While the City has one Operator in Charge, it does not allow the individual to break away from the 24 hour 365 days per year responsibility. Staff has recently reevaluated the position for ongoing succession of Water Plant Operators for the City. It was determined that a second Operator in Charge is required to assume and share responsibilities. The City posted a position for a Water Plant Operator internally and externally. Upon review of the applicants and based on the interview results, the position for Second Water Operator in Charge was offered to an individual internally.

The goal is to assist the Superintendent in coordinating and executing the tasks at hand as illustrated above. The position would report to the Superintendent. During the Superintendent's absence, the position would be responsible for all water related issues and report to the Director as required. While the position is a new position it - would be slotted within the Mechanic slot and designated as Mechanic and 2^{nd} Water Plant Operator in Charge. The position is lateral and the designated employee would still maintain GU-1 responsibilities. The financial salary impact of the position is approximately \$3,547 per year without overtime. The benefit to the Superintendent will be quality time off and reduced comp time as the Superintendent does not receive overtime. The net effect will be a neutral effect on overtime. The Local 150 Bargaining Unit representative, Bret Krogstad, has reviewed the position and has no further issues regarding the new Slot-In. See email, attached as <u>Attachment A</u>.

ISSUE STATEMENT

A resolution accepting a proposal from Aqua Backflow to maintain a Potable Water Backflow Device Program from 2024 through 2030 at a pass through cost of \$12.95 per assembly test report submitted for a backflow device into a web-based reporting program.

RESOLUTION

BACKGROUND

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency requires each municipality to have a viable potable water backflow prevention program. Backflow prevention devices are installed to ensure contaminants from various different applications do not make their way back into our water system and cause potential harm to our customers.

Competitive quotes were requested for the Backflow Program and Staff had received three (3) quotes. Please see <u>Attachment A</u>. The lowest competitive quote was Aqua Backflow. References were verified and are satisfactory.

The program would allow for Aqua Backflow to administer the program for the City of Darien for 6 years and would include the following:

- Maintain a Database for Backflow Devices
- Backflow Survey for Darien Water Customers Years 2024-2027-2030 (EPA Requirement). The survey would include mailing out approximately 9,000 surveys to our water customers. Staff has estimated there are approximately 1,000 backflow devices in the system.
- Establish a Web Base for Backflow Entry Data by the Certified Tester
- EPA Site Compliance Representation as Required
- City Access to Database
- Annual Backflow Compliance and Violation Reminders
- · Direct Vendor Billing to Backflow Testing Vendor

The program involves no direct cost to the City and Aqua Backflow will hold their filing cost of \$12.95 per assembly test report submitted for a backflow device into a web-based reporting program for the duration of the contract. Please note a property owner will not have the ability to self-certify a backflow device unless they are licensed by the State. The program will not cost the city any additional funds.

A resolution accepting a proposal from JC Landscaping & Tree Service at the schedule of prices for the Ditch Landscape Maintenance Program for the period of May 1, 2024 through April 30, 2025.

RESOLUTION

BACKGROUND

In 2022 the City completed maintenance on the remainder the City's ditch infrastructure. The City Council initiated the commencement of the Ditch Project program in 2007 to restore approximately 27 miles of ditch infrastructure. In 2023, the Department requested funding for a pilot program to provide ongoing maintenance for optimal storm water conveyance within the open ditch areas. The goals of the Ditch Landscape Maintenance Program were to field review the open ditches for settling adjacent to inlets/structures, erosion and minor grading. The 2023 program allowed Staff to complete approximately 2.2 lineal miles at a cost of approximately \$60,000, (\$5.20/LF). Staff viewed the program as very successful and is recommending the program for the FY2024/25 Budget. The program would continue sequentially from when the ditches were originally restored. The maintenance restoration is based on a time and material basis with the City providing limited materials.

The program consist of the City providing topsoil, aggregate and all storm sewer materials to the proposed vendor. The vendor shall have the ability to set flow grades from 1.5 to 2.5 %. The scope of work will be determined by the Superintendent. The work areas will consist of identified areas ranging from 10-150 feet long by 5 to 20 feet in width. The work will further include adjusting storm inlets and 12x12 garden inlets located in the right of way. Adjustments will consist of removing/adding concrete adjusting rings ranging from 1-6 inches and replacing/adjusting 12x12 inlets/grates to grade.

Competitive quotes were requested for the landscaping services on December 12, 2023 and staff received one (1) responsive quote. The sole bid was received from JC Landscaping & Tree Service. See <u>Attachment A</u>. JC Landscaping has been a contractor for the City for several years with satisfactory results.

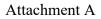

# **<u>RESOLUTION</u>** <u>BACKUP</u>

#### **BACKGROUND/HISTORY**

The Darien Police Department is requesting approval of the purchase and replacement of twelve (12) patrol vehicles that were not a part of the FY 2024 budget.

The current patrol fleet of patrol vehicles is aging and experiencing significant challenges primarily due to the higher mileage and frequent maintenance issues. Typically we would go through a budgeting process for FYE 2025, however, due to many circumstances well beyond our control including supply chain, economics, dealers' choices on which vehicles to concentrate efforts on producing, etc. the available vehicles for purchase are disastrous and does not appear to be improving. Staff believes that we need to order now in order to receive vehicles rather than wait for FYE 2025 budget process as cars may not be available. The purchase of 12 new Dodge Durango's represents a critical step in revitalizing our police fleet.

We are purchasing the 12 patrol vehicles through the government bid process and therefore it is a sole source.

The additional items necessary – laptops, radar systems, camera systems, graphics, labor, etc. will be purchased from the appropriate restricted funds such as the e-Citation Fund, DUI Fund or Cannabis Fund. At this time the costs for these items is estimated at \$322,016.92. These estimates are not precise and are subject to change since we're not buying them until the cars come in and that is estimated at three months.

