Issue Statement

Olympic Signs, as agent for the owner of The Auto-Mobile Center of Darien, has petitioned for approval of a variation to Section 4-3-16 of the Darien Sign Code to allow an electronic message center on the ground sign at 6710 Rt. 83.

Development Description

This multi-tenant shopping center is over 30 years old and is currently fully occupied by 3 businesses – Oil Express, Chippers Auto Care, and Darien Tire & Auto. Their ground sign is 29 feet tall by 10 feet wide having about 200 square feet per side and contains 7 panels, one of which shows digital time and temperature. It is located about 80 feet from the edge of pavement from Rt. 83. Their plan is to cover the time and temperature panel at the bottom of the sign and replace the top 2 static panels with an electronic message center, 5 feet high by 10 feet wide that would display changing illuminated images. The images of products or services would remain static for 10 seconds, not flashing or chasing, with limited brightness at night.

Code Compliance

The Darien Sign Code currently allows ground signs 12 feet above grade and 90 square feet per side, so the current sign is oversized per current standards. The sign was conforming when it was built but the code standard was later changed, so the sign is currently classified as 'legal non-conforming'. The Darien Sign Code required that non-conforming signs in the Rt. 83 corridor must be amortized or removed after 15 years, until that code provision was deleted on 12.17.18.

The proposed sign would not conform to Section 4-3-16 of the Darien Sign Code which prohibits "blinking, flashing, or fluttering lights or other illuminating devices which has a changing light intensity, brightness, or color (1994)." Section 4-3-7 (D) requires that sign light be less than 150 foot-lamberts, be shielded from residential areas, and not cause a traffic hazard.

Plan Review Comments

Other existing ground signs on the Darien (west) side of Rt. 83 are 12 feet tall or less and do not have electronic message center signs. There are two ground signs on the Willowbrook (east) side of Rt. 83 recently installed that appear to be about 15-20 feet tall and one (Pete's) has an electronic message center sign about 8 foot by 8 foot with a change rate of about 10 seconds.

The Petitioner's was asked to address each of the variation standards in their narrative to assist the PZC in making findings-of-fact. The narrative and plans they provided refer to their 'competition' with nearby signs, how the proposed sign will enhance their ability to promote sales, especially with the distance of the sign from Rt. 83, and 'this advertising medium will greatly aid these establishments in moving from a stagnant business climate'.

In 2014, the City granted a variation to Chuck's restaurant at 8025 Cass Avenue for an illuminated electronic message board sign subject to the following conditions:

- Messages will be held for at least 60 seconds.
- 2. Messages will change all at once.
- Messages may display multiple colors.
- 4. Illumination will maintain a constant light intensity or brightness.
- 5. Illumination brightness will comply with the Sign Code.

In 2015, the City granted a similar sign variation to Our Lady of Peace at 709 Plainfield Road.

PZC

On January 16, 2019, the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed this petition. No neighbors attended. Petitioner claims that tenant rent is low and tenant turnover is high and he thinks the proposed sign may help business. He would like the sign to also show a waving flag and moving vehicle images. Some PZC members were concerned about the sign would be too tall (17 feet taller than current standard) and too distracting to drivers and nearby residential. They asked if the Petitioner had considered a smaller sign, closer to the ground, and similar to the signs for Chuck's and Our Lady of Peace. The PZC voted 4-4 on a motion to recommend approval.

MSC 1.28.19

On January 28, the Municipal Services Committee discussed the PZC findings per the meeting minutes in **Attachment 8**. In summary, it was noted the owner was unwilling to adjust the height of the sign to reduce the existing 29 feet to 12 feet which is the current standard. He was also unwilling to adjust the size of the electronic message panel, its relocation to the bottom of the sign structure, and the duration of the message to 60 seconds as stipulated for other electronic message panels approved in Darien. This agenda item was continued to give the applicant a chance to reconsider.

Revised Plan

The revisions shown in **Attachment 9** dated 02-22-19 include a reduction in sign height to 23 feet 4 inches, relocation of the electronic message panel to second position from the top, and a new cladding around the sign structure with a faux brick base.

The sign code in section 4-3-17(A) 2f allows that legal non-conforming signs may be altered provided there is no increase in the extent of the nonconformity. Review of the revised plan by the PZC is not required. The tie vote of the PZC does not require a super-majority vote by the City Council for approval.

Decision Mode

If MSC members make a recommendation on March 25, this item can be scheduled for City Council on April 1, 2019.

In preparation of the sign permit applications for the sign renovation of the existing multi-tenant ground sign located at the Auto-Mobile Center located at 6710 Route 83 in Darien, IL I called the Village to discuss what we would need to move forward with permitting process. I spoke with Steve Manning who informed me of the Route 83 corridor sign regulations.

Mr. Manning said that the owner's choices were to remove the existing sign and replace with new or that they could attempt to amend the code to eliminate the amortization requirement. The existing sign structure was manufactured from aluminum sheeting with 2" x ½" galvanized steel angle and is in excellent condition. The property owners, at the behest of long time tenants suggested that an electronic message unit be considered in place of the Time and Temperature unit. This added means of generating new business should help to revitalize the center and an area now competing with new retail completion from new and highly visible establishments.

I have also included with this submittal the drawings of the renovated display along with photos of the general area that depict the use of prohibited signage along Route 83 and new construction in the area to show some of the obstacles these owners are competing against for their neighbors business.

We are requesting a variance from the Darien Sign Code for 6710 Route 83 for Darien Car Care Center LLC. We wish to furnish an electronic changeable message sign at this location. As the cost of electronics has gone down, the popularity of electronic signs has increased. Electronic signs offer the benefits of easily changed wording to announce such things as sales and short term promotions and also public service announcements. Messages can change at the flip of a switch instead of sending a person out in inclement weather to change one letter at a time. The length of any one message can be programmed so that the changes are not too fast or too slow.

As the popularity of such signs increases, they are less of a surprise to the motoring public. Like stationary copy and all advertising in general, they tend to be screened out by the general public...unless they have a particular need for the advertised service at that particular time. In other words, you only pay serious attention to a advertisers sign when you are in need of their product or service. You may still notice it as part of the general visual environment, but you will not think much about it unless you are in need of the signs product / service at that particular time. In the case of the Car Care Center, the existing static display advertises the name and service of the individual tenant and considering the distance the sign is located from Route 83 the opportunity to advertise special services, savings and or incentive packages will help draw potential clients and revenue into the center. Over the years, the existing Time and Temperature sign has proven to be a sales aid device. It has introduced the passerby to the center with its public service message. Now that the electronic message center has become more affordable, the tenants look to this mode of advertisement as cost effective means of increasing revenues to grow their businesses out of the recent recession.

It is our belief that through increased goods, services and the additional revenues generated the entrepreneurs of the Darien Car Care Center LLC will become more essential to the immediate area and integral to the Darien economy.

Re: EXPLANATION OF HOW THE PROPOSED SIGN MEETS THE SIGN VARIATION STANDARDS


The available location for adequate signage is shown on the attached shop drawing for the proposed sign renovation of the existing multi-tenant ground sign located at the Auto-Mobile Center located at 6710 Route 83 in Darien, IL.

We believe that the proposed electronic message unit that replaces the existing time and temperature sign will not have a negative affect on motor or pedestrian traffic. The subject sign is located approximately 90 feet from the main thoroughfare, IL Route 83. The subject property has no sidewalk on that side of the street there fore there is no pedestrian traffic. Use of the message unit will avoid or eliminate use of streamers, banners, pennants or other types of non-conforming advertising. With the ability to change message the electronic sign will advertise commercial products available at the businesses located on the premises and non-commercial messages from not-for-profit or governmental organizations located in the village of Darien. The message unit can also advertise for public hearings, meetings and non-commercial public events in the Village of Darien. The massage shall not consist of flashing, scintillating, chasing lights and remain static for a minimum of 10 seconds. Electronic copy and graphics will softly fade, dissolve or roll from ad to ad. The message unit shall incorporate automatic dimmer software or solar sensors setting maximums of 10,000 nits during daylight and 1,000 nits during dusk and dawn. If the Village finds that the display glares or impairs the vision of drivers in motor vehicle the owner Darien Car Care Center LLC shall, within 24 hours of a request by the Village, reduce the intensity of the display to a level deemed acceptable by the Village.

The cost of the applicant, Darien Car Care Center LLC., in complaining with the sign code is potential. The sign variance request for the time and temperature unit with this electronic massage unit. The ad exposure the message unit will provide the business complex tenants will be enhance therefore presenting the opportunity for a greater number of patrons visiting and employing these establishments. The addition of this advertising medium will greatly aid these establishments in moving from a stagnant business climate and on to becoming stronger members of the Darien

Business community.

Being that the overall of the Darien sign code is to promote public safety, convivence, physical appearance and to enhance the economy of the village; we believe that by approving this variance both applicant, applicants' tenants and the Village of Darien will greatly benefit as a result.