#### Problem Summary:

MEMO

The purpose of this executive summary is to outline the strategic initiative to replace our aging police fleet with 12 new 2024 Dodge Durango Pursuit rated V6 SUV's. The decision to procure these vehicles is driven by the imperative need to enhance police response capabilities and reliability, given the current state of our high-mileage and aging fleet. Our current fleet of police vehicles is experiencing significant challenges, primarily due to the higher mileage and frequent maintenance issues. Our squads are consistently in and out of the maintenance shop for repairs, compromising the operational efficiency of our law enforcement efforts.

#### Objective of the Purchase:

The proposed purchase seeks to address these challenges by acquiring 12 new 2024 Dodge Durango's. These 12 will replace the current 12 that we currently use in patrol. The breakdown includes 8 fully marked squad cars as well as 4 "Unmarked" squad cars. The "unmarked" squad cars will be equipped with similar interior lights and sirens making them effective in routine police functions but also servicing other semi-covert functions such as traffic enforcement and DUI detection. This diversified approach ensures that both the visible and undercover element of our law enforcement operation receive the necessary upgrade and will contribute to a more comprehensive and robust police presence.

#### Key Benefits:

- 1. **Enhanced Police Response:** The advanced features of the 2024 Dodge Durango, including improved performance, agility, and technology integration, will significantly enhance our ability to respond swiftly and effectively to emergency situations.
- 2. **Reliability and Reduced Downtime**: The introduction of new vehicles will substantially reduce the frequency of repairs and maintenance, resulting in decreased downtime for our fleet. This will, in turn contribute to a more consistent and reliable police force.
- 3. Improved Visibility and Versatility: The inclusion of both marked and unmarked squads ensures that our law enforcement efforts remain versatile and adaptable to various operational requirements. The marked squads will serve as a visible deterrent, while the unmarked ones will facilitate discreet surveillance and investigation activities.

#### Markey Analysis:

The Dodge Durango has consistently received positive reviews for its reliability, performance, and safety features. Many of our surrounding departments, including Hinsdale, Oakbrook, Lisle, and Westmont have chosen to improve their fleets with the addition of the Dodge Durango. Additionally Dodge, offers completive pricing through the state bid system making it a cost-effective solution for our City. The investment in the 2024 Durango's is a strategic allocation of resources aimed at achieving long-term cost savings. The reduction in maintenance expenses and increased operational efficiency will lead to a more sustainable and budget-friendly fleet management over time.

#### Next Steps in the Process:

- 1. *Initial order approval by Police Committee and City Council*: Attached is a requested order form for the ordering of 12 new Dodge V6 Durango's. Certain options including, Fleet Keying, spot light additions, and colors are being added in the additional order. This is done under state controlled bid so vendor selection is not needed.
- Vendor Selection: The additional set up, including but not limited to, emergency equipment lights and sirens, legal window tinting, computer mounts, storage components, and cage requirements will need to be sent out for bid proposals will need to be reviewed. Considering factors such as cost, warranty, maintenance services and deliver times will need to be considered and a vendor will be selected.
- 3. *Vehicle Configuration*: Once the vendor is selected, we will work with them to configure the 12 vehicles to suit our operation requirements including features and accessories.
- 4. *Funding and Budget Allocation*: Funding had already been budgeted for on these purchases, however we will need to work with our vendors to make sure we are accountable and responsible with the allotted funds.
- 5. *Delivery and Integration*: Once the vehicles have been delivered and our vendors have done the require installations of products needed, we will need to ensure seamless integration into our existing fleet which will include any employee training on the new vehicle features and technology.

# Conclusion:

The purchase of 12 new Dodge Durango's represents a critical step in revitalizing our police fleet. By addressing the challenges posed by the aging, high-mileage vehicles, we are proactively investing in the safety and effectiveness or our law enforcement operations. This initiative aligns with our commitment to ensuring the well-being of our community through a responsive and reliable police force.

# RULES FOR COMPLIANCE WITH PUBLIC COMMENT REQUIREMENTS OF THE ILLINOIS OPEN MEETINGS ACT

#### I. PURPOSE OF RULES.

The purpose of these Rules is to comply with the requirement of Section 2.06 of the Illinois Open Meetings Act that a public comment section be provided at each meeting subject to the Open Meetings Act.

#### II. DEFINITION OF "PUBLIC BODY" or "BODY."

For purposes of these Rules, the term "Public Body" or "Body" shall mean the City Council, any Committee of the City Council, and any Board and Commission established by the City Council.

#### III. RULES GOVERNING PUBLIC COMMENT.

A. Unless otherwise allowed by a majority vote of the Body, the public comment periods shall be as follows:

1. For the City Council, as set forth on the attached **Agenda template**.

2. For Council committees and advisory committees, at the conclusion of the meeting immediately before adjournment. At the direction of the Body, the floor may be opened for public comment in conjunction with specific agenda items.

B. Individuals seeking to make public comment to the Body shall be formally recognized by the Chair.

C. Individuals addressing the Body shall identify themselves by name, but need not provide their home address.

D. Individuals addressing the Body shall do so by addressing their comments to the Body

itself and shall not turn to address the audience.

E. Public comment time shall be limited to three (3) minutes per person.

F. An individual will be allowed a second opportunity to address the Body only after all other interested persons have addressed the Body and only upon the majority vote of the Body.

G. In the case of a special meeting, public comment will be limited to subject matters germane to the agenda of the special meeting.

# IV. PUBLIC HEARING REQUIREMENTS.

Additional public comments periods will be allowed as required by law in the case of public hearing, subject to the same time constraints.