EMC Units Retro-Fitted to Existing Pylon



City of Darien Sign Code

4-3-7: GENERAL SIGN REGULATIONS:

- (C) Illumination Of Signs: In addition to all other applicable requirements set forth in this sign code, all illuminated signs shall comply with the following provisions:
- 1. All illuminated signs within one hundred feet (100') of any residential zoning district shall be turned off between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. unless the business is engaged in the operation of business during such hours, in which case the sign may be lit during the hours of operation only.
- 2. Signs in the direct line of vision of motorists approaching any traffic signal shall not have red, green or amber illumination.
- 3. Neither the direct nor reflected light from primary light sources shall create a traffic hazard for or confuse operators of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares.
- 4. No sign shall have blinking, flashing or fluttering lights or other illuminating device which has a changing light intensity, brightness or color. Beacon lights are prohibited.
- 5. No exposed reflective type bulb or incandescent lamp which exceeds fifteen (15) watts shall be used on the exterior surface of any sign so as to expose the face of the bulb, light or lamp to any public street or adjacent property.
- 6. All sources of light, whether by direct exposure, surface reflection or transmission having an intrinsic brightness greater than thirty (30) foot-lamberts shall be shielded so that the source of the light cannot be seen at any point within a residential zoning district.
- 7. No luminous source of light, whether direct exposure, surface reflection or transmission shall have a light intensity exceeding the brightness value of one hundred fifty (150) foot-lamberts.
- 8. No source of light shall be permitted to cause illumination in excess of one-half (1/2) foot-candle in a residential zoning district.
- 9. The light from any illuminated sign shall be so shielded, shaded or directed so that the light intensity or brightness shall not be objectionable to surrounding properties.

4-3-16: ILLUMINATION IN ROUTE 83 CORRIDOR:

For the purposes of this sign code no sign shall have blinking, flashing, or fluttering lights or other illuminating device which has a changing light intensity, brightness, or color. Beacon lights are not permitted. (Ord. 0-38-94, 9-6-1994)

4-3-18: ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATIONS; PERMITS, VARIANCES AND APPEALS:

- (B) Variation Of Regulations:
- 1. (a) The available locations for adequate signage on the property;
 - (b) The effect of the proposed sign on pedestrian and motor traffic;
 - (c) The cost to the applicant in complying with the sign code as opposed to the detriment, if any, to the public from granting of the variance;
 - (d) If undue hardships and practical difficulties result in complying with the sign code and if these hardships are a result of previous actions of the applicant;
 - (e) The general intent of the sign code.

4-3-2: PURPOSE

This sign code is adopted for the following purposes:

- (A) To promote and protect the public health, safety, comfort, morals, convenience and general welfare of the residents of the City.
- (B) To enhance the physical appearance of the City by preserving the scenic and natural beauty of the area.
- (C) To promote the safety and recreational value of public travel.
- (D) To protect the public investment in streets and highways by reducing sign or advertising distractions that may increase traffic accidents.
- (E) To ensure compatibility of signs with surrounding land uses.
- (F) To enhance the economy of the City by promoting the reasonable, orderly and effective display of outdoor advertising.
- (G) To protect the pedestrians and motorists within the City from damage or injury caused by distractions, obstructions and hazards created by a proliferation of off-site advertising signs.
- (H) To prevent the proliferation of off-site advertising signs which distract from the development of the City in an aesthetically pleasing manner.
- (I) To preserve the character of the City which is a single-family residential community by assuring the compatibility of signs with the surrounding land uses. (Ord. 0-38-94, 9-6-1994)

d. Discussion - Staff is requesting consideration of an amendment to the Sign Code regarding amortization in the Rt. 83 corridor.

Mr. Steve Manning City Planner reported that this multi-tenant shopping center is over 30 years old and currently fully occupied by 3 businesses. He reported that the plan is to cover the time and temperature panel at the bottom of the sign and replace the 2 static panels with an electronic message center, 5 feet high by 10 feet wide that would display changing illuminated images of products or services for 10 seconds not flashing or chasing with limited brightness at night.

Mr. Manning reported that there are other existing ground signs on the Darien side of Route 83 are 12 feet tall or less and do not have electronic message center signs. He reported that there are two ground signs on the Willowbrook side of Route 73 recently installed that appear to be about 15-20 feet tall and one (Pete's) has an electronic message center sign about 8 foot by 8 foot with a change rate of 10 seconds.

Mr. Manning reported that at the January 16th PZC meeting the petitioner stated that tenant rent is low and tenant turnover is high and he thinks the proposed sign may help business. He reported that some of the PZC members were concerned that the sign was too tall and too distracting and asked if the petitioner would consider a small sign closer to the ground similar to Chuck's and Our Lady of Peace. Mr. Manning reported that the PZC voted 4-4 on the motion recommending approval. He stated that he was unclear if the tie would require super majority by City Council and that he would check with the attorney.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that there was amortization with Darien and Willowbrook to comply with ground signs on Route 83. He stated that all other stand-alone signs in Darien are in conformance and that the issue is the height.

Mr. Al Santa Maria, Olympic Signs/Sign Contractor stated that after the PZC meeting the owner is interested in doing something. He stated that he has been reducing the rent and that he needs to do something keeping a message center at the top and that the lower section would be hidden by shrubbery which may need to be removed.

Mr. Santa Maria stated that they are 87 feet back from the street with the service station at 68 feet, Binny's 64 feet and the Marion Hills Bible Church, Hinsdale South High School and Our Lady of Peace single tenants. He further stated that the Chuck's sign is smaller in square footage but closer to the road. Mr. Santa Maria provided photos of the signs noting the square footage and stating that Hinsdale South High School's sign is 73 feet back and runs a ticker tape with a lot of flashing and messaging.

Mr. Gombac reported that Route 83 is under consideration for 3 lanes since 2000.

Chairperson Marchese questioned why not rebuild and make it lower.

Mr. Santa Maria stated that there is low shrubbery and they will lose visibility.

Chairperson Marchese stated that he is all for helping businesses but not on a 29 foot sign and that this is difficult to approve and would ask to make it smaller.

Mr. Gombac reported that new signs have to be in compliance and that they could come back with a sign similar to Pete's.

Mr. Manning reported that in his communication with the property owner and management company that a new sign for \$22 - 25,000 is an expense not to forgo.

Alderman Belczak stated that the size did not bother him but more that he was only fixing one fourth of the sign. He stated that the sign does not flow and that the general frame is old.

Mr. Santa Maria stated that two of the faces will be new. He stated that they do not want to propose signs in separate lots.

Mr. Manning reported that Code only gets one ground sign. He stated that the PZC was concerned that a tall sign would be distracting to drivers and residential. He reported that the size of Pete's sign would not conform to Code.

Mr. Gombac reported that there may be some consideration because Pete's is taller but attractive.

Mr. Manning reported that the Plat of Survey is in the packet and that Code allows changing of the panels to a non-conforming structure and that a variation would still be required to move to Oil Express panel.

Mr. Santa Maria stated that they could lower the sign but would need to take the tree down in front of the yellow house.



Mr. Santa Maria stated that he would speak to the owner.


Alderman Chlystek stated that the sign is so far from the street and if moving it closer is an option.


Mr. Manning reported that they are as close as allowed. He reported that Chestnut Court and Darien Town Center signs are further from the street and no electronic message board.



Tri-State Fire District seeks approval of a variation to the Darien Zoning Code Section 5A-5-12 (C), that otherwise requires a 60 foot maximum height for transmitting towers, for a proposed tower 130 feet tall to be built in the rear yard of their Fire Station #122 at 419 Plainfield Road.

Development Description

Tri-State Fire District communicates with the Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center (ACDC) via microwave from the City cell tower at 1041 S. Frontage Road to the dish mounted on top of the fire station building at Plainfield Road. From there, communications with the other three station buildings in Willowbrook, Burr Ridge, and Willow Springs are via telephone lines. The Fire District wants to convert their communications between fire stations to microwave, which requires dish antenna mounted on towers at each station. The Fire District consultant has determined and presented in their attached study report that minimum height of the sending and receiving microwave antennas needed at their Fire Station #122 is 75 feet and 130 feet. They also

determined that collocating their antennas on the nearest cell tower (100 foot tall stealth tower at the Sportsplex site 750 feet west of the fire station site) or the nearest light pole (65 foot tall light poles at the high school sport field 550 feet south of the fire station site) would not be feasible. They also anticipate moving their local radio (VHF) antennas from the building roof to the monopole. The other ports in the monopole at 97, 107, and 120 feet would be available to lease to future collocations such as Verizon and T-Mobile. Their site plan shows the monopole within a fenced compound south of the building. Photo simulations were presented showing how the tower may appear from neighboring properties with and without collocation antennas.

Staff Plan Review Comments

The City Engineer has commented that no storm water management facility is needed for the proposed tower and compound. The site plan shows 20 foot setbacks from side and rear lot lines for the compound. A minimum 5 feet is required. Per building code requirements, cell towers are designed to better withstand wind than buildings, so a 'fall zone' as shown on the site plan as a 130' radius setback around the tower is not required.

The fence around the Sportsplex pole is a solid fence that blocks the view of equipment inside the compound.

The Fire Chief sent a letter responding to the special use decision criteria in the Zoning Code. However, the proposal does not involve a special use, but does involve a variation. The variation decision criteria that should be used here are attached to this memo, which were in the Zoning Code prior to the most recent revision that was approved 15 days after this variation application was received.

PZC Hearing 3.6.19

At the Planning and Zoning Commission hearing on March 3, the Fire District personnel and consultants made a presentation. There was no one else present in the audience.

They said current reliance on phone lines for emergency dispatch and data transmission is problematic because of the volume limits on the hard lines, the monthly expense, and the downtime and disruptions to AT&T service. The microwaves travel in a straight line from dish to dish and they do not pose health or safety risks when certified by FCC. The height of the tower will not pose a problem for air borne vehicles and no lighting is required when certified by FAA. The Fire District tower would not be as visually intrusive as the tower on Plainfield Road at the Sportsplex, or the tower on 75th Street at Westwood Park, or the light poles on Clarendon Hills Road at the high school because it would be farther from the streets and frontage and the view of the lower portion would be blocked by buildings and trees and it would not be lighted. The Fire District said they would also be willing put up a solid fence around the base compound to hide the equipment and to limit the number of collocations on the tower.

The PZC members acknowledged the public safety benefits of having improved dispatch and communications from this proposed conversion to microwave technology. They discussed how


this tower would be new in the neighborhood and would somewhat alter the aesthetics.

The PZC voted 7-1 to recommend approval of the tower height variation as presented, with two conditions; that the Fire District obtain FAA approval of the tower and a fence be placed around the tower compound; based on a finding that 130 foot height is the minimum needed for public safety and therefore addresses decision criteria #1 which is the property be allowed to 'yield a reasonable return'. The dissenting vote was based on the decision criteria #3 which is the potential negative impact of the tower on the 'essential character of the locality'.

Meeting Schedule

If the MSC votes to recommend at their March 25 meeting, then this item will be placed on City Council agenda April 1 for a final vote.

Fire District

The Tri-State Fire Protection District ("District") is 27 square miles and has a population of approximately 50,000. The District provides fire suppression, rescue and emergency medical services for four municipalities in both Cook and DuPage Counties. This municipalities include Burr Ridge, Darien, Willowbrook, Willow Springs as well as unincorporated areas of southeast DuPage County. The District has 56 full-time personnel and 7 part-time personnel.

The District operates out of four fire stations:

Background

In January 2016 Illinois passed legislation requiring consolidation of 911 dispatch centers. Since that time DuPage County has gone from over twenty (20) dispatch centers to three (3):

- Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center (ACDC)
- DuPage Public Safety Communications (DU-COMM)
- DuPage County Sheriff

Along with consolidation of dispatch centers, the County and ETSB (Emergency Telephone System Board) have been working on two (2) other major projects which will be introduced in 2019:

1. New Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) and Records Management System (RMS) Systems

This County-Wide system consists of four components and will be replacing an outdated system:

<u>Computer Aided Dispatch - When</u> a dispatcher receives a 9-1-1 call, the name, address, and nature of the call is entered into the CAD system. The information is transmitted from CAD directly to the first responders' in-vehicle computers.

<u>In-Vehicle Mobile Data & Mapping</u> - First responders receive information about the call on their in-vehicle computers, including maps of the response area. Responding staff members use this system to send and receive information to each other and the dispatch center. This system is also used to access federal and State law enforcement databases.

<u>Field Reporting</u> - This system allows police officers to complete incident reports in their vehicles. Completed reports are automatically sent to the Records Management System.

<u>Records Management System</u> - This system stores all Police and Fire Departments reports and the information entered into the CAD system. It is used to retrieve historical data, respond to resident requests for information and conduct analyses.

2. Fire Station Alerting System (FSA)

In 2017, the DuPage ETSB voted to support and subsequently approve the funding for new fire station alerting systems in all fire station facilities (66 total) throughout DuPage County. The intent of the project is to capture the optimal integrated functions of the new CAD system which includes automated station notification of emergency calls to dispatch emergency requests as quickly and efficiently as possible.

The current (legacy) systems require manual activation with human interaction for operation which has inherent delays due to the processes. Most legacy systems within DuPage County have been in operation for over fifteen years including the equipment located in our facilities. The total costs for the legacy equipment were borne by each of the respective agencies at the time they were installed.

Fire District's Connectivity/Communications Project Overview

To coincide with the implementation of the CAD and FSA projects mentioned above, the District is looking to not only complete work to fully implement the DuPage County Systems in our fire stations, but to also improve our internal connectivity and communications systems to bring them to current standards.

It is important to note that the DuPage County projects referenced above do not address connectivity between our four (4) fire stations.

The DuPage County CAD and FSA systems are connected to our agency via one connection provided by our dispatch center Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center (ACDC). We will receive that connection at our Fire Station 122, 419 Plainfield Road, Darien by means of a microwave link between Fire Station 122 and a microwave located on the 315' radio tower (Tower B) at the Darien Public Works facility located at Cass Avenue & I-55.

The responsibility of then connecting Fire Station 122 and the DuPage CAD and FSA systems to our remaining fire stations falls upon the Tri-State Fire District, not DuPage County or ACDC. The proposed project described within this document accomplishes this goal.

The District has been working with the following consultants/agencies in evaluating current infrastructure in place and upgrades that are needed to not only meet the current connectivity requirements of the DuPage County CAD and FSA systems but also communications and connectivity needs of the Fire District for the next 10-20 years:

Based on recommendations from these consultants/agencies the District seeks to build a self-maintained microwave radio network ring that connects all four (4) fire stations (see Figure 1). Not shown in Figure 1 is the microwave link from Fire Station 122 to the ACDC microwave at I-55 & Cass Avenue. This microwave radio network would replace the District's current outdated technology consisting of analog circuits, copper phone lines, T-1 lines and coax cable data connections.

The microwave radio network ring will ensure redundancy in that if one microwave connection is lost the ring continues to function from the microwave connection going in the opposite direction. The microwave ring would provide ample bandwidth today and will be upgradeable in the future to continue to meet the growing demands of the District.

In the scope of this project, the District will also be looking at the feasibility of improving VHF radio coverage through the addition of radio antennas so that in-building radio communications are improved.

Scope of Work

For this microwave radio network the District would construct monopoles at the fire stations located in Darien, Burr Ridge and unincorporated Willowbrook. At the fire station located in Willow Springs there is an existing lattice-type radio tower adjacent to the building. We would use this existing tower to install the microwave equipment on. The microwaves would be installed at varying heights at each location to meet minimum line-of-sight requirements between the different fire stations.

Station 122 - Darien

- 1 4' microwave dish at 130' pointed towards Station 124 in Willow Springs
- 1 2' microwave dish at 75' pointed towards Station 121 in unincorporated Willowbrook
- Monopole minimum height required is 130'
- Future addition of an antenna at top of monopole for improved VHF radio/portable coverage

Station 121 - unincorporated Willowbrook

- 1 2' microwave dish at 134' pointed towards Station 123 in Burr Ridge
- 1 2' microwave dish at 70' pointed towards Station 122 in Darien
- Monopole minimum height required is 134'
- The District is seeking the tower to be at 140'
- Future addition of an antenna at top of monopole for improved VHF radio/portable coverage

Letter from the Village of Addison/ACDC T Manager

Dear City of Darien,

The Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center is currently working with the City of Darien to bring the DuPage County BTSB network to Tri-State Fire Protection District Station 2, and to increase the coverage for the Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center's backup public safety radio systems.

This project is completely independent from the Tri-State Fire Protection District's project for network connectivity between the Fire Stations. The DuPage County ETSB will be moving to new Computer Aided Dispatch and Fire Station Alerting systems in 2019; both of these systems will require network connectivity between all of the Tri-State Fire Protection District's fire stations. The network connectivity is the responsibility of the individual fire agencies and not the responsibility of DuPage County or the Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center.

The Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center technical team will work to ensure that the DuPage County connection to Tri-State Fire Protection Station 2 is functional and stable. The Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center will also be looking at a backup IP connection to one Tri-State Fire Protection District station through a VPN tunnel as a secondary connection. The connection to all of the other stations should meet the standards required for Computer Aided Dispatch and Fire Station Alerting systems in 2019. The responsibility to meet these standards is at the individual agency level.

As a point of reference, the Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center will be installing one microwave connection which will be installed at Tri-State Fire Protection Station 2 back to the Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center located in Addison, for access to the DuPage County ETSB system. The Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center has had success with the use of a private microwave network. The microwave network has the security required to help ensure reliable communications for public safety. The negative aspects of these systems include the initial capital cost and design costs compared to using public lines provided by Concast or AT&T, weather related issues, and replacement costs. The positive aspects of utilizing this system include the elimination of ongoing usage charges, controlled maintenance windows for equipment, and built in redundancy on equipment or in design.

Background:

The Tri-State Fire Protection District operates out of four fire stations to provide Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Medical Services to residents and business in the communities of Darien, Willowbrook, Burr Ridge, Willow Springs, and unincorporated DuPage and Cook Counties.

Communications and Networking between the stations are vital to the District's daily operations and prompt responses to emergencies. The ability for Fire and EMS personnel to communicate and share data is expected on a daily basis as well as in times of great disasters and emergencies. The fire stations serve as hubs to provide field communications between units as well as communications back to the Public Safety Answering Point, Addison Consolidated Dispatch Center (ACDC), where 9-1-1 calls are processed and dispatched to the stations.

Currently the district operates its network on out dated and end of life copper technology including copper phone lines, RTNC circuits, T1 lines and coax cable data connections. These lines have become unstable and unreliable. These circuits are no longer able to provide the bandwidth and redundancy required for the daily operations of a modern Fire and EMS provider and will not support the new Computer Aided Dispatch and Fire Station Alerting Systems required by the DuPage County Emergency Telephone Systems Board. Alternative fiber solutions are not an option due the expense and logistics to install dedicated fiber to each building. These alternatives have many drawbacks, including an inability to withstand power outages and rely on 3rd party providers.

In addition to networking, the Fire District seeks to improve its radio coverage and to provide in building penetration for its portable radios. These radios are the lifeline for firefighters and paramedics to communicate with the PSAP as well as each other. Modern building construction and the abundance of large industrial, commercial, and residential structures within the district require additional receive sites to assist in providing the much-needed coverage.

The DuPage County ETSB is in the process of installing a new state of the art IP-based Fire Station Alerting system. This system will not operate reliably on the District's current technology. To be compliant with the NFPA standards redundant IP connections to each station must be provided.

Microwave is the chosen primary network option by ACDC. Construction of the towers will enable the Fire District to install a microwave link between two or more sites in the geographic area providing reliable redundant connectivity for dispatch. ACDC currently provides connectivity and radio coverage to the

geographic areas they serve from the I55/Cass tower located at the Darien Public Works facility. It is, however the responsibility of each agency to provide the last-mile connectivity between their own locations. Additionally, ACDC provides outside mobile level coverage on the VHF radio network and it is the responsibility of each agency to provide additional enhanced in building portable radio level coverage.

Project Plan

After reviewing several options we feel the best means to meet the goals and needs of the Tri-State Fire Protection District would be to construct a self-maintained microwave radio network ring between the four Fire District locations. The towers would link to the ACDC equipment located at the I-55/Cass tower and then complete connectivity of the DuPage County systems to the remaining fire stations.

This microwave ring will provide ample bandwidth today and be upgradeable in the future to continue to meet the growing demands of the Fire District. Providing direct connections to each station eliminates third-party locations and failures making the network much more reliable. For this reason the use of surrounding towers would be prohibited, with the exception of the District's station in Willow Springs which has an existing radio tower with microwave equipment adjacent to the building.

The microwave ring technology provides the redundancy needed to meet industry standards. The design calls for all items to be located on Fire District property and power will be backed up by the already in place public safety grade emergency generators. The towers needed to achieve line of site for the microwave paths will also be able to host VHF antennas to provide much improved radio receive coverage for Fire District communications.

These towers will be designed with expansion and co-location in mind. This means that in the future other public safety entities or commercial service providers may be able to take advantage of these existing sites. The tower heights vary at each location based on line-of-site requirements between the four locations for the microwave technology to network the stations in a reliable ring configuration. These towers are also designed to provide for VHF radio antennas to enhance coverage into the area surrounding each tower. Due to the expense in constructing this network, care is being taken to ensure the towers are designed to meet the current and future needs of the Fire District.

The use of nearby stealth towers is not an option for the Fire District. The use of off-site facilities greatly reduces the reliability of the network design as well as adds tremendous expense. In most cases the off-site location was not designed or intended for public safety use and does not have the required floor space for equipment or tower space for the required antennas and microwave dishes to be installed. AC power requirements and generators would be required to be added to the sites for public safety. Additional microwave direct connections back to the fire stations would be required and may still require the construction of towers on the fire station property. These sites would also require expensive contracts and rental expenses. Multiple stealth sites will be needed in the future due to lack of single stealth capacity and stealth sites are four times the cost of a regular tower.

To whom it may concern:

I write today to address the criteria necessary to secure approval of a special use rezoning request as specified in the application. The following addresses each criteria listed:

- #1. In order to meet the current and anticipated future connectivity and communication requirements (addressed under separate correspondence from our consultant), placing a monopole at each of our stations (including the Plainfield Road station on our current property footprint) will provide the physical means necessary to economically do so well into the future.
- #2. Placement of a monopole as described in the submitted plan will not be detrimental. There already are light towers on the Hinsdale South Property at the Stadium, and the cell tower/flag pole just to the west of the Fire District. In fact this project will provide for improved emergency communications from the ACDC dispatch center and improve public safety.
- #3. The special use will not be injurious to the other property in the immediate vicinity nor substantially diminish property value for the same reasons stated in answer #2.
- #4. The special use will not impede the development of surrounding property as the properties are already developed and use is determined.
- #5. The only structures proposed are the monopole and a fenced and gated area at the rear of District owned property.
- #6. Yes, as specified on the submitted drawings.
- #7. Yes, the only additional ingress and egress needed is provided from existing paved areas of district owned property as specified on the submitted drawings.
- #8. It is my understanding that the special use designation will conform to all other applicable regulations of the zoning district which would allow for this project.



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

VARIATION AUTHORITY and STANDARDS CITY OF DARIEN Zoning Code Section 5A-2-2-3 (A) and (G)

<u>Authority</u>

In cases where there are practical difficulties or particular hardships in the way of carrying out the strict letter of any of the regulations adopted by this Title, the City Council may, by ordinance, determine and vary the application of such regulations in harmony with their general purpose and intent.

Standards

The Planning and Zoning Commission shall not recommend a variation and the City Council shall not vary the provisions of this title as authorized in this section, unless findings of fact have been made on those of the following which relate to the variation being sought:

Whether the purpose of the variation is not based primarily upon a desire to increase financial gain and the general character of the property will be adversely altered.
Whether the overall value of the property will be improved and there will not be any potential adverse effects on the neighboring properties.
Whether the alleged need for the variation has been created by any person presently having a proprietary interest in the premises.
Whether the proposed variation will impair an adequate supply of light and air in adjacent property, substantially increase congestion in the public streets, increase the danger of fire, or endanger the public safety.
Whether the proposed variation will adversely after the essential character of the neighborhood.

SPECIAL USE STANDARDS

Zoning Code Section 5A-2-2-6(G)

No special use shall be recommended to the City Council by the Plan Commission, nor approved by the City Council, unless findings of fact have been made on those of the following factors which relate to the special use being sought:

- 1. That the special use is deemed necessary for the public convenience at the location specified.
- 2. That the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the special use will not be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare.
- 3. That the special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.
- 4. That the establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
- 5. That the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of any proposed structure will not be at variation with either the exterior architectural design, landscape treatment, and functional plan of structures already constructed or in the course of construction in the immediate neighborhood or the character of the applicable district, as to cause a substantial depreciation in the property values within the neighborhood.
- 6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
- 7. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
- 8. That the special use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the City Council pursuant to the recommendations of the Plan Commission and the Planning and Development Committee.

Development History and Proposal

Crossroads business park has about 8 acres at the southwest corner of 83rd Street and Lemont Road divided into 5 lots. Lot 002 is in the middle containing 5 office buildings with one shared parking lot with 160 parking spaces. The applicant is looking to lease about 25% of building D1.

The site has B-2 zoning with a planned unit development approved by Ordinances O-27-00 and O-28-00 in 2000. Uses were limited to drug store in building A, retail in building B, day care in building G, and office uses in buildings C, D1, D2, E, F excluding medical. Since then 9 amendments to the PUD have approved medical uses.

Caring Network is a not-for-profit agency offering pregnancy tests, counseling, and family support. They have 501(c) (3) tax status wherein they accept donations and they have 5 other locations in DuPage County dba Avenue Women's Center. They would have a nurse administering ultrasound tests on-site and counselors seeing 2-5 patients per day. There are no changes proposed to the outside of the building, except a wall sign, and minimal interior remodeling.

Plan Review

The low staffing and patient volume is not anticipated to be a strain on the sharing parking available. 15 of the 23 tenant spaces in the 5 office buildings, or 65%, are occupied by medical uses. It is not known why medical uses were initially excluded from the PUD, since medical clinics are otherwise a permitted use in the B-2 district, and there was no objection to the medical uses that were subsequently approved.





Chemical Uses

Petition

The City of Darien has petitioned for approval of a text amendment of the Zoning Code regarding standards for chemical related uses and activities, currently in Chapter 9: Office and Industrial Districts, Chapter 12: Performance Standards, and Chapter 13: Definitions.

Background (presented at the January 16 hearing)

At the October 29, 2018, City Council Goal Setting meeting the Council discussed land use regulation and oversight by City Council. "The consensus of the Council was to review the City Code and recommend revisions in land uses with the goal of minimizing uses that may pose a hazard and requirements for public notification in the case of an EPA violation".

The City Administrator has drafted a text amendment focusing on permitted and special uses that may involve problematic chemical uses and activities to be either prohibited, not allowed, or restricted in the OR&I and I-1 districts. **Attachment A** has the current code with strikeout language recommended to be deleted and highlighted/bold language recommended to be added.

The OR&I Office, Research and Light Industry District includes the new warehouse at 7879 Lemont Road, the business park at the northeast corner of Lemont and Plainfield Roads, and the business area at Wilmette Avenue and N. Frontage Road. The only I-1 General Industrial District contains the City Public Works facility and Sterling Bay property both on S. Frontage Road. Attachment B is a survey data on the 31 businesses in Darien in OR&I districts that have business licenses on file. Notices of this hearing have been mailed to each of these 31 businesses. Attachment C contains decision criteria for amendments to the Zoning Code.

Update March 6

This hearing was opened on January 16, 2019 and testimony was given. The PZC continued the hearing to February 6, 2019 and additional testimony was given. Subsequent written correspondence was received from:

PZC minutes from January 16 and February 6 are in <u>Attachment F</u>. Minutes from March 6 are not available yet. Correspondence from Aldermen Tom Chlystek and Lester Vaughan is in <u>Attachment G</u>.

Update March 20

The objectives of this text amendment are to:

- 1. Protect the health of the people and environment in Darien and surrounding areas.
- 2. Minimize the economic impact on properties that are health protective.
- 3. Integrate local regulation with federal, state, and county regulation that relate to hazardous materials and processes.
- 4. Use the City zoning authority to prohibit industrial uses that would have certain highly hazardous materials and processes.

Attachment H has research information. In summary, USEPA has codified a list of chemicals as being hazardous. These chemicals, such as ethylene oxide and chlorine, have a use and benefit in certain applications, so they are not prohibited by Federal or State. However, local home rule municipalities can establish regulations that are not contradictory. The USEPA, in cooperation with OSHA and the Emergency Management Agency, have set up a series of regulations. One group of regulations involves air and water monitoring around known locations of these chemicals. Another group of regulations is known as 'Tier II Reporting'. Companies and facilities that store, use, or manufacture the listed hazardous chemicals above a certain threshold must document their quantities and locations along with mitigation plans including health warnings and emergency notifications. This information is sent to IEPA and IEMA for review for compliance and then forwarded to DuPage County and the local fire districts. The Tier II designation is a reasonable basis to use in the development of local regulations.

The only Tier II Reporting locations in Darien are Home Depot and two Speedway gas stations. These are retail operations in the B zoning districts and there none are currently in the O, ORI, or I zoning districts. The City has adopted the 2015 International Fire Code, which the City and the Fire Districts enforce, which has standards for hazardous material containment and protections. The Bureaus do periodic inspections of industrial businesses and have guidelines for emergency response and notifications. **Attachment I** is correspondence from Tri-State Fire District detailing their procedures.

Some chemicals have low hazard levels and are used at such low threshold quantities, such as small propane canisters sold retail or chlorine disinfectants used at public water plants, so that their use is routinely permitted subject to handling safeguards. Other chemicals, such as ethylene oxide and uranium, have high hazard levels and are relatively more problematic. Although Darien has not yet received any applications from businesses in the O, ORI, or I-1 districts that would handle Tier II reportable chemicals, that potential exists and so the City intends to have regulations in force ahead of such an application. DuPage County amended their code in October 2018 requiring that facilities emitting more than 100 tons per year or 550 pounds per day of carbon monoxide, ethylene oxide, nitrogen oxide, or sulphur dioxide must get a conditional use permit.

Attachment J is the second draft of the proposed text amendment. This replaces Attachment A. The second draft would not change any of the permitted or special uses currently listed in

the zoning code. It would change two sections.

- Section 5A-9-1-2: Prohibited Activities (in O, ORI, and I-1 districts).
 This section identifies certain explosives that are not to be permitted unless conforming to the Performance Standards in Chapter 12. The proposed text amendment would add to this section by prohibiting any business that would involve the storage, utilization or manufacture of hazardous chemicals that would be subject to the Tier II Reporting requirements as defined by USEPA.
- 2. Section 5A-12-4: Performance Standards
 This section sets limits on smoke, particulates, toxics, flammables, explosives and requires certification of conformance with 'all local, State, and Federal standards'. The proposed text amendment would add to this section by requiring all businesses in the O, ORI, and I-1 districts to certify that they will not store, utilize, or manufacture hazardous chemicals that would be subject to Tier II Reporting requirements as defined by USEPA. Also, add a requirement the any business that has a hazardous chemical release or violation of Federal, State, or local regulations must notify the City immediately.

Economic impact of this proposed regulation has been a concern. One expected impact would be an increase in value that could be derived from having protections for a healthier environment for workers, residents, and visitors. There would be some businesses that would not be able to move into Darien under these proposed regulations. However, the buildings in the ORI district are fully occupied except for the last unit in the newly-constructed 7879 Lemont Road warehouse building. The only property in the I-1 district, which has just a started construction, will have one warehouse building owned by Sterling Bay. There is no evidence that these current and future building spaces cannot be fully occupied at market-level rent by companies not handling hazardous chemicals.

Enforcement of this proposed regulation could be done in several ways:

- Affidavits submitted with business license applications certifying there would be no Tier
 II reportable chemicals on site.
- Requiring declarations of chemicals and plans for code-required facilities for handling these chemicals be submitted with building permit and remodeling permit applications.
- Periodic inspections of all business premises by fire districts and reporting of violations they find regarding chemicals.
- Follow-up by the City to require property owners to remediate such violations. Federal and State law specifies the notification requirements for incidents where Federal and State regulators become aware of and respond to hazardous chemical violations.

PZC voted March 20, 2019 to recommend approval. See minutes in Attachment K.

Bryon, Steven, and Dan:

On behalf of Sterling Bay, we have prepared the attached suggested text amendments to Chapter 9 of the City Zoning Code. As we discussed earlier this week, we focused on the provisions specific to the General Industrial District, rather than the regulations for the OR&I District. Thus, we did not include the suggested new provision that would make all OR&I permitted uses also permitted uses in the I District. This necessarily required us to take some of the OR&I permitted uses and put them as specific permitted or special uses in the I district regulations. Given that Sterling Bay's property is the only privately-owned I District property, we thought this made sense, as it would allow the City to tailor perhaps more restrictive regulations in the geographically more significant OR&I district without impacting the stand alone I district regulations that we are recommending.

With that said, I am attaching 2 different blacklined versions of the revised regulations, as follows:

- The PDF titled "Industrial v City Revisions" is a blackline against the City's revisions as presented at the public hearing.
- The PDF titled "Industrial v Existing Regs" is a blackline against the existing Code provisions.

Dear Mr. Manning:

As a follow-up my brief conversation with you on February 8, 2019, our firm represents Darien Real Estate, LLC ("DRE"), the owner of the multi-tenant industrial building located at 7879 Lemont Road, Darien, Illinois. DRE's affiliated company, Tile & Top, LLC, occupies approximately 38% of the Building and warehouses custom tile and counter tops. 28% of the Building was recently leased to Halistar Beauty where they intend to warehouse, conduct light manufacturing and engineering activities relating to beauty, skin care and hair care products, and 18% of the Building was recently leased to Club Fusion for an indoor volleyball training facility. There still remains a vacancy of approximately 25,000 square feet in the Building.

We have reviewed the proposed zoning text amendment to the OR&I District, and while DRE applauds the City's efforts to minimize business uses that pose a hazard to the public, DRE is concerned that the proposed zoning text amendment is over-reaching. For example, warehousing should always be a permitted use in the OR&I District. You should note that the vast majority of commercial warehousing is for inventory and materials that are not hazardous, but yet the City is proposing to eliminate warehousing as a permitted use. Also, general engineering and testing labs are quite common and expected in research districts, and so the elimination of them is puzzling and troubling.

In particular, we recommend the following:

- 1. The description of prohibited activities should be expanded to include facilities that <u>process or manufacture</u> regulated hazardous waste and chemicals, not merely store or use them.
- 2. Reinstate the list of permitted uses that were deleted, as these are, and always have been considered, general uses which are customary and appropriate for research and light manufacturing zoning districts.
- 3. Warehousing that involves the storage of certain hazardous materials or chemicals may be subject to a special use permit.

Eliminating uses that are recognized as permitted in comparable OR&I districts in the area will unnecessarily put Darien at a competitive disadvantage in business development.

Attached are our suggested handwritten changes to the City's proposed text amendment. Since our client's property is not in the I-1 district, we did not comment on those changes, but understand that you received comments from counsel for Sterling Bay. We would be willing to meet with staff if necessary to further discuss our thoughts and concerns. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me.

Mr. Steve Manning, City Planner reported that at the October 29, 2018 City Council Goal Setting meeting the Council discussed land use regulation and oversight by the City Council. He reported that the consensus of the Council was to review the City Code and recommend revisions in land uses with goal of minimizing uses that may pose a hazard and requirements for public

notification in a case of an EPA violation. He said that staff is hoping to get good input at these hearings to help refine the text of the amendment.

Chairperson Mallers opened the meeting to anyone wishing to present public comment.

Mr. Ron Swanson, Cygnet Controls Inc. stated that he started his business in the 80s and that he was next to Sterigenics. He stated that in the 90s they redeveloped the industrial park in Darien that was proposed contaminated and it was cleaned up by Rockwell. Mr. Swanson stated that he was concerned that light manufacturing was being considered eliminated. He displayed a product of what he builds to the PZC and stated that he builds control panels and that the process does not involve chemicals. He stated that his business has been in Darien since the 90s the employees live in the community. Mr. Swanson stated that he was specifically referring to letter h. of the document and that there are a lot of companies in Darien that fall under the same category. He asked that the City not eliminate (h) in the list of permitted uses in the ORI district, which includes 'light industrial uses'.

Commissioner Desmond questioned if there is any industrial waste.

Mr. Swanson stated that he does not and in fact he has less than is what is in a home garage.

Mr. Manning stated that this request was initiated by the City Council to look at deleting uses that have chemical processing or storage and to minimize such hazardous uses. He reported that staff has put together a draft code amendment and that the process will take at least two hearings. He explained that the text amendment identifies certain uses in the OR&I, Research and Light Industry District limiting business process or land uses with chemical manufacturing classified by Tier II under the EPA. He stated that there is also language regarding storage.

Mr. Paul Schoenbeck, 1000 Frontage Road stated that elimination will hinder building owners opportunity to secure tenants and that elimination will take the "R" out of research and that the City needs to look at this case by case. Mr. Schoenbeck stated that 31 properties in Darien is not a lot and that this would create hardship for tenants and people to come into Darien.

Mr. Keith Lang, 8101 Clarendon Hills Road stated that he owns a building next to Ron and that he agrees with Paul. He stated that he is concerned that his building rentals will decrease and that the permit process involves review by the City and that case by case is a much better solution.

Commissioner Desmond asked for an example so that he could better understand.

Mr. Lang stated that he has a tenant who has an auto body shop who does body work to cars which requires paint and falls under warehousing. He stated that the general term warehousing is a concern.

Commissioner Desmond stated that the concern is in tenants with strong chemicals that fall within the Tier II category.

Mr. Lang stated that the term is too broad and that the City cannot strike warehouse and industrial.

Mr. Schoenbeck stated that with restrictions the uses that are struck will make it difficult to rent space. He stated that when realtors work to rent the space that they do not get into details and all they will see is that warehousing will be out.

Mr. Josh Mallory, Miskatonic Brewing Company stated that nothing in the area comes close to EPA Tier II. He stated that he reviewed the list and that there are uses that are struck that should not be struck. Mr. Mallory stated that the City should require the business to identify if they fall under Tier II.

Mr. Bryon Vana, City Administrator stated that he appreciated the discussion and that there were a lot of good points. He stated that the process for regulating chemicals is above the municipality and that a company is required to present material data sheets. Mr. Vana stated that the City is looking at a broad range of uses instead of specifics.

Mr. Lang stated that the City does not have to eliminate anything but rather look at Tier II. He stated that it is too hazy and that eliminating Tier II will require a business to go for a special use permit.

Mr. Vana stated that he will discuss with the City Attorney to get more specifics.

Chairperson Mallers stated that the process is in motion and that there are a lot of moving parts..

Mr. Peter Friedman, Attorney representing Sterling Bay, 1035 S. Frontage Road stated that they will submit written comments regarding the draft. He stated that he has extensive knowledge of industrial zoning and applauded the City for modernizing the code. Mr. Friedman stated that he will work with staff to provide Sterling Bay's proposal and that he liked the discussion regarding eliminating certain chemicals.

There was no one else in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Commissioner Erickson made a motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Stompanato to continue Public Hearing Case: PZC 2018-11 to the next regular meeting of the PZC on February 6, 2019.

Upon roll call vote, THE MOTION CARRIED 8-0.

Mr. Manning stated that he welcomes any comments.

Commissioner Sullivan questioned if the businesses were notified.

Mr. Manning reported that a public notice is required for a Text Amendment and also the notice was mailed as well to the 31 businesses in the ORI district.

Case: PZC 2018-11 Chemical Uses (zoning text amendment)
City of Darien has petitioned for approval of a text amendment of the Zoning Code, Title 5A, Chapter 9: Office and Industrial Districts, Chapter 12: Performance Standards, and Chapter 13: Definitions, regarding standards for chemical-related uses and activities.

Mr. Steve Manning, City Planner reported that at the last hearing Mr. Peter Friedman, attorney representing Sterling Bay was present and asked for time to prepare a written testimony. Mr. Manning reported that staff has received written testimony and that the City Administrator would like to go through his letter and respond and therefore asking for a continuation to the March 6, 2019 meeting. He reported that the letter will be provided in the next meeting packet.

Acting Chairperson Cortez opened the meeting to anyone wishing to present public comment.

Mr. Keith Lang stated that he watched the City Council meeting and it seemed that the Sterogenics problems are Tier II. He stated that there are only three permits in the City of Darien and he questioned why the City is changing anything when there is not a problem in Darien.

Mr. Manning reported that the intent is to take a proactive approach and that this was at the direction of the City Council to investigate the topic.

Acting Chairperson Cortez stated that the City is taking a proactive approach to align for the future and that he felt it was not a bad idea.

Mr. Lang stated that his business was all that he has and that it seems anti-business and that the changes will affect his business.

Commissioner Desmond stated that it is not the intent to drive business away and that there are clearly things that need to be revised. He stated that this is a process and that the Committee is cognizant of what is happening. He further stated that the City is being proactive.

Mr. Manning reported that the goal is to have final language by March 6th.

Re: Updated City Ordinances for Residents Safety

To City Administrator Bryan Vana, Mayor Weaver, City Council

During Monday's Municipal Services Committees I brought up that our City has prohibited uses, and prohibited activities called out in Chapter 9 of the City Ordinances.

Ordinances 5A-9-1-1 calls out specific prohibited uses such as abattoirs, arsenals, fat rendering, fertilize manufacturing, fireworks or explosives manufacture, petroleum processing or refining, just to name a few of the items that are called out as prohibited uses. All of these uses are a danger to the community especially to the residents of the City of Darien and is why the City of Darien prohibits their uses.

In light of what is happening at the Sterigenics Facility in Willowbrook, and the dangers associated with the use of Ethylene Oxide Sterilization I am requesting staff, with the support of City Council to update this section of City Code to prohibit Ethylene Oxide Sterilization In the City of Darien. I would request that his update to the ordinance be brought to a vote within a month.

In Section 5A-9-1-2 Prohibited Activities, the City Ordinance prohibits the use of many chemicals in the City of Darien such as chlorates, uranium 235, plasting explosives, tetraxoles, perchloric acids, and nuclear fuels to name just a few chemicals that are banned. I am requesting staff with the support of council to update the ordinance to include the <u>ban of Ethylene Oxide</u> as well, and to bring this forth for a vote within a month.

Lastly, I am requesting a third update to city ordinances that would require any company that has been fined by the EPA for air or water pollution violation, regardless of amount to immediately send a notice by mail within 2 weeks of receiving the fine notifying residents of the pollution, and how they plan on remedying the issue. This is to ensure the health and safety of all residents.

I look forward to working with our Mayor, City Council, and Staff to update our city ordinances and to make sure our residents safety is our utmost priority.

Hi Bryon,

Per our conversation on Monday after the City Council. Here's is what i was trying to convey to the council as some proactive measures that we should take in the event that something like Sterigenics surfaces again. I know that Tom has proposed something similar to the banning of ETO, however, I was hoping that we could include some the bullet points I have outlined below.

What we have learned from Willowbrook and Sterigenics to help us move forward in a more informed, transparent way as a city:

- Sterigenics had at least 2 or 3 incidents where they were cited, or a violation action was initiated against them.
 - o In 2015 they were charged by the Attorney General's Office for water pollution and creating a water pollution hazard, related to a 2013 spill of glycol into the ground and water. They settled this with a "consent order" in 2015 and paid a fine.
 - There are reportedly other instances of leaks of large amounts of EtO into the air where regulatory agencies got involved.

Despite these environmental hazard issues, local residents were apparently not notified. So, while the agencies may have gotten involved, no one who lives or works nearby was informed. This created a lack of trust.

I would propose an ordinance or other mechanisms to ensure the following:

- a. That any company doing business in Darien which uses, transports or is otherwise involved in an activity which has the possibility of becoming an environmental or public hazard have a heightened reporting requirement with the City.
- b. If any business in Darien is notified by any regulatory agency that it may have or did violate a rule/code, etc. that could impact the environment or health of residents, that business must notify the City of Darien within a reasonable amount of time (a few days?) and further, that the City notify residents within a reasonable amount of time as well.

The language of the ordinance can be worked out, but the idea behind it is transparency. We want residents to know that they will be notified if a company in Darien engages in any activity that could jeopardize their health or the environment. We don't want decades, years or months go by where residents could make informed decisions for their families as we see with Sterigenics.

Authorized by Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA), the Emergency Planning & Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) was enacted by Congress as the national legislation on community safety. This law is designed to help local communities protect public health, safety, and the environment from chemical hazards.

To implement EPCRA, Congress requires each state to appoint a State Emergency Response Commission (SERC). The SERCs are required to divide their states into Emergency Planning Districts and to name a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) for each district.

Broad representation by fire fighters, health officials, government and media representatives, community groups, industrial facilities, and emergency managers ensures that all necessary elements of the planning process are represented.

What is Tier I Reporting?

Tier II reports are forms that organizations and businesses in the United States with hazardous chemicals above certain quantities, are required to fill out by the EPA. Known officially as Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Forms, Tier II Reports are submitted annually to local fire departments, Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC) and State Emergency Response Commissions (SERCs) to help those agencies plan for and respond to chemical emergencies.

Mandated by Section 312 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act (EPCRA) – also known as SARA Title III – the Tier II form captures information about the types, quantities and locations of hazardous chemicals at a given facility. The form also lists contact information for the facility's designated emergency point-of-contact.


EPCRA actually allows for the submission of either a Tier I or Tier II report. However, since the Tier II report includes all of the information found the on the Tier I, plus additional information, most states require the comprehensive Tier II report. To see the Tier II reporting obligations for your state, visit the EPA website and click on the name of your state from the list provided.

To determine if you have chemicals in quantities that require Tier II reporting, check the EPA's List of Lists. MSDSonline's HQ and HQ RegXR accounts make determining your reporting obligations and generating submittable Tier II reports easy.

Tier II Violations

Tier II reports are due March 1 for the previous calendar year. Penalties for violations of Section 312 of SARA Title III can reach up to \$27,500 for each violation. Fines add up quickly since each day a violation continues to exist constitutes a separate violation.

GENERAL CHEMICAL INVENTORY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

1. LAW

Illinois Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (IEPCRA) 430 ILCS 100; 29 Ill. Adm. Code 620

2. WHO MUST REPORT?

Any facility that has present onsite

- (a) a hazardous chemical for which OSHA requires a safety data sheet (SDS) and
- (b) the chemical is present in certain threshold quantities

3. WHAT IS A "HAZARDOUS CHEMICAL?"

For purposes of IEPCRA, a "hazardous chemical" is defined as any chemical that causes a physical and/or health hazard (Occupational Safety and Health Act's [OSHA's] 2012 Hazard Communication Standard [HCS 2012]). The number of such chemicals has been estimated at over 500,000 and there is no list available. It is acceptable to assume that any chemical for which a SDS lists any type of hazard is covered by IEPCRA. HCS 2012 includes updated definitions of physical hazard and health hazard as well as a 16-part SDS format. Additional SDS information may be found at Hazard Communication | Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

4. WHAT QUANTITIES TRIGGER REPORTING REQUIREMENTS?

If the chemical is hazardous, the threshold quantity is 10,000 pounds or more.

If the chemical is an extremely hazardous substance (EHS), the threshold is 500 pounds or the threshold planning quantity (TPQ), whichever is less. For instance, chlorine is an EHS and its TPQ is 100 pounds; therefore, if a facility has present onsite at least 100 pounds of chlorine, the facility is required to file an emergency and hazardous chemical inventory form (commonly referred to as a "Tier II Form") for chlorine.

5. WHAT ARE THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS?

- (a) An emergency and hazardous chemical inventory form, commonly referred to as a "Tier II Form," which reports the following information":
 - facility identification including latitude/longitude coordinates for standard and nonstandard addresses and if the facility is manned/unmanned
 - is facility subject to EPCRA 302 (EHS), EPCRA 313 Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) and/or Clean Air Act (CAA) 112® Risk Management Program (RMP). If yes to TRI and/or RMP, must enter facility's ID#
 - contact information for facility emergency coordinator and Tier II contact (including email addresses)
 - name and telephone number of at least two emergency contacts
 - name, mailing address, telephone number and e-mail address of owner/operator
 - chemical identification including chemical name, description, physical and health hazards and locations, and whether or not chemical is an EHS. Must provide



State Emergency Response Commission (SERC)

The goal of the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) is to promote chemical emergency preparedness and prevention throughout the state of Illinois. The SERC, through implementation of emergency planning and community right-to-know laws and through establishment and support of its Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs), assists in chemical emergency planning, provides public access to chemical data, raises public awareness of chemical risks and encourages public participation in local chemical safety issues.

No Tier ii reports have been received by Tri-State FPD for the City of Darien.

Tier II reports must be submitted to the IEPA for chemicals that meet or exceed the reportable quantities. They must also be submitted separately to the Fire Department and the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs)

We ensure that materials are stored and protected to the standards of IFC and NFPA. This will include how the material is stored (heights, shelves, orientation, etc.) and how it is protected with suppression systems, fire alarm systems and detection systems.

We can ensure that maximum quantities per fire area are not exceeded. All of this is dependent upon the fire district having the opportunity to review plans as units are built, built out or either tenants or ownership changes.

This is an example of an annual life safety inspection done in Darien:

"This report was completed by a member of the Tri-State Fire Prevention Bureau, based upon their fire safety inspection of the premises you occupy. The Fire Prevention Code specifies that this notice shall be served upon the occupant since the Fire Prevention Bureau has no way of determining if specific hazards must be remedied by the owner, or by the tenant, if any. You are required by law to correct the fire hazards indicated herein, but consider this; You have received a service for which your taxes pay. This notice tells you where fires could start or spread. Removing the hazards will put you in compliance with fire rules, regulations, codes and laws. Your corrective action will help prevent a fire that could interrupt or end your business, and kill or injure those who occupy your premises. Please correct these hazards before the time indicated below as the re-inspection date. Fees and fines may be incurred. It is your responsibility to contact your local municipality to determine whether or not permits are required for construction, electrical, mechanical, sprinkler or plumbing repairs."

WHEREAS, the City of Darien is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper legal notice, a public hearing was held before the Planning and Zoning Commission on January 16, 2019 and continued to February 6, March 6, and March 20, 2019 regarding this matter; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission filed its findings and recommendations with the City Council recommending approval of the text amendment described herein; and

WHEREAS, on ______, 2019 the Municipal Services Committee has filed its findings and recommendations with the City Council recommending approval of the text amendment described herein; and

ORDINANCE NO.

WHEREAS, the City Council approves and adopts the findings and recommendations of the Municipal Services Committee and incorporates such findings and recommendations herein by reference as if they were fully set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DARIEN, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 5A-9-1-2 of the City Code of Darien and is hereby amended by adding the following sentence at the conclusion thereof (new language underscored):

No activities involving the storage, utilization or manufacture of materials or products which decompose by detonation shall be permitted except such as are specifically licensed by the City and are used as customarily incidental to the operation of a principal use in such quantities, and in a manner conforming with applicable performance standards set forth in Chapter 12 of this Title. Such materials shall include, but shall not be confined to: all primary explosives, such as lead oxide, lead styphnate, fulminates and tetracene; all high explosives, such as TNT, RDS, HMX, PETN, hand picnic acid. propellants and components thereof, such as nitrocellulose, black powder, boron hydrantes, hydrazine and its derivatives; pyrotechnics and fireworks, such as magnesium powder, potassium chlorate and potassium nitrate, blasting explosives, such as dynamite and nitroglycerine; blasting explosives, such as acetylides, tetraxoles, perchloric acid. perchlorates, chlorates, hydrogen peroxide in concentrations greater than thirty five percent (35%); and nuclear fuels, fissionable materials and products and reactor elements, such as uranium 235 and plutonium. Businesses that would involve the storage, utilization, or manufacture of hazardous chemicals subject to the Tier II Reporting requirements as defined by USEPA are prohibited.

SECTION 2: Section 5A-12-4-8 of the City Code of Darien and is hereby amended by adding the following sentence at the conclusion thereof (new language underscored):

It shall be unlawful for any person to install, erect, construct, reconstruct, alter or add to. or cause to be installed, erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered or added to, any fuel burning, combustion or process equipment or device or any equipment pertaining thereto, or any stack or chimney connected therewith, within the City excepting domestic heating plants, domestic refuse-burning equipment, locomotives and internal combustion engines, in the City, until there has been filed in duplicate by the owner, contractor, installer or other person, or his agent with the City, an application for a permit accompanied by a complete listing of emissions into the atmosphere that result from the operation of the aforesaid equipment or processes, both as to kind and quantity and, in addition thereto a listing of the type and capacity of the equipment used for the collection, absorption, or suppression of each and an estimate of its efficiency, and until a permit therefor has been granted by the corporate authorities of the City. Said submitted register of pollutants shall be accompanied by an affidavit of a qualified person stating that it is complete and correct and that the proper operation of the plant or process, as designed. will not result in any violation of this Title. Businesses in the O. ORI, and I-1 districts that apply for a business license shall certify that they will not store, utilize, or manufacture hazardous chemicals subject to the Tier II Reporting requirements as defined by USEPA Any business that has a hazardous chemical release or violation of Federal. State, or local regulations shall notify the City immediately.

SECTION 3: This ordinance and each of its terms shall be the effective legislative act of a home rule municipality without regard to whether such ordinance should (a) contain terms contrary to the provisions of current or subsequent non-preemptive state law, or (b) legislate in a manner or regarding a matter not delegated to municipalities by state law. It is the intent of the corporate authorities of the City of Darien that to the extent that the terms of this ordinance should be inconsistent with any non-preemptive state law, that this ordinance shall supersede state law in that regard within its jurisdiction.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, and shall subsequently be published in pamphlet form as provided by law.

MINUTES CITY OF DARIEN PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION MEETING March 20, 2019

Chairperson Lou Mallers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the City Hall – City Council Chambers, Darien, Illinois and declared a quorum present and swore in the audience members wishing to present public testimony.

REGULAR MEETING:

A. Public Hearing - Continued

Case: PZC 2018-11 Chemical Uses (zoning text amendment)
City of Darien has petitioned for approval of a text amendment of the Zoning Code, Title 5A, Chapter 9: Office and Industrial Districts, Chapter 12: Performance Standards, and Chapter 13: Definitions, regarding standards for chemical-related uses and activities.

Steve Manning reported that this hearing was opened January 16 and was continued to February 6 and March 6. The staff report for this meeting includes correspondence from Aldermen Tom Chlystek and Lester Vaughan, research from Federal and State websites on Tier II regulations, and correspondence from Tri-State Fire District. This input along with testimony from property owners at the previous three hearings was used to prepare a revised draft of the zoning text amendment presented in ordinance form in the staff report. The revisions no longer have a list of uses to be deleted from the ORI and I-1 zoning district. Instead, the amendment includes a statement that businesses with Tier II reportable chemicals are to be prohibited in the ORI and I-1 districts.

Brooke Leneman, attorney from Holland & Knight, representing Sterling Bay, repeated the statement she made at the March 6 hearing and the statement made by her associate Peter Friedman for the February 6 hearing that the proposed text amendment seems overly broad and they request more time to prepare a response, such as limiting the prohibition to just the manufacture of extremely hazardous chemicals in large quantities.

Commission members asked whether there was any merit to have the Darien City Code list all the Tier II reportable chemicals, the minimum quantity thresholds specified by EPA for purposes of reporting, and setting up a special use procedure for exceptions.

Staff commented that EPA has already selected the most hazardous chemicals out of the over ½ million known and have designated this list of under a thousand as Tier II. This Tier II designation can be referenced for local regulation purposes. The chemicals included and their threshold quantities may be changed by EPA over time, so trying to list them in the Darien ordinance will become out of date. A special use procedure for allowing some Tier II chemicals

would be problematic, since we do not have a standard for determining if any would be safe in our community.

Keith Lang, a property owner of an industrial building on Wilmette Avenue in Darien, commented that by prohibiting all businesses that would have Tier II chemicals, would limit the number of potential businesses that could move into Darien. This may limit his rental income and the City's tax revenue.

Staff acknowledged that potential exists. In light of the lack of vacancies and the absence of current businesses in the ORI and I-1 district reporting Tier II chemicals, the risk of negative economic impact may be low. The risk to the health of people and the environment from a release of Tier II chemicals may be high.

Commission members commented on the potential economic benefits of the proposed regulation that may come from higher rents for Tier II chemical-free properties, lesser insurance liability for personal injury and contamination, and lesser costs for health care and cleanup of contamination.

Joseph Myczek, 8632 Ailsworth Drive in Darien, commented that even a small leak of hazardous chemical can be disastrous, such as from the Sterling Bay property into the adjacent forest preserve Waterfall Glen or from dry cleaners. He also said that all landlords have economic risks and should be willing do their part to protect the environment and our health as part of the cost of doing business.

Commissioner Cortez asked about reporting history. Staff referenced the EPA information that Tier II reporting is an honor system with penalties for non-compliance and cited recent news of forced business closing in Willowbrook. Commissioner Erickson asked about role of the fire department. Staff recounted the information obtained from the Tri-State Fire Prevention Director that their annual inspections of businesses are done with Tier II reports in hand and they are looking for proper storage and fire suppression. So far they have not found any business that failed to report as required by Tier II, however they are not tasked with finding improper handling of Tier II chemicals.

Commissioner Gay asked if the proposed text amendment would prevent a situation in Darien similar to the Sterigenics situation in Willowbrook. Bryon Vana responded that is the intent.

Steve Manning commented that the intent is to be proactive. This zoning approach is innovative and to our knowledge Darien is first community to try this approach to regulating hazardous chemicals. Holland and Knight has asked three times for more time to respond. We have continued for two months but they have not provided any further input. There is some urgency here in that the two large industrial properties in Darien, 7879 Lemont Road and 1035 S. Frontage Road, are now searching for tenants and City could be well-served by have this proposed regulation in place now. As with any new code, the language should be our best attempt to get it right, but if our experience with the new regulation reveals a need for improvement, we should be willing to consider further amendment at that time. Commissioner Cortez said he understands that one of the functions of public hearings is to give the public a chance to provide input and for all commissioners to review and comment. However, we also have the obligation to move the proposal forward in a timely manner.

Commissioner Desmond made a motion to recommend approval of the ordinance as presented with changes to the text in sections 1 and 2 adding the word 'process' after the words 'utilization' and the words 'at quantities' before the words 'subject to the Tier II

reporting' based on a finding-of-fact that the proposed zoning text amendment does comply with the decision criteria in Section 5A-2-2-5 of the Zoning Code, specifically that it would be compatible with the existing uses and trend of development in the area, it would not have a negative impact on the character of the area or the property values therein, and it would be consistent with the plans and policy of the City to protect the health safety and general welfare. Commissioner Gay seconded. Upon roll call vote, THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY 5-0.

Staff commented that this agenda item and the PZC recommendation will be scheduled for the Municipal Services Committee on March 25.

The City's Private Property-Rear Yard Storm Water Management Assistance Policy or further referred to as the *Rear Yard Drainage Program* allows residents, multifamily, commercial property owners and the City to work together in resolving these nuisance ponding and drainage issues. The projects would rid the area of the nuisance ponding, and allow for positive storm water conveyance within the rear yard easement.

Approval of a <u>resolution</u> accepting a proposal from Monroe Truck Equipment for the purchase of a dump body and snow plow equipment package, lighting accessories, and hydraulic controls, for the 2020 Peterbilt Model 348, in an amount not to exceed \$102,172.00.

AND

Accepting a proposal from Jack the Striper for truck graphics in an amount not to exceed \$950.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The vehicle up for replacement is a 2008 Sterling 9-ton dump truck that received a 78.19 rating with approximately 46,000 miles, see <u>Attachment A</u>. The truck continues to experience mechanical issues with items related to the Turbo and EGR Systems. These components are vital for the truck to operate at an optimal level. Please recall the Sterling line is no longer manufactured and parts are becoming obsolete. The City Mechanic has booked approximately 140 hours of repairs and maintenance costs are approximately \$24,741 to date. The department has been utilizing the Peterbilt line for the last two years and has provided very reliable performance.

The cab and chassis will be purchased from JX Peterbilt, delivered to Monroe Truck an Equipment for the dump body, pneumatic and hydraulic controls, snowplow equipment package and safety lighting. Both the cab & chassis as well as the body and snowplow equipment would be purchased through the Sourcewell Purchasing Cooperative, formerly National Joint Purchase Alliance Program (NJPA) P, under Contract No 081716-PMC and 080114-MTE. ISSUE STATEMENT

A <u>resolution</u> authorizing the purchase and installation of the following from B&H Equipment Specialists, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$12,618:

One 3-compartment double wall UL 142 fluid storage tank with all fittings, sight gauges and vents, also with (3) 5:1 ratio oil pumps, (3) ½" x 50' hose reels, (3) electronic metered dispense valves, air regulators and connecting hoses.

One 4-tank stackable poly system -60 gallon each on stand with gravity feed plumbing, drip trays and secondary containment.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

The department is requesting new fluid storage containers with spill containment protection. Currently the department takes delivery of 55-gallon drums of various fluids & oils. They are either pumped into overhead metal storage containers or 55-gallon drums with hand pumps are utilized. The existing overhead storage has no spill/drip containment protection. The metal containers and dispensing system are approximately 29 years in age and have served their useful life and now require replacement.

The new fluid approved storage containers would be constructed of a heavy wall plastic and have spill containment to avoid slip and fall situations or potential spills. The fluid system storage would allow ridding the area of 55-gallon drums and allowing for efficient space allocation and optimal dispensing of the various liquid products. The more frequently used fluids would have retractable filling hoses to reach the vehicle versus hand pumping the fluid from a drum to a proper fill canister, pending the vehicle. ESTABLISH QUORUM

Chairperson Joseph Marchese called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. at City Hall Council Chambers, Darien, Illinois and declared a quorum present.

OLD BUSINESS

a. Discussion IV - Update-Refuse Container-Consideration to amend the City Code provisions on storage of refuse containers in residential areas.

Mr. Dan Gombac, Director reported that at the last meeting it was discussed to look at another storage refuse model. He reported that staff has been working with Home Depot to secure two different sized uniform enclosures. He further reported that both containers are also available at Amazon and Walmart and that the pricing is in line and that Amazon and Home Depot are exactly the same.

d. Resolution - Consideration of a request by DuPage Public Safety Communications (DUCOMM) to approve their IGA regarding their equipment on the City cell towers at 1041 S. Frontage Road.

Mr. Steve Manning, City Planner reported that DUCOMM is one of the two consolidated dispatch centers in DuPage County along with ACDC. He reported that they have been using Tower A. Mr. Manning reported that both ACDC and DUCOMM would like to relocate their antenna onto Tower B in order to improve their service capacity.

Mr. Manning reported that Tri-State recently submitted a request to the PZC for a microwave antenna at their station.

There was no one in the audience wishing to present public comment.

Alderman Belczak made a motion and it was seconded by Alderman Chlystek approval of a resolution for consideration of a request by DuPage Public Safety Communications (DUCOMM) to approve their IGA regarding their equipment on the City cell towers at 1041 S. Frontage Road.
